Foreign Office, August 22, 1898.

HER Majesty's Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs has received a Despatch from the Acting British Consul at Buenos Ayres, stating that, in consequence of the stringent regulations now in force in the Argentine Republic with regard to the Enrolment of the National Guard, British subjects, who are unable at short notice to furnish proof of their place of birth, are liable to be subjected to some inconvenience. It is desirable, therefore, that British subjects who intend to proceed to the Argentine Republic should provide themselves with birth certificates or other satisfactory evidence of their nationality and birth-place, and that they should apply to Her Majesty's Consul at Buenos Ayres for a Protection Paper on their arrival in the Country.
