Piana Rock—Light Incorrectly Described on Certain Charts.

Nilsgrund Shoal is about 300 yards long in a north-easterly and south-westerly direction and 70 yards broad, with 2½ fathoms least water on it, from which Lågshär Lighthouse bears S.W., distant 3¼ miles, and Little Botskar Lighthouse N. 4° W.

Tungenæs, Fieldöen—Lights altered.

(westward of rocks off Tungenæs and Boskendene); fixed white from N. 20° E. to N. 34° E. fixed red from N. 34° E. (over east point of Alstenen), through east, to S. 61° E. (northward of Svendene); fixed white from S. 61° E. to S. 43° E.; flashing white from S. 43° E. (southward of Arsgrund) to

S. 36° E.; fixed white from S. 36° E., through south, to S. 4° W.; and obscured from other directions.

It is elevated 57 feet above high water and visible in clear weather, white light 12 miles, red 9 miles; the candle power being 590 and 148 candles respectively.

No. 487.—UNITED STATES—FLORIDA.

Terraceia Bay—Beacons Erected.

THE United States Government has given notice, dated 1st July, 1898, that the channel between Tampa and Terraceia Bay is marked by the following beacons:—

No. 1, a black pile structure, placed on the western extreme of the spit extending from the south-west point of Terraceia Island on the north side of the channel, with the south-west point Terraceia bearing N. 83° E., distant 6 cables, and west extreme Snead Point S. 11° W., or approximately in lat. 27° 32' 50" N., long. 82° 38' 35" W.

No. 3 is a similar structure, placed 800 feet E. by S. $\frac{1}{2}$ S. from Beacon No. 1. These two beacons in line lead to the entrance of Terraceia Bay.

No. 5, a structure similar to No. 1, is placed about $14\frac{1}{2}$ cables east of No. 3 Beacon.

No. 7 is a similar structure about $\frac{1}{8}$ mile N.E. $\frac{7}{8}$ E. from Beacon No. 5.

Nos. 5 and 7 Beacons in line on the above bearing lead over the bar in about 5 feet least depth.

No. 2 is a red pile structure on the northern edge of shoal extending north-east from Snead Island on the south side of the channel; it is placed nearly half a mile E.N.E. from Beacon No. 7. The above beacons are all 27 feet high.

No. 9 is an iron spindle, painted black, 30 feet high, placed to the southward of Bird Cay on the north side of the channel, and situated about $\frac{1}{4}$ mile E. $\frac{3}{8}$ N. from Beacon No. 2.

All the above beacons stand in 5 feet water, have their numbers painted in white figures on their east and west sides, and are surmounted by diamond shaped top marks.

Tramways Act 1870 and Tramways Orders

Intended Lease.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Eccles (hereinafter referred to as the Corporation) intend to make a lease, by way of supplemental lease, to the Manchester Carriage and Tramways Company (hereinafter called the Company) of all the tramways within the borough of Eccles belonging to the Corporation for the period from the 31st day of March 1899 to the 27th day of April 1901, at the annual rent of £900, and that the following is a general description of the covenants and conditions contained in the original lease which by reference are incorporated in the proposed lease:—

(a.) Covenants on the part of the Company.

1. To pay the said rent when due and all present and future taxes, rates, charges, and assessments and all other outgoings in respect of the said tramways.

2. Not to carry goods animals articles or things other than passengers and passengers' luggage not exceeding 56 lbs. in weight between 8 A.M. and 8 P.M. without the consent of the Corporation.

3. Not to use or allow to be used carriages or trucks adapted for ordinary use upon railways upon the said tramways.

4. To observe all regulations and bye-laws from time to time made by the Corporation for the purposes mentioned in the 46th section of "The Tramways Act 1870" and for the purpose of prescribing the construction of the carriages to be used and of the wheels thereof and for ensuring that the same are kept in good repair and for providing for the carriage of traffic other than passengers and passengers' luggage in separate carriages and generally for regulating the times and manner of such traffic.

5. To permit the Corporation or their Agents at such times and in such manner as they shall think fit (but subject to the reasonable bye-laws for the time being in force with respect to the said tramways) to use the said tramways for sanitary purposes and for the conveyance of scavenging stuff road metal and other materials required for any works of the Corporation free of all tolls and charges in respect of such use.

6. To carry, when so required by the Corporation, goods minerals and parcels in separate carriages or parts of carriages set apart for that purpose.

7. To run carriages every morning and evening in the week (Sundays Christmas Day and Good Friday excepted) at such hours as the Corporation shall from time to time think convenient for artisans mechanics and daily labourers at fares not exceeding $\frac{1}{2}d.$ per mile (the Company not being required to take a fare less than $1d.$).

8. To observe the rules, regulations, and bye-laws which under or by virtue of "The Tramways Act 1870" "The Barton Eccles &c. Tramways Order 1877" or any general Statutes for the time being affecting tramways ought to be observed by lessees of tramways.

9. Not to assign or underlet the said term or the premises demised or any part thereof or interest therein without the licence in writing of the Corporation such licence not to be unreasonably withheld from any responsible and respectable person Company or Corporation.

10. To deliver up at the expiration or determination of the said term to the Corporation the said tramways in such state and condition as shall be consistent with the performance of the said covenants.

11. To permit the Corporation their Surveyor or persons deputed by them with or without workmen at any time to enter upon and view the said tramways and execute any necessary repair.

12. That the Corporation may determine the said term by notice in writing in the following events:—

(i.) If rent in arrear for 21 days.

(ii.) On discontinuance by the Company of working of tramways for 3 months (when not occasioned by circumstances beyond the Company's control, the want of sufficient funds not being considered a circumstance beyond their control).

(iii.) On breach by the Company of any covenant or agreement.

13. That the Corporation may distrain for rent in arrear.

14. That nothing in the lease shall take away lessen or abridge any of the rights conditions powers privileges or advantages which are or may be given to the Corporation as against the Company by "The Tramways Act 1870" or by any general Statute from time to time affecting tramways or by the said Tramways Order.

(b.) Covenants on the part of the Corporation.

1. For quiet enjoyment.

2. To maintain the said tramways in an efficient state for the purposes of the said traffic.

3. Not to exercise the powers of section 19 of the said Tramways Order without the consent in writing of the Company or their allowed assigns.

(c.) Provision for referring disputes to arbitration.
