No. 591.—NORWAY.

Alterations in Lights and New Lights Exhibited. WITH reference to Notices to Mariners Nos. 257 and 397 of 1898:-

The Norwegian Government has given notice, dated 9th September, 1898, that the undermentioned alterations have been made in certain lights, and new lights exhibited :-

1. Svinöen Light now shows the following sectors :- Fixed green between S. 36° W. and S. 46° W., fixed white between S. 46° W. and S. 52° W., fixed red between S. 52° W. and S. 80° W., fixed white between S. 80° W. and West, flashing white between West and N. 77° W., fixed

white between N. 77° W., through north and east,

and S. 64° E., obscured between S. 64° E.,

through south, and S. 36° W.

The light is elevated 192 feet above the sea, and in clear weather is visible, white light 12 miles, red light 9 miles, and the green light 7 miles, from 15th August to 30th April.

Approximate position, lat. 68° 2' long. 13° 34′ 35″ E. 50" N.,

Variation 10° Westerly in 1898.]

2. Vadsö Light has been altered from an alternating to an occulting light with red and white sectors. It shows white between S. 85° E., through north, and N. 63° W., red between N. 63° W. and N. 85° W., and obscured between N. 85° W., through south, and S. 85° E.

It is elevated 86 feet above the sea, and visible in clear weather a distance of 6 miles the white

light, red 4 miles.

Approximate position, lat. 70° 3′ 30" N., long. 29° 46′ 5″ E.

3. Bukkeskind south or lower leading light now shows a red sector between S. 4° E. and S.

5. Hekkingsund Light is an occulting light; it shows white between S. 70° E. and S. 73° E., green between S. 73° E. and S. 84° E., white between S. 84° E. and S. 88° E., red between S. 88° E., through north, and N. 47° W., white between N. 47° W. and S. 78° W., and obscured between S. 70° E., through south, and S. 78° W. It is elevated 52 feet above high water, and visible in clear weather, the white light 6 miles, red 4 miles, the green 3 miles.

Approximate position, lat. 69° 35' 20" N., long.

17° 51′ 20″ E.

6. Grötnæs Light is an occulting white light, elevated 110 feet above high water, and visible in clear weather from a distance of 7 miles, between S. 55° W., through north, and N. 71° E

[Variation 4° Westerly in 1898.]
7. Spokenæs Light is an occulting white light, elevated 15 feet above high water, and visible in clear weather from a distance of 6 miles between S. 8° W., through south and east, and N. 6° W.

8. Rotsund Light is an occulting light; it shows white between S. 57° W., through south, and S. 46° E., red between S. 46° E. and S. 67° E., white between S. 67° E. and S. 81° E., green between S. 81° E. and N. 77° E., obscured between N. 77° E., through north, and S. 57° W. It is elevated 21 feet above high water, and visible in clear weather from a distance of, the white light 6 miles, red 4 miles, and green 3
