No. 591.—NORWAY.

Alterations in Lights and New Lights Exhibited.

WITH reference to Notices to Mariners Nos. 257 and 397 of 1898:—

The Norwegian Government has given notice, dated 9th September, 1898, that the undermentioned alterations have been made in certain lights, and new lights exhibited:—

1. Svinøen Light now shows the following sectors:—Fixed green between S. 36° W. and S. 46° W., fixed white between S. 46° W. and S. 52° W., fixed red between S. 52° W. and S. 80° W., fixed white between S. 80° W. and West, flashing white between West and N. 77° W., fixed white between N. 77° W., through north and east,
