By the QUEEN. A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS Our Parliament stands prorogued to Saturday, the twenty-ninth day of October instant; We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, hereby issue Our Royal Proclamation, and publish and declare that the said Parliament be further prorogued to Thursday, the eighth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight.

Given at Our Court at Balmoral, this twentieth day of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight, and in the sixty-second year of Our reign.

PRESENT The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

T is this day ordered by Her Majesty in Council that the Convocations of the Provinces of Canterbury and York be prorogued from the day to which the same now stand prorogued to Friday, the ninth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight, and the Right Honourable the Lord High Chancellor of that part of the United Kingdom called Great Britain is to cause Writs to be prepared and issued in the usual manner for proroguing the Convocations accordingly.

WHEREAS Chester Jones, Esquire, Barrister-at-Law, duly appointed in pursuance of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1882," as Commissioner for determining the Wards of the Borough of Poole and apportioning the Councillors thereto, has transmitted to one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State his

Scheme in the following terms:—
"THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS ACT

"Borough of Poole.

borough of Poole on the twenty-first day of May one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven agreed to petition and the Council of the said borough thereupon petitioned Her Majesty for an alteration of the number and boundaries of the wards of the said borough.

"And whereas Her Majesty in pursuance and exercise of the power in Her by 'The Municipal Corporations Act 1882' vested and of every other power enabling Her in that behalf did on the thirteenth day of October one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven by and with the advice of Her Privy Council fix the number of wards into which the borough of Poole should be thence-forth divided and order and direct that the number of the said wards should be six.

"And whereas the Right Honourable Sir Matthew White Ridley, Baronet of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State did on the twenty-seventh day of October one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven in pursuance of the thirteenth section of the said Act appoint Chester Jones Esquire, Barrister-at-Law, to be a Commissioner for determining the boundaries of and for apportioning the Councillors among the wards of the borough of Poole.

"Now I the said Chester Jones do hereby in pursuance of the said appointment determine the boundaries of the said wards as follows:-

"I determine that Ward No. 1 or Hamworthy Ward shall consist of the parish of Hamworthy and the Hamside portion of the parish of Saint James and so much of the area of the said parish of Saint James as is bounded by a line commencing at a point on the Quay in the centre of the road opposite the north-east end of Poole Bridge proceeding thence along the centre of West Quayroad to a point opposite the centre of Barbers Piles thence along the centre of Barbers Piles and along the centre of Thames-street to a point opposite the centre of Salisbury-street thence along the centre of Salisbury-street to the centre of High-street thence in a north-easterly direction along the centre of High-street to a point opposite the centre of Prosperous street thence along the centre of Prosperous-street to the centre of Lagland-street thence in a south-westerly direction along the centre of Lagland-street to a point opposite the centre of Taylor's-buildings thence along the centre of Taylor's-buildings to the East Quay-road thence in a south-easterly direction along the centre of East Quay-road to the termination of the said road at the eastern end of the "WHEREAS two-thirds of the Council of the Gas Quay thence in a southerly direction to the face of the Gas Quay Wall and thence in a westerly direction following the line of the Quay Wall to the point of commencement at the northeast end of the Poole Bridge aforesaid.

"I determine that Ward No. 2 or Saint James West Ward shall consist of so much of the area of the parish of Saint James as is not included in Ward No. 1 and lies west of the centre of High-

"I determine that Ward No. 3 or Saint James East Ward shall consist of the remaining portion of the parish of Spint James not included in Wards Nos. 1 and 2 and so much of the area of the parish of Longfleet as is bounded by a line commencing at a point in the centre of High-st cet where the boundary line of the parish of Longfleet cuts the said street proceeding thence in a north-easterly direction along the centre of High-street to a point opposite the centre of Seldown-road thence along the centre of Seldown-road to a point opposite the centre of Sandy-lane thence along the centre of Sandy-lane to the centre of S ldownroad at the north-east end of Sandy-lane thence in a south-westerly direction along the centre of Seldown-road to a point opposite the centre of the road leading from Seldown-road to the foreshore of Parkstone Bay thence along the centre of the last-mentioned road to the boundary line of the parishes of Longfleet and Parkstone thence following the boundary line of the parish of Longfleet in an easterly southerly westerly and north-westerly direction to the aforesaid point in the centre of High-street where the boundary line of the parish of Longfleet cuts the said street.

"I determine that Ward No. 4 or Parkstone East Ward shall consist of so much of the area of the parish of Parkstone as is bounded by a line commencing at a point in the centre of Saint Peter's-road where the boundary line of the said parish cuts the said road continuing thence in a southerly direction along the centre of Saint Peter's-road to a point opposite the centre of Springfield-road thence along the centre of Springfield-road crossing the Poole-road thence along the centre of Church-road East to the centre of Station-road thence in an easterly direction along the centre of Station-road to and crossing the centre of the Railway Bridge to a point opposite the centre of Vale-road thence along the centre of Vale-road to a point opposite the centre of Blake Hill Pottery-road thence in an easterly direction along the centre of Blake Hill Pottery-road to a point opposite the centre of Pen Hill-road thence in a southerly and southeasterly direction along the centre of Pen Hill-road to the centre of Canford Cliffs-road thence in a southerly direction along the centre of Canford Cliffs road to the centre of Flag Head road thence in a south-westerly direction along the centre of Flag Head-road and across the road leading to the Sandbanks to the line of high water on the seashore in Poole Harbour thence in a south-westerly direction in a . line drawn in continuation of a line drawn along the centre of Flag Head-road across the mud lands to the municipal boundary of the borough of Poole in the centre of the main channel of Poole Harbour thence following the said municipal boundary line in a south-westerly southerly south-easterly north-easterly and northerly direction to the Poole and Bournemouth main road and thence following the same boundary line in a westerly direction along the said road and Ashley-road to the point of commencement in the centre of Saint Peter's-road aforesaid.

"I determine that Ward No. 5 or Longfleet

Ward shall consist of so much of the areas of the parishes of Longfleet and Parkstone as are bounded by a line commencing in the centre of High-street where the boundary of the said parish of Longfleet cuts the said street thence following the boundary line of the parish of Longfleet in westerly north-westerly northerly and easterly directions to a point in the centre of Darbys-lane where the said boundary line cuts the said lane thence in a southerly direction along the centre of Darbys-lane to the centre of the main road from Poole to Wimborne thence in a southerly direction along the centre of the said main road to a point opposite the centre of Garland-road thence in an easterly direction along the centre of Garland-road to the centre of the Poole and Ringwood main road thence crossing the said road to the centre of a new road laid out by Lord Wimborne leading from the said Poole and Ringwood-road between Longfleet Church and the Poole Water Company's reservoir at Longfleet to the Poole and Bournemouth-road thence along the centre of the said new road to and crossing the Poole and Bournemouth main road to the centre of the road forming the middle entrance to Poole Park thence along the centre of the lastmentioned road and continuing in a direct line across the water of Parkstone Bay to the point where the boundary of the parish of Longfleet cuts the line of the London and South Western Railway at the sluice gates thence in a northerly westerly north-easterly and south-westerly direction and following the boundary of Ward No. 3 to the said point in the centre of High-street where the boundary line of the parish of Longfleet cuts the said street.

"I determine that Ward No. 6 or Parkstone West Ward shall consist of the remaining portions of the parishes of Longfleet and Parkstone not included in Wards Nos. 3, 4, and 5.

"And further in pursuance of the said apportionment I apportion three Councillors to each and every of the said Wards and I apportion the Councillors among the said Wards as follows:

"To Ward No. 1 I apportion Herbert Sanders,

Charles Carter and George Bush.

"To Ward No. 2 I apportion Charles John Woodforde, Richard Smith and George Curtis.

"To Ward No. 3 I apportion Walter Marston, Robert Tanner Halgood and William Henry Curtis.

"To Ward No. 4 I apportion Thomas Kendall Ingram, Henry FitzJames Barnes and J. A.

"To Ward No. 5 I apportion William Wheeler, William George Crane and Francis Gwynne

"To Ward No. 6 I apportion Walter Andrew, Charles Robert Hayball, and W. H. Masters.

1882 " as Commissioner for determining the Wards of the Borough of Sunderland and apportioning the Councillors thereto, has transmitted to one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of

State his Scheme in the following terms:—
"MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS ACTS 1882 and 1893.

"(45 and 46 Vict. Cap. 50, and 56 and 57 Vict Cap. 9.)
"Borough of Sunderland.

"WHEREAS Her Majesty has been pleased by and with the advice of Her Privy Council and in pursuance and in exercise of the power vested in Her Majesty by 'The Municipal Corporations Act 1882 'as amended by 'The Municipal Corporations Act 1893' to fix the number of wards into which the borough of Sunderland shall be divided and to order and direct that the said borough shall be divided into sixteen wards which Order was made on the eighteenth day of July one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight and whereas on the twenty-fifth day of July in the year last aforesaid the Right Honourable Sir Matthew White Ridley Baronet, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secre-taries of State did duly warrant and appoint me Henry Best Hans Hamilton, Esquire, Barristerat-Law a Commissioner to prepare a Scheme for determining the boundaries of such wards and for apportioning the Councillors of the said borough among such wards.

"Now I, the said Henry Best Hans Hamilton, in pursuance of the powers given me by virtue of the said appointment under the said Acts, do hereby determine as hereinafter mentioned the boundaries of the sixteen wards into which the said borough is divided, which said wards are hereinafter named and numbered as follows that

 "1. Bridge Ward. "2. Deptford Ward.

 - "4. West Ward.
 - "5. Thornhill Ward.
 - "6. St. Michael's Ward.
 - "7. Hendon Ward.

 - "9. Park Ward.
 - "10. Central Ward.
 - "11. Sunderland Ward.
 - "12. East Ward.
 - "13. Colliery Ward.
 - "14. Monkwearmouth Ward.
 - "15. Monkwearmouth Shore Ward.

"16. Roker Ward.

"No. 1. Bridge Ward.

"I do hereby determine that Bridge Ward shall comprise so much of the said county borough of Sunderland as is contained within an imaginary line commencing at a point in the centre of the Wearmouth Bridge and continuing westwards up the centre of the River Wear to a point opposite Anne-street, thence south-westwards along the centre of Anne-street to B-ach-street, thence southwards down the centre of Beach-street to Trimdon-street, thence westward along the centre of Alliance-street to Deptford-road thence southward down the centre of Deptford-read to Lansdowne-street, thence westward along the centre of Lansdowne-street to Milburn-street, thence southwards along the centre of Milburn-street to Hylton-road, thence westward along the centre of Hylton-road to the centre of the North-Eastern Railway (Pensher Branch), thence along the centre of the said railway south eastwards to the centre of Chester-road, thence eastwards down the centre of Chester-road to Low-row, thence northwards along the centre of Low-row to High-street West,

thence eastwards along the centre of High-street West to a point at the intersection of High-street West, Bridge-street and Fawcett-street, thence northwards along the centre of Bridge-street aforesaid and along the centre of the said bridge to the point of commencement aforesaid.

" No. 2. Deptford Ward.

"And I do hereby determine that Deptford Ward shall comprise so much of the borough as is contained within a line, commencing at a point in the centre of the River Wear opposite Annestreet aforesaid, thence along the centre of the said river in a northerly, westerly, south-westerly and westerly direction to a point in the centre of the said river opposite to the west boundary wall of the old chemical works (known as Messrs. Ogden's Works), thence running in a southerly direction along the said boundary wall, and continuing southwards across the Lambton Railway to the centre of the North-Eastern Railway (Pensher Branch) thence in a south-easterly direction along the centre of said North-Eastern Railway aforesaid to the centre of Hylton-road, and thence along the north-western boundary of Bridge Ward hereinbefore defined to the point of commencement aforesaid in the centre of the said river opposite Anne-street.

"No. 3. Pallion Ward.

"And I do hereby determine that Pallion Ward shall comprise so much of the borough as is contained within a line commencing at the aforesaid point in the centre of the River Wear opposite the west boundary wall of the old chemical works (known as Messrs. Ogden's Works) and continuing in a north-westerly and westerly direction along the centre of the said river to the point where it intersects the borough boundary thence southwards along the borough boundary to the intersection of the said borough boundary and the centre of Hylton-road West, thence eastwards along the centre of Hylton-road West to the centre of Rutland-street, thence northwards along the centre of Rutland-street to the centre of East Moor-road thence north-eastwards along the centre of East Moor-road across St. Luke's-road and continuing still in a north-easterly direction along the centre of the old road to the centre of the North-Eastern Railway, thence northwards along the western boundary of Deptford Ward (as hereinbefore defined) to the centre of the said river at the point of commencement aforesaid. "No. 4. West Ward.

"And I do hereby determine that West Ward shall comprise so much of the borough as is contained within a line commencing at the aforesaid point at the intersection of the borough boundary and the centre of Hylton-road West, and continuing southwards along the borough boundary to the north side of Chester-road, thence continuing along the borough boundary in an easterly and southerly direction to the centre of Chester-road, thence eastwards along the centre of Chester-road to a point at its intersection with the centre of the North-Eastern Railway aforesaid, thence in a north-westerly direction along the boundaries of Bridge and Deptford Wards as hereinbefore defined, thence in a south-westerly, southerly and westerly direction along the boundary of Pallion Ward as hereinbefore defined, to the point of commencement aforesaid, at the intersection of the borough boundary and the centre of

Hylton-road West. "No. 5. Thornhill Ward.

"And I do hereby determine that Thornhill Ward shall comprise so much of the borough as is contained within a line commencing at the aforesaid point of the borough boundary (being the intersection of the centre of Chester-road and the borough boundary) and continuing southwards and eastwards along the borough boundary to the centre of Tunstall-road, thence northwards along the centre of Tunstall-road, Albion-place and of Green-terrace to a point at the intersection of the centres of Low-row and Chester-road, thence westwards along the centre of Chester-road (the southern boundaries of Bridge and West Wards as hereinbefore defined) to the borough boundary at the point of commencement aforesaid.

"No. 6. Saint Michael's Ward.

"And I do hereby determine that Saint Michael's Ward shall comprise so much of the borough as is contained within a line commencing at the point of intersection of the centre of Tunstall-road, with the borough boundary, and continuing eastwards along the borough boundary to the centre of Ryhope-road, thence northwards along the centre of Ryhope-road, Burdon-road, and of Fawcett-street to the point of intersection of Fawcett-street, Bridge-street, and of High-street West aforesaid, thence westward along the centre of High-street West, and southward along the centre of Low-row, Green-terrace, Albion-place, and Tunstall-road to the point of commencement aforesaid.

" No. 7. Hendon Ward.

"And I do hereby determine that Hendon Ward shall comprise so much of the borough as is contained within a line commencing at a point in the centre of Ryhope-road, opposite the south boundary wall of South Moor House and continuing thence south-eastwards along the borough boundary in Ryhope-road to Ocean-road, thence eastwards along the borough boundary in Oceanroad and Halfway House-lane thence northwards still following the borough boundary in Halfway House-lane thence eastwards along the borough boundary to low water mark of ordinary spring tides thence northwards along low water mark of ordinary spring tides to a point on such low water mark opposite the south side of Hendon Dock, thence westwards along the south side of Hendon Dock to the north-west corner of the Wear Fuel Works, thence in a south-westerly direction across the Londonderry and the North-Eastern Railways to the centre of Old Mill-road, continuing along the centre of Old Mill-road, Back Vane-terrace, Mainsforth-terrace, and Mainsforth-terrace West, to the centre of Hendon Valley-road, thence southwards along the centre of Hendon Valley-road to the centre of Villetteroad, thence westwards along the centre of Villette-road, to the centre of Ryhope-road, thence southwards along the centre of Ryhoperoad to the point of commencement aforesaid.

"No. 8. Bishopwearmouth Ward. "And I do hereby determine that Bishopwearmouth Ward shall comprise so much of the borough as is contained within a line commencing at a point at the north-west corner of the Wear Fuel Works, thence in a north-westerly direction across the Londonderry and the North-Eastern Railways to a point of intersection of the centre of International-road with the centre Ferguson street thence northwards along the centre of Ferguson-street and of East Hendonroad to the centre of the North-Eastern Railway (Dock Line) thence westwards along the said centre of the railway to the centre of Hendon-road, thence southwards along the centre of Hendon-road to a point opposite the centre of North Back Ward-terrace, thence south-westwards along the centre of North Back Ward-terrace, North Back Ward-street and Mowbray-road, to the centre of Ryhope-road, thence southwards

along the centre of Ryhope-road to the centre of Villette-road, thence north-eastwards along the north-west boundary of Hendon Ward as hereinbefore defined to the point of commencement aforesaid.

"No. 9. Park Ward.

"And I do hereby determine that Park Ward shall comprise so much of the borough as is contained within a line commencing at the intersection of the centre of Fawcett-street, Burdon-road, Holmeside and of Borough-road, thence southwards along the centre of Burdon-road to the centre of Mowbray-road, thence in an easterly direction along the centre of Mowbray-road, North Back Ward-street, and of North Back Ward-terrace, to the centre of Hendon-road, thence northwards along the centre of Hendon-road to its intersection with the centre of Smyrna-place, thence westwards along the centre of Smyrna-place and Borough-road to the point of commencement aforesaid.

"No. 10. Central Ward.

"And I do hereby determine that Central Ward shall comprise so much of the borough as is contained within a line commencing at a point on the centre of the Wearmouth Bridge, thence in a southerly direction along the centre of the bridge, Bridge-street and Fawcett-street to the point of intersection of Fawcett-street, Burdon-road, Holmeside and of Borough-road thence in an easterly direction along the centre of Boroughroad and of Smyrna-place to the centre of Hendonroad, thence in a northerly direction along the centre of Hendon-road to Coronation-street, thence in a westerly direction along the centre of Coronation-street to New Grey-street, thence in a northerly direction along the centre of New Grey-street to Ettrick-place, thence in an easterly direction along the centre of Ettrick-place to the centre of Grey-street, thence in a northerly direction along the centre of Grey-street to the centre of High-street East, thence in a westerly direction along the centre of High-street East to Russell-street, thence in a northerly direction along the centre of Russell-street to Low-street, and continuing thence in a northerly direction to the centre of the River Wear, thence in a westerly direction along the centre of the said river to the point of commencement aforesaid.

"No. 11. Sunderland Ward.

"And I do hereby determine that Sunderland Ward shall comprise so much of the borough as is contained within a line commencing at a point at the intersection of the centre of Hendon-road and of the North-Eastern Railway (Dock Line), thence running eastward along the centre of the said railway to the centre of East Hendon-road, thence continuing in a northwesterly direction along the centre of East Adelaide-place, Moor-terrace. Hendon-road. Church-street East, Water-lane and Drysdale's Entry to the centre of the River Wear, thence in a westerly direction along the centre of the said river to a point opposite Russell-street thence southwards across Low-street along the centre of Russell-street to High-street East, thence eastwards along the centre of High-street East to Grey-street, thence southward along the centre of Grey-street to Ettrick-place, thence westwards along the centre of Ettrick-place to New Greystreet, thence southwards along the centre of New Grey-street to Coronation-street, thence eastwards along the centre of Coronation-street to the centre of Hendon-road, and thence southward along the centre of Hendon-road to the point of commencement aforesaid.

"No. 12. East Ward.

"And I do hereby determine that East Ward shall comprise so much of the borough as is contained within an imaginary line commencing in the centre of the River Wear at a point opposite Drysdale's Entry aforesaid, and continuing in a south-easterly direction along the centre of Drysdale's Entry, Water-lane, Church-street East, Adelaide-place, Moor-terrace, East Hendonroad, and Ferguson-street to a point at the inter-section of International-road with Fergusonstreet, from thence continuing in a south-easterly direction to the north-west corner of the Wear Fuel Works, thence eastwards along the south side of Hendon Dock to a point opposite thereto at low water mark (ordinary spring tides) thence northwards along the low water mark (ordinary spring tides) to the intersection thereof with the centre of the said river at the Harbour entrance, thence in a south-westerly direction along the centre of the said river to the point of commencement aforesaid.

"No. 13. Colliery Ward.

"And I do hereby determine that Colliery Ward shall comprise so much of the borough as is contained within a line commencing at a point in the centre of the Wearmouth Bridge, and running northwards along the centre of the bridge, North Bridge-street, Hedworth-place, and Newcastle-road, to the borough boundary, thence westwards south-westwards and southwards along the borough boundary to the intersection of the borough boundary with the centre of the River Wear, thence southwards and eastwards along the centre of the said river to the point of commencement on the centre of the bridge aforesaid.

"No. 14. Monkwearmcuth Ward.

"And I do hereby determine that Monkwearmouth Ward shall comprise so much of the borough as is contained within a line commencing at a point on the centre of the Wearmouth Bridge, and running northwards along the centre of Wearmouth Bridge North Bridge-street, Hedworth-place, and of Newcastle-road to the borough boundary, thence eastwards, southwards and again eastwards along the borough boundary to the centre of Fulwell-road, thence running southwards along the centre of Fulwell-road, Church - street North, Williamson - street and Huddleston-street to the centre of the River Wear at a point opposite the centre of Huddlestonstreet, thence westwards along the centre of the said river to the point of commencement on the centre of the bridge aforesaid.

"No. 15. Monkwearmouth Shore Ward.

"And I do hereby determine that Monkwearmouth Shore Ward shall comprise so much of the borough as is contained within a line commencing at the aforesaid point in the centre of the River Wear opposite the centre of Huddleston-street and running northwards along the centre of Huddleston-street, Williamson-street and Churchstreet North to the centre of Roker-avenue, thence eastwards along the centre of Roker-avenue to the centre of Gladstone-street, thence northwards along the centre of Gladstone-street to the centre of the Cross street behind the Vicarage, thence along the centre of such Cross street and the centre of North Back Roker-avenue to the centre of Harbour View, thence along the centre of Harbour View to the south end of South Cliff, Roker (at the tramway terminus) thence in a straight line eastwards to low water mark (ordinary spring sides) thence southwards along the low water mark (ordinary spring sides) to the intersection of low water mark with the centre of the

said river at the Harbour entrance, thence southwestwards along the centre of the said river to the point of commencement aforesaid.

"No. 16. Roker Ward.

"And I do hereby determine that Roker Ward shall comprise so much of the borough as is contained within a line commencing at a point at the intersection of Roker-avenue, Church-street North; and of Fulwell-road, running northwards along the centre of Fulwell-road to the borough boundary, thence in a north-easterly direction along the borough boundary to the end of Sca Banks-lane, thence eastwards in a straight line to low water mark (ordinary spring tides), thence southwards along low water mark (ordinary spring tides) to the northern boundary of Monkwearmouth Shore Ward, opposite the south end of South Cliff Roker-terrace, thence westwards in a straight line to the south end of South Cliff, Roker, thence south-westwards along the centre of Harbour View to North Back Roker-avenue, thence along the centre of North Back-avenue and of the Cross street behind the vicarage to Gladstone-street, thence southwards along the centre of Gladstone-street to Roker-avenue and thence westwards to the point of commencement aforesaid.

"And I do hereby further declare that the boundaries of the said sixteen wards hereinbefore determined and defined are shown upon the plan hereunto annexed and signed by me and the said boundaries of the said wards are clearly set forth

by coloured lines thereon.

"And I do hereby assign and apportion three Councillors to each and every of the said wards as follows, that is to say:

"To Bridge Ward.

No. 247.-Government Notice.

His Excellency the Governor, having heard the opinion of the Board of Health, has been pleased to modify Government Notice No. 23°, of 21st September, 1898, and to direct that the following Regulations be observed, viz. :-

1. Any shipment of cattle, any part of which is found to be suffering or to be suspected of suffering from an infectious or contagious disease at the time of arrival or after a period of inspec-

tion, is to be detained in quarantine.

2. Should the existence of cattle plague be verified before landing, the cargo will not be allowed to land.

3. The importation of cattle, except horses, mules, and asses, from Egypt, the Province of Naples, Calabria, and Salonica, is prohibited, and the introduction into these islands of wool, hides, skins, horns, bones, and hoofs, from the above places and from countries where epidemic diseases are prevailing, is likewise prohibited.

4: Cattle intended for importation into these islands must be accompanied by a certificate stating the place of their origin and the fact that cattle disease has not prevailed in that place (with as far as can be ascertained the route followed from any inland station to the port of embarkation), during the three months previous to the date of embarkation. Such certificate shall be given by the British Consular Authority at the places of origin and embarkation, or if there be no such British Consular Authority, by the Local Government Authority of the places of origin and embarkation.

5. Vessels arriving in this island, having on board more than 250 head of cattle (bovine) are to go into the Quarantine Harbour, and the cattle are to be inspected in the cattle enclosures of the

6. The importation of cattle from the Black Sea, Sea of Azov, Roumelia, Morocco, and Syria, not otherwise prohibited, and the importation of horses, mules, and asses from the ports mentioned in Article 3, may be permitted subject to the undermentioned conditions; provided that, in the opinion of the Chief Government Medical Officer, such cattle are not affected with disease so that they may be admitted in the lazaretto without detriment to cattle already in the Island:

(a.) Cattle from the Black Sea, Sea of Azov, Syria and Roumelia, shall only be admitted to the enclosures which may be assigned or approved for that purpose at the lazaretto, and they shall be subjected to isolation and observation for three months, and those from Morocco for fifteen days.

(b.) Application must be made for leave to import and permission is to be obtained in writing from Government in each case before shipment, stating the approximate number of the animals intended to be shipped. No cattle shall be allowed to be landed unless the consignee has obtained such leave from Government, and agreed to abide by any regulations which may be established.

(c.) The application referred to in the preceding article shall imply that the applicant has consented to pay the usual fees for entrance into the lazaretto, and for guards and extraordinary expenses on each head of cattle, besides 2s. 6d. on each head of cattle per month, or part thereof, in cases in which it is found necessary to keep cattle in the lazaretto for a longer period than 15 days.

(d.) That such cattle, if slaughtered at the lazaretto, will be subject to the regulations which may from time to time be made by the Port

Authorities.

(e.) The owners of cattle in the lazaretto shall be subjected to such regulations as to slaughtering of cattle, disposal of offal, blood, &c., as may from time to time be made by the Port Authorities.

(f.) The period of quarantine for horses is reduced to 21 days in the lazaretto, provided that the owners undertake to keep the said animals in a place approved by the Collector of Customs, and also undertake to cause them to be inspected by a Government Medical Officer or Veterinary Surgeon twice a week for nine weeks.

7. Swine arriving from Albania and Greece may be imported subject to 40 days' quarantine at the lazaretto or in private pens, and to any restrictions which the Chief Government Medical Officer

may consider necessary.

8. The importation of dogs is subjected to three months' quarantine.
