## No. 605.—UNITED STATES—NEW YORK.

*Romer Shoal Light altered in Character.*

THE United States Government has given notice, dated 28th September, 1898, that a light is now exhibited from a lighthouse recently erected on the foundation pier of the former tower on Romer Shoal, eastern side of Swash Channel, New York Lower Bay.

Romer Shoal Light is a flashing white light of the fourth order, giving one flash every four seconds, elevated 54 feet above high water, and visible in clear weather from a distance of 12 miles.

The lighthouse is 45 feet in height above the foundation pier, cylindrical, of iron, and painted white below and brown above; the foundation pier is black.

Approximate position, lat. 40° 30' 45" N., long 74° 0' 50" W.

## No. 606.—JAPAN—KIUSIU, SOUTH-WEST COAST.

*Sunken Rock North-Eastward of Noma no Hana.*

THE Japanese Government has given notice, dated 11th August, 1898, of the existence of a sunken rock north-eastward of Noma no Hana.

This rock, locally named Oho se, about 40 yards long north and south, 12 feet broad, and steep-to around, lies with Futasima (Kutashima) bearing N. 49° E., distant 3¼ miles, and Kinposan (Kimposan) S. 71° E.

Approximate position, lat. 31° 30' 30" N., long 150° 10' 50" E.
