Board of Trate (Fisheries and Harbour Department), London, October 25, 1898.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated 20th instant, from Her Majesty's Representative at Copenhagen, reporting that the Government of the Danish Antilles has substituted medical inspection for the quarantine imposed on 9th June last against vessels arriving from Santos, Brazil; but that in consequence of an outbreak of yellow fever in Vera Cruz and Tampico, Mexico, the said Government has imposed five days' quarantine on all vessels arriving from those ports.

(The Production, Storage, and Supply of Elec-tricity by the Urban District Council of Rugby within their District, the Acquisition and Appropriation of Lands and Construction of Works, the Breaking Up and Interference with Streets and Railways, the Laying Down and Erection of Electric Lines, Pipes, Wires, Posts, and Apparatus; the Taking and Recovery of Rates and Charges, the Entry into Houses and Lands, the Making of Contracts and the Transfer of the Undertaking; the Borrowing of
