ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

(SWINE-FEVER INFECTED AREA.)

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Extension of Limits of Swine-Fever Infected Area

1. The limits of the following Area which is declared by Order of the Board dated the twenty-second day of October, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight to be an area infected with swine-fever for the purposes of the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1896 (namely),—an Area in the Parts of Holland Division of Lincolnshire, comprising the parishes of Spalding, Cowbit, Pinchbeck, Surfleet, Quadring, Donington, Bicker, Swineshead, Wigtoft, Gosberton, Weston, Moulton, and the detached part of Sutterton, and such part of the parish of Deeping St. Nicholas as is situate within that Division,—are hereby extended so as to include the Area described in the Schedule to this Order, and the Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby from and after the commencement of this Order declared to be an area infected with swine-fever for the purposes of the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1896, dated the fourteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six.

Commencement.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the eighth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight.

No person will be admitted to Examination from whom the Secretary of the Civil Service Commission has not received, on or before the 1st December, an application on the prescribed form, which may be obtained from the Secretary at once.

THE Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice, that the following Regulations are published with the consent of the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, viz. :—

REGULATIONS respecting Open Competitive Examinations for situations as Female Learner in the Department of the Postmaster-General in Edinburgh, Dublin, and certain other Towns.

These Regulations are liable to alteration for future Examinations.

1. Candidates will be required to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners—

- (a.) That their age on the day of the Examination is not less than 15 nor more than 18.
- (b.) That they are duly qualified in respect of health and character.
- (c.) That they are unmarried or widows.
2. At each Examination the number of Candidates to be selected will be such as the Postmaster-General may from time to time fix.
3. The Examination will be in the following subjects, viz. :—
 1. Handwriting.
 2. Orthography.
 3. English Composition, to be tested by a short essay or letter on a simple subject.
 4. Arithmetic, including Vulgar and Decimal Fractions and Percentages.
 5. Geography (general).

Candidates who fail to obtain such an aggregate number of marks as may indicate, in the judgment of the Civil Service Commissioners, a competent amount of general proficiency, will not be regarded as qualified.

4. Candidates must be at least 5 feet in height. No officer, however, will be retained in the Service who does not attain the height of 5 ft. 2 in. before completing her 19th year.

5. No Candidate will be admitted to examination who does not, at such time as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners, produce an undertaking, signed by her Parent or Guardian,

that she will, if successful, reside within a suitable distance from the Post Office, either with her parents or guardians, or with relations or friends approved by such parents or guardians.

6. Persons holding situations in the Civil Service will not be eligible unless they produce to the Civil Service Commissioners the written permission of the authorities of their Department to attend the Examination, dated before the commencement of the competition.

7. Application for permission to attend an Examination must be made at such times and in such manner as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners.

8. A fee of 3s. will be required from every Candidate attending the Examination.

NOTE.—Female Learners will be required to resign their appointments on marriage.

Utrish Point—Light Exhibited.

THE Russian Government has given notice, dated 28th September, 1898, that an alternating light not constantly watched has been established on Utrish Point, Caucasian coast.

Utrish Point Light shows red and white alternately in quick succession; it is elevated 49 feet above the sea, and visible in clear weather from a distance of six miles between the bearings of S. 14° E., through east and north, to N. 53° W.

Alushta, Sudak—Lights Intended.

THE Russian Government has given notice, dated 24th September, 1898, that it is intended shortly to exhibit alternating lights not constantly watched at Alushta and Sudak, south-east coast of Krimea.

Alushta Light will show white and red alternately in quick succession; it is elevated 46 feet above the sea, and visible in clear weather from a distance of 6 miles between the bearings of S. 41° W., through west and north, to N. 17° E., being obscured by the land in other directions.

Noup Head—Intended Light.

THE Commissioners of Northern Lighthouses have given notice that, on and after 22nd November, 1898, a white group flashing light, with a period of one minute, will be exhibited from a lighthouse recently erected on Noup Head, Orkney Islands.

Noup Head Light, with a candle power of 51,000 candles, will show five flashes in quick succession, occupying about twenty seconds, followed by an eclipse of about forty seconds, it will be elevated about 260 feet above high water, and visible in clear weather from a distance of 22 miles from the bearing of N. 5° W., through north and east, to about S. 82° W. From an observer within three quarters of a mile of the land on its west side the light will be obscured by cliffs; it will also be visible between the bearings of S. 80° W. and N. 56° W. when not obscured by the hills and cliffs of Westray and Papa Westray. The lighthouse is a white cylindrical tower, 79 feet high.
