

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

(DATED 11TH NOVEMBER 1898.)

HAMPSHIRE (MUZZLING OF DOGS) AMENDMENT ORDER OF 1898.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The Order firstly described in the First Schedule to this Order shall from and after the commencement of this Order apply only to the District and part of a District of Local Authorities mentioned in the Second Schedule to this Order.

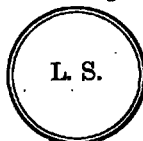
2. The Order secondly described in the First Schedule to this Order is hereby from and after the commencement of this Order revoked: Provided that such revocation shall not invali-

date or make unlawful anything done under the Order hereby revoked before the commencement of this Order, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, the Order hereby revoked before the commencement of this Order.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the fifteenth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight.

4. This Order may be cited as the HAMPSHIRE (MUZZLING OF DOGS) AMENDMENT ORDER OF 1898.

THE Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice, that the following Regulations have been approved by the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, viz:—

SPECIAL REGULATIONS (supplementary to the General Regulations issued 8th April, 1872, and amended by subsequent Notices in the London Gazette) respecting Open Competitive Examinations for the situation of Assistant of Customs in the Department of Her Majesty's Customs.

N.B.—These Regulations are liable to alteration for future Examinations.

1. The limits of age for this situation are 19 and 25. Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of the month in which the Examination is held.

2. Candidates must be unmarried and without family, unless they are already serving in the Customs Department.

3. No Candidate will be eligible for appointment who is less than 5 ft. 4 in. height and 34 in. round the chest, or who, if 5 ft. 10 in. and upwards in height, is less than 35 in. round the chest.
