

said gasworks, and to construct new and further works, and to manufacture and store gas, and to convert and manufacture, and store all or any products arising in or resulting from the manufacture of gas.

3. The lands intended to be used for the manufacture and storage of gas under the said Order may be shortly described as follows:—

A piece of land with the manager's residence and offices erected thereon, with yard adjoining, and the retort houses, retort beds, engine house, and condensers erected thereon, or on some part thereof, and the appurtenances belonging thereto, containing by estimation 249 square yards or thereabouts, bounded on the north by Mill Brow, on the south and east by the land next hereinafter described belonging to the District Council, and in the occupation of the Company, and on the west by an occupation lane, leading from Mill Brow to land and buildings belonging to Alfred Harris, Esquire, and formerly known as the Old Skinners-yard, and which said piece of land belongs to and is in the occupation of the Company, and is situate in the township of Kirkby Lonsdale. Also, a piece of land, with the gas-holders, sheds, purifying house, tank, workroom, and meter house, and other buildings erected thereon, with yard adjoining, containing by estimation 682 square yards or thereabouts, bounded on the north in part by the piece of land lastly described, and in the other part by Mill Ayre, on the east by Mill Ayre aforesaid, on the south in part by Mill Ayre aforesaid, and in the other part by the said land and buildings belonging to the said Alfred Harris, and on the west in part by the said occupation lane, and in the other part by the said piece of land first hereinbefore described belonging to and in the occupation of the Company, and which said piece of land belongs to the District Council and is in the occupation of the Company and situate in the township of Kirkby Lonsdale.

Also, a piece of land belonging to the District Council and in the occupation of Alfred Harris, Esq., containing 517 square yards or thereabouts, situate in the township of Kirkby Lonsdale, and bounded on the north and west by land belonging to the said Alfred Harris, on the south in part by other land of the District Council in the occupation of the said Alfred Harris, and in the other part by the said land and buildings belonging to the said Alfred Harris, and on the east by the said occupation lane.

Also, another piece of land, part of Mill Ayre aforesaid, belonging to the District Council, and in the occupation of A. Meryon Harris, Esq., containing 860 square yards, or thereabouts, situate in the township of Kirkby Lonsdale, and bounded on the north and south by other land of the District Council called Mill Ayre, on the east by the River Lune, and on the west by the piece of land belonging to the District Council and in the occupation of the Company secondly hereinbefore described.

4. To authorize the District Council to purchase by agreement or take on lease for the purposes of gasworks such land as may be hereafter required, or to appropriate any lands for the time being vested in them for those purposes.

5. To empower the District Council to manufacture and supply gas for public and private purposes (including heating and motive power) within the said Urban District and for that purpose to break up streets, roads, and highways and lay down, maintain, and renew gas mains, pipes, and other works and apparatus, and to manufacture, supply, fix, and deal in meters, stoves, ranges, and fittings for the use of gas within the said Urban District, and to exercise

all such other powers as are necessary for and incidental to the supply of gas, and to sell and deal in coal, and also in coke, culm, tar, oil, ammoniacal liquor, and other residual products and things.

6. To empower the District Council to levy rates and charges for the supply of gas and for the hire or use of meters and fittings, and if thought fit to alter existing rates, and to vary and extinguish all rights and privileges, if any, inconsistent with or which would interfere with or impede the carrying out of the objects of the said Order.

7. To authorize the District Council to acquire, hold, and use patent rights and licences in connection with the manufacture of gas and residuals arising thereupon.

8. To authorize the District Council and any Corporation, or other District Council, or any Company, Commissioners, or persons to enter into and carry into effect contracts and agreements with respect to the supply, by the District Council, of gas beyond the limits of the said Urban District, and to confer upon the District Council special powers with respect thereto and to the laying down and maintaining main-pipes and apparatus in streets and roads not dedicated to the public, and the breaking up of such streets and roads, and for the protection of the gasworks and gas supply of the District Council, and the prevention of waste or misuse of gas, and for the allowance of discount to consumers.

9. To empower the District Council to borrow money for the purposes of the transfer and taking over of the said property and works of the Company, and for the purposes of gasworks and gas supply and of the Order (including the costs thereof), and to secure the moneys so borrowed upon the rates and revenue arising from the gasworks and gas supply, and upon the general district rate, and all or any other rates or property for the time being of the District Council, or any of them.

10. To incorporate with the intended Order, and to confer upon the District Council, with or without alteration, all or some of the powers and provisions of the Gasworks Clauses Act, 1847, and of the Gasworks Clauses Act, 1871.

And notice is hereby further given, that on or before the 30th day of November, 1898, a copy of this notice as published in the London Gazette, and a map of the land proposed to be used for the manufacture of gas or of residual products arising from the manufacture of gas, and a published map of the district on a scale of not less than one inch to a mile, showing the boundaries of the proposed limits of supply, and the situation of the gasworks, will be deposited at the offices of the Local Government Board, Whitehall, and for public inspection with the Clerk of the Peace for the county of Westmorland at his office at Kendal.
