Stourbridge Water.

(Application to Board of Trade for a Provisional Order for power to raise Additional Capital; to extend the Limits of Supply; to levy Rates; to lay down Pipes and open Streets; to supply Water by Meter or in Bulk; for preventing Waste, &c., of Water, and for other purposes.)

**N**OTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to the Board of Trade on or before the 23rd day of December next, under the provisions of the Gas and Water Works Facilities Act, 1870, by the Stourbridge Water Works Company Limited, Incorporated by the Stourbridge Water Works Act, 1854, and registered under the Joint Stock Companies Act, 1856, hereinafter called "the Company," for a Provisional Order for all or some of the purposes following, that is to say:—

1. To extend the limits within which the Company is authorized to supply water, and to enable the Company to supply water within the parish of Clent, in the county of Worcester.

2. To authorize the Company to raise further money by the creation and issue of new preferential or ordinary shares or stock, and by borrowing on mortgage or by the creation and issue of debenture stock, or by any of such means.

3. To enable the Company to have and exercise within the extended limits of supply all such powers, privileges, and authorities for the supply and sale of water, including the levying of rents, rates, and charges, as they now have within their

existing limits of supply, or to enable the Company to levy such new or increased rents, rates and charges within the extended limits of supply as may be prescribed in the Order, and to confer vary, and extinguish exemptions from, and to compound for, the payment of such rents, rates, and charges.

4. To enable the Company to exercise within the extended limits of supply all such powers of executing works, and acquiring by agreement and holding lands, property, and easements for the purposes of their Undertaking, as they now have within their existing limits of supply.

5. To authorize the Company from time to time, for laying down, repairing, and maintaining any mains, conduits, pipes, culverts, and other works, within the extended limits of supply, to break up and interfere with streets, roads, high-ways, bridges, lanes, and other public and private passages and places, and sewers, drains, pipes, and wires in, over, or under the same.

6. To authorize the Company to manufacture, provide, sell, or let water fittings and meters, and to execute works in connection with such fittings and meters.

7. To authorize the Company to make and carry into effect contracts and agreements for the supply of water by meter, or for the supply of water in bulk or otherwise for any purpose whatsoever with any public body or Company within or beyond their limits of supply.

8. To make provision for the protection of the works, property, and water supply of the Company, and for preventing and prohibiting the fouling or contamination and the waste and misuse of water, and to impose penalties in respect thereof.

9. To provide that the water supplied by the Company need not be supplied at constant pressure, or be delivered at a greater height than can be reached by gravitation from the works of the Company.

10. To confer upon the Company all or some of the powers mentioned or referred to in the Gas and Water Works Facilities Act, 1870, and to incorporate with the Order with or without modification all or some of the provisions of the Water Works Clauses Act, 1847, the Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845, and the Companies Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845, and any Acts amending these Acts, and to confer upon the Company all necessary powers and authorities for the purposes of the intended Order, and to vary or extinguish any rights or privileges inconsistent therewith.

11. To alter or amend, so far as necessary, for the purposes aforesaid, or any of them, the Stourbridge Water Works Act, 1854, and the Stourbridge Water Order, 1879, and any other Act or Order relating to the Company.
