or some of them, or some part or parts thereof respectively; also to open or otherwise interfere with some part of the following railway (that is to say): the London and South Western Railway, Bournemouth Direct Line and Bournemouth East and West Junction Line.

5. The following are the names of the streets within which the Corporation propose to lay electric lines within a period to be prescribed by the Order:—

Queen's-road from West Station to Poole-road, Poole-road from Queen's-road to Commercial-road, Commercial-road, the Square, Old Christchurch-road, Holdenhurst-road from Lansdowne to East Station, or some of them, or some part or parts thereof respectively.

6. To authorise the Corporation to manufacture, purchase, hire, sell, and let all necessary lamps, accumulators, meters, fittings, plant, engines, dynamos, machinery, apparatus, and other matters or things required for the purposes of the Order, and to acquire, work, and use patent rights for producing, storing, controlling, distributing, and measuring, or otherwise relating to the supply of electric energy.

7. To prescribe and limit the price to be charged for electric energy.

8. To authorise the Corporation to take, collect, and recover rates, rents, and charges for the supply of electric energy, and the use of any machines, lamps, meters, fittings, or apparatus worked by or used or connected therewith.

9. To make provisions regulating the nature and amount of supply of electric energy, and the conditions compulsory or permissive, under which it shall be given, and for securing a regular and sufficient supply to the consumers as the Acts to be incorporated may authorise or the Board of Trade may prescribe.

10. To make provision for the inspection and testing of mains and other works, &c., for the appointment and remuneration of electric inspectors, and for the supply, use, inspection, testing, and certifying of meters, fittings, and instruments.

11. To authorise the Corporation to enter upon any houses, buildings, or lands supplied, or proposed to be supplied, with electric energy for any purpose relating to such supply.

12. To authorise the Corporation to enter into contracts with companies or persons for the execution and maintenance of works and the supply of electric energy, and to relieve the Corporation from the consequences of any acts or defaults of any such contractors, and to empower the Corporation to sell, transfer, or lease to companies or persons, all or some of the rights, powers, and privileges and obligations intended to be conferred or imposed by the Order, on such terms and conditions as may be agreed upon between the parties, subject to the approval of the Board of Trade.

13. To incorporate with the Order, with or without alteration, and to make applicable thereto, all or some of the provisions of the Electric Lighting Acts, 1882 and 1888, and of the Acts, or portions of Acts, incorporated therewith.

14. To confer upon the Corporation all such powers, rights, authorities, and privileges as are or may become necessary or expedient for carrying out the purposes of the Order, and to vary or extinguish all rights and privileges which may be inconsistent therewith.

15. To empower the Corporation to borrow money for the purposes of the Order and to

charge the money so borrowed, and interest upon the district fund and general district rate of the borough, and to make provision for the disposal or application of the revenue arising from the undertaking.

16. To incorporate with the Order Section 265 of the Public Health Act, 1875, and the Public Authorities Protection Act, 1893 (relating to actions against local authorities, their officers and servants, and their protection from personal liability), and to extend those enactments to matters arising under the Order.

17. And notice is hereby further given that a map showing the boundaries of the proposed area of supply, and a copy of this advertisement, as published in the London Gazette, will be deposited, on or before the 30th day of November, 1898, for public inspection at the office of the Clerk of the Peace for the county of Hants, at his office at Winchester, in the said county, and at the office of the Town Clerk of Bournemouth.
