In the Matter of the Companies Acts, 1862 to 1893, and of the South Wales and Monmouthshire Wool Stapling Company, Limited.

At an Extraordinary General Meeting of the above-named Company, duly convened and held at the Warehouse of the Company, situate at Pontmorlais, Merthyr Tydfil, on Tuesday, the 18th day of October, 1898, the following Special Resolutions were duly passed; and at a subsequent Extraordinary General Meeting of the said Company, also duly convened and held at the

same place on Saturday, the 5th day of November, 1898, the following Special Resolutions were duly confirmed, viz. :—

1. "That the Company be wound up voluntarily under the provisions of the Companies Acts, 1862 to 1893, and that a Liquidator be appointed to conduct the winding up.
2. "That Mr. Duncan Macdonald, of No. 9, Newcastle-street, Merthyr Tydfil, Draper, be and is hereby appointed Liquidator."
