HER Majesty the Queen has been graciously pleased to confer the Decoration of the Albert Medal of the Second Class on-

RICHARD WRIGHT TOMAN, Engineer of Her Majesty's ship "Foam."

The following is the account of the services in respect of which the Decoration has been conferred :

On the 3rd August, 1898, whilst Her Majesty's ship "Foam" was carrying out her full speed trial at Malta, the mean pressure cylinder burst; the revolutions of the engines at the time being 350 per minute.

There was no indication whatever of the impending explosion, which, of course, happened with great suddenness.

MR. TOMAN at once ordered every one to leave the engine room, and ran to the main throttlevalve, which is at the fore end of the engine room, and endeavoured to shut it off, getting both arms and hands badly scalded in consequence. He then proceeded to shut off the main stop-valves of boilers in the stokeholds.

Having done this with great promptitude, and so confining the steam to the boilers alone, he increased the chance of saving the life of anyone who might have been left below.

MR. TOMAN, thinking all the men were not up from the engine room, went down and searched in this volume of steam, which was at a pressure of 200 lbs. to the square inch when the cylinder burst, but was unable to find anyone.

He then tried to get on deck, but, owing to the excessive volume of steam, he twice fell halfway down the ladder. He eventually reached the deck, and at once proceeded to turn on the fire extinguishers to the boilers, his hands at the time being almost bare of skin.

The valve wheel was heated to such an extent as to be almost unbearable to hands in an ordinary condition.

As the engines were flying round immediately

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after the accident there was every danger of the connecting rod being driven through the bottom, but it was greatly lessened by the promptitude and pluck shown by MR. TOMAN in shutting off the main stop-valves, and so reducing the risk of the ship being sunk or seriously damaged, and the lives of all on board being probably lost.

MR. TOMAN, after having been driven out of the engine room and severely scalded, again went below into the engine room, which was filled with steam, to search for anyone who may not have been able to escape, and only succeeded in finally getting out of the engine room after two attempts.

MR. TOMAN was very much scalded on both arms and knees by the escape of steam, which necessitated his removal to hospital.

PORT OF MIDDLESBROUGH. LIMITS OF PORT.

WE, the undersigned, Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, do hereby, under the authority of "The Customs Consolidation" Act, 1876," appoint Middlesbrough, on and after the tenth day of November, 1898, to continue and be a Port in that part of the United Kingdom called England, and do hereby declare that the limits of the said Port shall commence at Huntcliffe Foot, in the North Riding of the county of York, being the northern limit of the Port of Whitby, thence along the coast of the county of York and along the southern side of the River Tees westward to a point about three hundred and thirty yards to the south or south-west of the old quay wall at the south-west end of the public ferry landing at Newport, in the borough of Middlesbrough, in the county of York, such point being the westerly river boundary of the borough and the extreme easterly limit of the Port of Stockton, thence by an imaginary line drawn at right angles from the southern bank of the river at such point to the northern bank to a point situate in the parish of Stockton, in the county of Durham, and shall include the whole of the River Tees east of such line, and shall extend along the coast of Durham to the south side of the town of Seaton, being the southern limit of the Port of West Hartlepool, and shall extend to the distance of three miles seawards from low water mark, and shall include all islands, bays, harbours, rivers and creeks within the aforesaid limits.

And we, the said Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, do hereby, on and after the day and year above-mentioned, annul all former limits of the Port of Middlesbrough.

[The bearings are magnetic, and those concerning the visibility of lights are given from seaward.] No. 686.-NORWAY.

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners No. 257 of 1898 :---

The Norwegian Government has given notice that, on 20th October, 1898, the following lantern lights would be exhibited :-

1. Ystebö is an occulting light, elevated 16 feet above high water, and showing the following sectors :- red between the bearings of N. 64° E. and N. 60° E., white between N. 60° E. and N. 55° E., and green between N. 55° E. and N. 46° E.; it also shows white over the harbour, but is obscured in other directions. The lighthouse is situated on the north-west point of North Bladö.

Approximate position, lat. 59° 3' 10" N., long. 5° 24' 20" E.

2. Middagsnæs, Fæö, is an occulting ligh', elevated 42 feet above high water, showing the following sectors :- red between the bearings of S. 34° E., through east, and N. 79° E, white between N. 79° E. and N. 69° E., green between N. 69° E. and N. 6° E., obscured in other directions.

Approximate position, lat. 59° 22' 35" N., long. 5° 9' 15" E.

3. Torgernæs, Rövær, is an occulting light, elevated 17 feet above high water, and showing the following sectors :- red between the bearings of N. 37° E., through north, and N. 6° W., white between N. 6° W. and N. 12° W., also white between S. 43° W. and S. 88° W., over the harbour, but obscured elsewhere.

Stolmesund, on Vaageholmen, is an occulting light, elevated 75 feet above high water, bass (rontefract), sonn Kichard Diythe (Mar-chester), Frederick William Buglass (Gates-head), Robert Garvock Cameron (Forres), Ernest Alfred Grundy (Oxford), John Ernest Hillyer (Portsmouth), Frederick Howe (Har-low), William Henry Iredale (Liverpool), James Alexander Jackson (Dungannon), Charles S. 73° E., also white towards Stolmevaag, but obscured in other directions.

5. Fleslandskiær is an occulting light, elevated 18 feet above high water, and showing the following sectors :- white between the bearings of S. 24° W. and S. 8° W., red between S. 8° W., through south and east, and N. 60° E., white between N. 60° E. and N. 47° E., green between N. 47° E. and N. 36° E., white between N. 36° E. and N. 18° E., red between N. 18° E. and N. 12° E., but obscured in other directions.

Approximate position, lat. 60° 17' 35" N., Jong. 5° 12' 15" E.

6. Askönæs is a white occulting light, elevated 57 feet above high water, and visible between the bearings of S. 39° E., through south and west, and N. 12° W.

1. Glan Herföl is an occulting light, elevated 19 feet above high water, showing the following sectors :---white between the bearings of S. 9° E. and S. 77° E., red between S. 77° E., through east, and N. 5° E., white between N. 5° E., through north, and N. 73° W., obscured in other directions.

2. The above lights are exhibited from 15th July to 31st May annually.

4. Lyngör .- Two leading lights are shown ; the front light is white occulting, elevated 37 feet above high water, and visible between the bearings of S. 66° W., through west and north, and N. 69° E.

Approximate position, lat. 58° 38' 20" N., long. 9° 7' 40" E.

Lyngör Rear Light on Tokersfjeld is white fixed, elevated 70 feet above high water, and visible between the bearings of S. 75° W. and S. 89° W. These two lights in line S. 82° W. lead through the channel between Sperte and Stangholm.

5. The motive power to be used on the proposed tramways is animal, steam, compressed air, gas, oil, and any other mechanical power (applied by means of wire or rope cables worked by stationary engines), and electric energy, applied by means of motors in the engines or carriages or generated at stations, and communicated by electric lines in or underground or overhead (all which powers other than animal power are herein included in the expression "mechanical power"), and it is intended to apply for power to use the said motive power on all or some of the Corporation tramways.

3. To empower the Corporation to make such. alterations of the Corporation tramways, and any tramways within or (by agreement with the local authority and the Company or person owning or working the same) any transway or light railway without the City which may for the time being be connected with any of the Corporation tramways, or any part or parts thereof, and to execute all such works on or in connection therewith, and in, over, or under the streets or roads in which the same are laid, as may be necessary or expedient for adapting the same to be worked by mechanical power; and to empower the Corporation to lay down, construct, and maintain on, in, under, or over the surface of any street, road, or place, and (by agreement) to attach to any house and huil ling such posts, conductors, wires, tubes, mains. plates, cables, ropes, and apparatus, and to make and maintain such openings and ways in, on, or under any such surface as may be necessary or convenient either for the working of the proposed tramways, or the Corporation tramways, or any tramway within or (by agreement with the local authority and the Company or person On the north-west side thereof, between owning or working the same) any tramway or fight railway without the City which may for the time being be connected with any of the Corporation tramways, or for connecting any portions of the said tramways or any tramways within or without the City with any tramways within or without the City which can be worked in connection with any of the Corporation tramways, or for providing access to or forming connections with any generating station or stations, engines, machinery, or apparatus.

4. To empower the Corporation to construct any of the proposed tranways, and to reconstruct any of the Corporation tranways by substituting single or interlacing lines for double lines or double or interlacing lines for single lines.

5. To empower the Corporation when any road in which a tramway is laid is altered or widened, to reconstruct such tramway in such position as they think fit.

6. To enable the Corporation for the constructing of any tramway to increase the width of the roadway by reducing the width of any footpath.

7. To empower the Corporation on the one hand, and any local authority, company, body, or person on the other hand, to enter into, and carry into effect agreements for the supply of electric energy for any purpose to and by the Corporation, by and to such local authority, company, body, or person.

8. To enable the Corporation on the one hand, and any local authority, company, or person with regard to any tramways in the City not being the property of the Corporation and any tramways (including in that word, where subsequently used in this Notice, any light railway) in any adjacent districts which can be worked with any of the Corporation tramways on the other hand, from time to time to enter into and carry into effect con-tracts and agreements with respect to the purchase, sale, lease, working, use, manage-ment, and maintenance by the contracting parties of all or any of their respective tramways and works, or any part or parts thereof, respectively, the making of all necessary junc-tions, the supply of rolling stock, plant, machinery, and electrical energy or power, the appointment and removal of officers and servants, the payments to be made, and the con-ditions to be performed in respect of such working, use, management, and maintenance, the interchange, accommodation, conveyance, transmission, and delivery of traffic coming from or destined for the respective undertakings of the contracting parties, and the division and apportionment of the revenue arising from such traffic, and the payment of any fixed or contingent rent, and to confirm and to give effect to any agreements which have been or may be made touching any of the matters aforesaid.

9. To authorise the Corporation upon such terms and conditions as may be agreed on or settled by arbitration, to run over any of the Corporation tramways leased to the Bradford Tramways and Omnibus Company, Limited, or the Bradford and Shelf Tramways Company, Limited.

10. To authorise the Corporation for the purposes of constructing any tramway in any street, to take up, remove, or dispose of, or, if thought fit, to appropriate and use in the construction of that tramway any existing tramway in such street.

11. To empower the Corporation to make from time to time such turnouts, crossings, passing places, sidings, loops, junctions, and other works in addition to those specified herein as may be necessary or convenient to the efficient. working of all, or any, of the beforementioned tramways, or for affording access to the stables, carriage, engine, boiler, and dynamo houses, buildings, sheds, and works of the Corporation, or their lessees, or for effecting junctions with the system of any other Corporation, company, or person with their consent.

12. To empower the Corporation from time to time, when by reason of the execution of any work in, or the alteration of, any street, road, highway, or thoroughfare, in which any tramway, channel, or electric line shall be laid or placed, it is necessary or expedient so to do, to alter, remove, or discontinue all, or any part, of such tramway, channel, or electric line, and to make, lay down, and place temporarily in the same or any adjacent street, road, highway, or thoroughfare, a substituted tramways, channel, or electric line or substituted tramways, or channels, or electric lines.

13. To confer on and to reserve to the Corporation and their lessees the exclusive right of using on any of the proposed tramways, carriages drawn or propelted by any motive power hereinbefore mentioned, and having wheels adapted to run on or in an edged, grooved, or other rail on such tramways.

14. To provide for the repair by the Corporation or their lessees or other persons, bodies, or authorities of any streets, roads, highways, or thoroughfares in which any tramway, channel, or electric line may, for the time being, be laid or placed, and for the use or disposition of any materials or things found in the construction or repair of any of the tramways, or channels, or electric lines.

15. To empower the Corporation and their lessees to place and run carriages on the proposed tramways, and on the Corporation trainways, and on any trainway within or without the City, which may for the time being be connected with any of the Corporation tramways, and to work and demand and take tolls rates, and charges in respect of the use of such tramways and carriages, and for the conveyance of passengers, animals, goods, minerals, merchandise and other traffic thereon and therein, and to confer exemptions from such tolls, rates, and charges, and both within and without the City to provide stables, buildings, carriages, trucks, horses, harness, engines, motors, machinery, apparatus, and steam, electric, cable, and other plant (fixed and movable) necessary or convenient for working such tramways by any motive power hereinbefore mentioned, and to sell, exchange or dispose of such of the beforementioned articles and things as may not be required.

16. To authorise the Corporation wholly in the said parish of Bradford to make and maintain the following street works (that is to say):--

- Work No. 1.—The widening and improvement of John-street on the north-east side thereof, commencing at its junction with Westgate, and thence extending for a distance of 55 yards or thereabouts, measured in a north-easterly direction from Westgate.
- Work No. 2.—The widening and improvement of North-parade on the north-east side thereof, commencing at a point 32 yards distant, measured in a northerly direction from the northern corner of the Church Institute, thence extending in a northerly direction for a distance of 16 yards orthereabouts.

Work No. 3.-The widening and improvement

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of Square-street on each side thereof, from Wakefield-road to Bowling Back-lane, so as to make the said street of an uniform width of 18 yards.

- of 18 yards. Work No. 4.—The widening and improvement of Keighley-road, on the north-east side thereof, commencing at a point 65 yards distant, measured in a south-easterly direction from the junction of the Keighleyroad and Frizinghall-road on the south-east corner thereof, thence in a north-westerly direction for a distance of 292 yards or thereabouts. And also from a public footpath near Park-grove, being 178 yards distant from the termination of the lastmentioned point, and extending thence in a north-westerly direction for a distance of 130 yards or thereabouts.
- Work No. 5.—The widening and improvement of Cemetery-road on the north-east side thereof, commencing at a point 19 yards distant, measured in a south-easterly direction from the junction of Club-street with Cemetery-road, and extending in a northwesterly direction for a distance of 151 yards or thereabouts.
- Work No. 6.—The widening and improvement of Little Horton-lane on the southern side thereof, commencing at the junction of Thornton-lane with Little Horton-lane, and extending in a westerly direction for a distance of 87 yards or thereabouts.
- tance of 87 yards or thereabouts. Work No. 7.—The widening and improvement of Park-lane on the south-east side thereof, commencing at a ^Point 40 yards or thereabouts, measured in a south-westerly direction from the south-western corner of Pakington-street, and extending in a southwesterly direction for a distance of 76 yards or thereabouts.
- Work No. 8.—The widening and improvement of Park-lane on the north-west side thereof, commencing at the junction of Park-lane with Holme Top-lane, and extending in a northerly direction for a distance of 27 yards or thereabouts.
- Work No. 9.—The widening and improvement of Clayton-road on the north-west side thereof, commencing at the junction of Cemetery-road and Clayton-road, and extending in a south-westerly direction for a distance of 150 yards or thereabouts: And also at a point commencing 143 yards or thereabouts measured in a south-westerly direction from the south-western corner of Saint George's Mission Churchyard, and extending thence in a south-westerly direction for a distance of 242 yards or thereabouts.

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- distance of 242 yards or thereabouts. Work No. 10.—The widening and improvement of Clayton-road on the eastern side thereof, commencing^a at a point 24 yards distant, measured in a south-westerly direction from the southern corner of Becksideroad and extending for a distance of 102 yards or thereabouts, measured in a southwesterly direction: And also commencing at a point 220 yards or thereabouts, measured in a south-westerly direction from the termination of the last-named point, and extending in a southerly direction for a distance of 197 yards or thereabouts.
- extending in a southerly direction for a distance of 197 yards or thereabouts. Work No. 11.—The widening and improvement of Great Horton-road, on the southeast side thereof, commencing on the southwest corner of Frank-street, and extending in a south-westerly direction for a distance of 75 yards or thereabouts.
- of 75 yards or thereabouts. Work No. 12.—The widening and improvement of High-street, on the south-east side

thereof, commencing at a point 16 yards distant, measured in a south-westerly direction from the south-western corner of Crabtree-place, and extending in a south-westerly direction for a distance of 225 yards or thereabouts.

- Work No. 13.—The widening and improvement of Southfield-Iane, on the south-west side thereof, commencing at or near the junction of High-street and extending in a south-easterly direction for a distance of 578 yards or thereabouts, measured in a south-easterly direction, and also at a point 16 yards from the junction of Hillam-street, measured in a westerly direction for a distance of 102 yards or thereabouts, measured in a south-easterly directiou, and also at a point 47 yards from the termination of the last-named point, and extending in a south-easterly direction for a distance of 31 yards or thereabouts, measured in a south-easterly direction, to its junction with Little Horton-lane.
- Work No. 14 .-- The widening and improvement of Southfield-lane on the north-east side thereof, commencing at a point 118 yards or thereabouts distant, measured in a north-westerly direction from the western corner of South-street, and extending in a north-westerly direction for a distance of 334 yards or thereabouts, measured in a north-westerly direction; also commencing at a point 38 yards or thereabouts, measured in a north-westerly direction from the ter-mination of the last-named point, and extending 36 yards or thereabouts, measured in a north-westerly direction; and also commencing at a point 22 yards or thereabouts, measured in a south-easterly direction from the south-east corner of Perseverance-lane, and extending in a north-westerly direction for a distance of 204 yards or thereabouts.
- Work No. 15.—The widening and improvement of Listerhills-road, on the southern side thereof, commencing at its junction with Longside-lane, and extending in a westerly direction to and terminating at Saint Andrew's-place at its junction with Listerhills-road.
- Work No. 16.—The widening and improvement of Pollard-lane, on the northern side thereof, commencing at the eastern corner of Westfield-terrace at its junction with Pollard-lane, and extending in a northeasterly direction for a distance of 20 yards, or thereabouts, measured in a north-easterly direction.
- Work No. 17.—The widening and improvement of Allerton-road, on the northern side thereof, commencing at the western corner of Squire-lane, and extending in a westerly direction for a distance of 27 yards, or thereabouts, measured in a westerly direction.
- Work No. 18.—The widening and improvement of Rooley-lane, on the southern side thereof, commencing at its junction with Wakefield-road, and extending in a southwesterly direction for a distance of 40 yards, or thereabouts, measured in a south-westerly direction.
- Work No. 19.—The widening and improvement of Little Horton-lane, commencing at its junction with Southfield-lane, and extending thence on both sides thereof in a south-westerly direction to Haycliffe-lane.
- south-westerly direction to Haycliffe-lane. Work No. 20.—The widening and improvement of Leeds-road, on the northern side thereof, commencing at its junction with

Harris-street, and extending in an easterly direction to the western corner of Richardstreet. Also on the northern side thereof, commencing at its junction with Edderthorpe-street, and extending in a westerly direction for a distance of 4 yards or thereabouts. Also on the northern side thereof. commencing at a point 20 yards distant, measured in an easterly direction from the eastern corner of Edderthorpe-street, and extending in an easterly direction for a distance of 39 yards or there abouts. Also on the northern side Also on thereof, being so much of the frontage of the Holy Trinity Church as is co-extensive with Leeds-road aforesaid: And also on the northern side thereof, commencing at a point 24 yards distant measured in a westerly direction from the western corner of Gladstone-street, and extending in a westerly direction for a distance of 44 yards or thereabouts.

Work No. 21.—The improvement of Saltstreet by the removal of the wall across that portion of the street being distant 154 yards from the northern side of Fraserstreet: And also by the removal of another wall across that portion of the street being distant 14 yards from the lastmentioned wall measured in a northerly direction.

And also to authorise the Corporation to make and maintain the following street works (that is to say):---

- Work No. 22.—The making, in the said parish of Bradford, and in the parish of North Bierley, of a new road from Lemonstreet, in the city, to Brownroyd Hill Top, in the said parish of North Bierley.
- Work No. 23.—The widening and improvement, wholly in the said parish of North Bierley, of Brownroyd Hill-road, on the southeastern side thereof, commencing at the termination of the last-mentioned intended new road, and extending in a south-westerly direction to Fair-road.

17. To authorise the Corporation in connection with the said proposed tramways and street works, to make and maintain all necessary approaches, retaining walls, piers, abutments, embankments, girders, cantilevers, brackets, bridges, arches, sewers, drains, goits, culverts, excavations, and other works and conveniences.

18. To authorise the Corporation to deviate in the construction of the said tramways and street works, both vertically and laterally to the extent shown on the deposited plans and sections, or to be defined by the Bill or prescribed by Parliament.

19. To enable the Corporation for all or any of the purposes of their existing Acts and of the Bill, to appropriate and use any lands for the time being belonging to them, and to purchase or otherwise acquire compulsorily or by agree-ment, and to hold lands (including in that expression where used in this Notice, houses, buildings, easements and other property) and the Bill will extinguish all rights of way over, and will empower the Corporation to stop up and extinguish all rights over, and appropriate the sites of so much of any streets, roads, and footpaths as will become unnecessary by reason of any of the said works, or as are shown on the deposited plans as intended to be stopped up or diverted, or as are included within the limits of the lands shown on the deposited plans as intended to be taken compulsorily under the powers of the Bill, and which shall be so taken, and whensoever the Corporation shall have

acquired any lands or houses on both sides of any such street, road, or footpath shown on the deposited plans, and described in the deposited books of reference, the Bill will empower the Corporation to stop up and extinguish all rights over, and appropriate the site and soil of so much of such street, road, or footway as is coterminous with the lands or houses so acquired, and the Bill will or may seek power to enable the Corporation to purchase compulsorily easements without purchasing the land over which such easements would be authorised.

20. To exempt the Corporation from the provisions of Section 92 of the Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845, in respect of all or some of the properties to be acquired by the Corporation under the powers, and for the purposes of the Bill.

21. To authorise and provide for the underpinning or otherwise securing or strengthening of any houses or buildings which may be rendered insecure or affected by the said intended street works, and which houses and buildings may not be required to be taken for the purposes thereof. 22. To empower the Corporation to sell, lease,

22. To empower the Corporation to sell, lease, exchange, and dispose of surplus lands for the time being belonging to them.

being belonging to them. 23. To empower the Corporation to make in any streets, roads, footways, and thorough-fares all such alterations of levels and width of roadway and footway as may be expedient for or in connection with the construction of the said tramways and street works, and for making convenient accesses from, or junctions with, the proposed street works, and to stop up, alter, divert, and interfere with, either permanently or temporarily (and if permanently, to appro-priate the site and soil of, and to extinguish all rights of way over), and to cross over, under, or upon all such streets, highways, bridges, thoroughfares, railways, tramways, rivers, navigations, canals, streams, brooks, watercourses, sewers, drains, gas and water and other pipes, and telegraphic, telephonic and electric ap-paratus as it may be necessary or convenient to stop up, alter, divert, interfere with or cross for any of the purposes of the Bill, and to extinguish all rights of way, manorial, commonable and other rights in, over, or upon any lands to be acquired under or by virtue of the powers of the Bill.

24. To alter, repeal, and amend so much of Section 58 of the Bradford Corporation Tramways and Improvement Act, 1897, as requires the Corporation to widen the footpath leading from the towing-path of the Bradford Canal to St. John-street, in the urban district of Shipley, and in lieu thereof to enable the Corporation to contribute to the construction, by the Urban District Council of Shipley, of a footbridge in the lieu of the said footpath.

25. To transfer to or provide for the transfer to the Corporation of The Bradford Technical College and all lands, buildings, easements, furniture, fittings, and property belonging to the Trustees and Governors thereof, or in any way appurtenant to the said College to be held by the Corporation for the purposes of technical instruction, and to dissolve the Governors of the Bradford Technical College, registered, and to annul the trust deed bearing date the 3rd day of May, 1881, and any subsequent amendments thereof.

26. To provide for the transfer to and vesting in the Corporation of the mains, service pipes, and gas appliances of the Clayton, Allerton and Thornton Gas Company, the Pudsey Coal Gas Company and the Shipley Gas Light Company or

any one or more of those Companies (so far as the same are laid within the City), for such considerations and upon such terms and conditions as may be agreed on between the Corporation and such Companies or Company, or as in default of agreement shall be settled by arbitration under the provisions of the Public Health Act, 1875, and to extend the limits of the Corporation for the supply of gas so as to include all or any part or parts of the City not now within those limits, and to make applicable to the extended limits the provisions or some of the provisions of the Bradford Gas and Improvement Act, 1871, subject to such alterations and modifications as may be contained in the Bill, and the Bill will provide that the Corporation if they purchase the said mains, service pipes, and gas appliances, from any of the said Companies shall not charge more for gas supplied in the area within the City which is now within the g as limits of such Company than is for the time being charged by the Corporation within their gas limits as fixed by the said Act.

27. To empower the Corporation to acquire by agreement all the estate, rights, powers, privileges, authorities, and interest of the Lord of the Manor of Baildon, In, on, under, and over Baildon Moor, Bracken Hall Green, otherwise Shipley Glen, Baildon Green, and Baildon Bank, and all other common lands and open spaces (all which are hereinafter included under the expression The Moor) in the parish of Baildon, in the urban district of Baildon, belonging or reputed to belong to or forming or reputed to form part of the said manor, for such consideration upon such terms and conditions as are contained in an agreement, expressed to be made

between William Wade Maude (Lord of the Manor of Baildon) of the one part and the Corporation of the other part, and bearing date the 9th day of August, 1898, or as may be contained in the Bill or prescribed by Parliament, and to confirm and if thought fit to alter and vary the provisions of that agreement, or to make further and other provisions in relation to such acquisition.

28. To empower the Corporation to set apart a portion of the Moor not exceeding 50 acres for the exclusive use and benefit of the said Lord of the Manor, freed and discharged from all rights of the Corporation as transferees of the Moor, and of all rights of common, rights of way, and other rights therein, thereover, or thereunder, and to make provision with respect to the getting of stone by the said Lord during certain limited periods, and to empower the Corporation to sell the fee simple of a further portion of the Moor not exceeding 50 acres free from all manorial rights, rights of common, rights of way, and other rights.

other rights. 29. To make provision for the extinguishment of all rights of common, rights of way, rights of digging, and other rights, public or private, in, on, under, and over the Moor, or any part or parts thereof, the appointment of constables for the preservation of law and order on the Moor and the approaches thereto, and the punishment of offenders, and to constitute the Moor a public place within the meaning of the Vagrancy Acts, and a street for the purposes of the Towns Police Clauses Act, 1847.

The following are the particulars of the Moor proposed to be acquired and being or reputed to be common or commonable lands :---

30. To empower the Corporation to prescribe and set apart portions of the Moor whereon alone particular games and sports may be played and meetings and assemblies held, and to fence off those portions, or any of them, and to close the same and charge for admission thereto.

31. To empower the Corporation to lay out, plant, fence, and improve the Moor or any part or parts thereof, and therein, and thereon, to construct and maintain roads, footways, and ornamental waters, and to construct, place, erect, and maintain conservatories, refreshment and other rooms, bandstands, shelters and lavatories, and to furnish and equip the same and to charge for the use thereof, and of seats provided by them.

32. To empower the Corporation from time to time to make and enforce by-laws and regulations for regulating the use of the Moor, or any part or parts thereof, and any enclosed spaces, roads, and footpaths therein, the rights of common thereover (so far as the same are not extinguished under or by means of the powers of the intended Act), the playing of games for excluding therefrom vagrants, beggars, and disorderly persons, and generally for preventing obstruction and nuisances therein, and injury to and disfigurement of the Moor and any trees, No. 27024. shrubs, buildings, seats, and property of the Corporation, and annoyance to persons frequenting the same.

33. To authorise the Corporation to provide, let for hire, sell, fix, set up, alter, repair, and remove electric fittings (including in that expression meters, lamps, electric lines, motors, fittings, apparatus, and appliances for the supply, distribution, and use of electric energy for all purposes for which the same can be used), and to do all work, and provide all materials requisite for the said purposes, and to make and recover charges for and in relation thereto, and to provide for the security, return, and removal of electric fittings let on hire by the Corporation.

34. To authorise the Corporation from time to time to make and levy additional or increased rates for all or any of the purposes of the Bill, and to confer, vary, and extinguish exemptions from the payment of any existing or future rates.

35. To alter and enlarge the present borrowing powers of the Corporation, and to enable them for all or any of the purposes of the Bill to apply their Corporate Funds and any moneys which they are already authorised to borrow, and to borrow further moneys by mortgage stock or annuities, and to charge such moneys upon all or any one or more of the following securities (that is to say) :--The City Fund and City Rate, the General Rate, the District Fund and General District Rate, lands, tenements, hereditaments, markets, and other undertakings and property, and the rates, rents, tolls, and revenues of the Corporation, whether as a Municipal Corporation or Urban Sanitary Authonity, and to make provision for paying off moneys to be borrowed by the Corporation.

36. To authorise the Corporation and any local authorities, bodies, companies, and persons for all or any of the purposes of or incidental to the objects of the Bill to enter into and fulfil agreements and contracts, and the Bill will or may confirm with or without alteration any such agreements and contracts which may have been, or which during the progress of the Bill may be entered into, and to enable any such local authorities, bodies, companies, and persons, to expend their funds, rates, and revenues, and to borrow moneys on the security thereof.

37. The Bill will or may enable the Corporation to carry the provisions of the Bill into effect with all or any of the powers of the Public Health, Local Government, Sanitary and Municipal Corporations Acts, with such modifications as may be contained in the Bill, and to make and enforce by-laws and regulations for all or any of the purposes of the Bill, to which they may deem by-laws and regulations applicable.

38. The Bill will, so far as it may be deemed necessary or expedient, vary and extend, or repeal, alter, and consolidate the provisions of, among other local and personal Acts, the following (that is to say):-The Bradford Improvement Act, 1850; the Bradford Water-works Act, 1854; the Bradford Corpora-Waterworks Act, 1854; the Bradford Corporation Waterworks Amendment Act, 1855; the Bradford Corporation Waterworks Act, 1858; the Bradford Waterworks Act, 1862; the Bradford Waterworks and Improvement Act, 1868; the Bradford Waterworks Act, 1869; the Bradford Improvement Act, 1873; the Bradford Waterworks and Improvement Act, 1875; the Bradford Water and Improvement Act, 1878; the Bradford Water and Improvement Act, 1881; the Bradford Waterworks and Improve-(Various Powers) Act, 1887; the Bradford Corporation (Various Powers) Act, 1887; the Bradford Corporation Water Act, 1890; the Bradford Corporation Water Act, 1892; the Brad-ford Tramways and Improvement Act, 1897; and all Acts, Orders, and Resolutions directly or indirectly relating to or affecting the Corporation or the City, 27 and 28 Vict., cap. xxx, 18 and 19 Vict., cap. i, 16 and 17 Vict., cap. xliii, and every other Act which relates, directly or in-directly to the Clayton, Allerton, and Thornton Gas Company, the Pudsey Coal Gas Company, and the Shipley Gas Light Company respectively or their respective undertakings, and will or may incorporate with itself in extenso, or by reference, and with or without alteration, the provisions, or some of the provisions of the various Acts in this Notice referred to, and of the Local Loans Acts, 1875 and 1885; the Commissioners Clause Act, 1847; the Towns Police Clauses Act, 1847; the Gasworks Clauses Acts, 1847 and 1871; the Lands Clauses Acts; the Railways Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845; the Tramways Act, 1870; the Light Railways Act, 1896; and the Electric Lighting Acts, 1882 and 1888; and the Bill will vary and extinguish all rights and

privileges which would interfere with any of its objects, and confer other rights and privileges.
