tories, rooms, buildings, conveniences, pleasure or recreation grounds, games, chairs, and seats, if the Council think fit, and to make bye-laws or other provision for the preservation of order and the regulation and good management of and public safety in such pleasure and recreation grounds. To purchase other lands by agreement, and to use, hold, and appropriate the same as pleasure and recreation grounds.

To authorise the Council to pay or contribute towards the payment of a public band of music, and also the cost of advertising, displaying, or otherwise making known the attractions and advantages of the district as a pleasure and health resort, and also to pay or contribute towards the cost of publishing and circulating pamphlets and other publications for the like purposes.

To exempt the Council from the operation of Section 92 of the Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845 (so as to enable them to purchase compulsorily parts only of certain properties), and from the provisions of that Act in respect to the sale of superfluous lands.

To authorise the Council to borrow money for all or any of the purposes of the Bill, including :---

(1.) The purchase, maintenance, and extension of the gas undertaking and the lands to be acquired therefor.

(2.) The construction and maintenance of sewage works and the purchase of the lands required therefor.

- (3.) The erection, equipment, maintenance, and enlargement of an isolation hospital, and the purchase of the lands required therefor.
- (4.) The purchase, maintenance, and extension of the wharf aforesaid, the purchase and maintenance of the Recreation Ground and premises hereinbefore referred to, and for the following purposes, or some of them (that is to say) :---

The construction of groynes, the making of street improvements, and the crection of public offices and buildings, and the acquisition of any lands for any of such purposes, and to charge the same on the General District Rate or any other rate or rates levied or leviable within their district, and the undertakings, estates, rates, revenues and other property of the Council or on any of such securities, and to authorise the granting and issue of mortgages, debentures, debenture stock and annuities in respect thereof.

To provide that the restrictions contained in Section 234 of the Public Health Act, 1875, as to the borrowing of moneys shall not apply to any moneys which the Council may be empowered to borrow under the intended Act.

To vary or extinguish all existing rights and privileges which would or might in any way prevent or interfere with or delay the accomplishment of any of the objects of the Bill, and to confer other rights and privileges.

To incorporate with the Bill and to confer upon the Council with or without alteration all or some of the provisions and powers of the Lands Clauses Acts, the Gasworks Clauses Acts, 1847 and 1871, the Public Health Acts, 1875 and 1890, the Local Loans Act, 1875, the Public Works Loans Act, 1875, the Arbitration Act, 1889, the Private Street Works Act, 1892, the Isolation Hospitals Act, 1893, and any Acts amending the same.
