Stockport District Waterworks Company. (Confirmation of Agreements with Corporation of Manchester; Amendment of Acts, &c.)

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the next Session for an Act for all or some of the following purposes, that is to say:—

To confirm, ratify, and make binding the following agreements, that is to say:—

1. The Agreement dated the 17th day of March, 1859, and made between the Mayor, Aldermen, and Citizens of the city of Manchester (in this Notice called "the Manchester Corporation") of the one part, and the Stockport Waterworks Company (now amalgamated with the Stockport District Waterworks Company) of the other part.

2. The Agreements dated respectively the 9th day of October, 1877, and the 15th day of February, 1897, between the Manchester Corporation of the one part, and the Stockport District Waterworks Company (in this Notice called "the Company") of the other part, and to enact that the provisions of the said three

several agreements may be exercised, enjoyed, and enforced by the Manchester Corporation and the Company respectively and their successors.

To amend, vary, or repeal all or any of the provisions of the Stockport District Waterworks Act, 1861, the Stockport District Waterworks Act, 1863, and the Stockport District Waterworks Act, 1864, which may be necessary or expedient in that behalf.

To make provision for the costs of the intended Act, and to vary or extinguish any rights or privileges which would in any manner interfere with the objects and purposes of the intended Act, and to confer other rights and privileges.

Printed copies of the intended Act will, on or before the 21st day of December, 1898, be deposited in the Private Bill Office of the House of Commons.
