To vary or extinguish all rights and privileges inconsistent with, or which would or might in any way interfere with the objects of the Bill, and to confer other rights and

privileges.

And it is intended so far as may be necessary for any of the purposes of the Bill to amend or repeal the provisions or some of the provisions of the Acts following (that is to say): the Burley Local Board Waterworks Act, 1873, and any other Act or Acts relating to the Council.

And notice is hereby also given, that on or before the 30th day of November instant, plans and sections of the works intended to be authorised by the Bill showing the lines and levels thereof, and showing also the lands intended to be taken compulsorily under the powers of the Bill, with a book of reference to such plans and a copy of this Notice as published in the London Gazette, will be deposited for public inspection with the Clerk of the Peace for the West Riding of the county of York, at his office, at the County Hall, Wakefield, and with the clerk of the Burley-in-Wharfedale Urban District Council, at his office, Royal Oak Chambers, Otley, aforesaid.

intended to be made to Parliament in the ensuing Session by the Mayor, Aldermen, and Citizens of the city of Liverpool (hereinafter called "the Corporation") for an Act for all or some of the following purposes (that is to say):—

1. To empower the Corporation to execute the street widenings and improvements hereinafter described, all in the city and county borough of Liverpool, in the county of Lancaster (that is

to say):-

In the parish of Liverpoo'.

To widen Scotland-road, on the west side thereof, between Bevington Bush and Bevington Hill.

In the parish or extra-parochial place of Toxteth Park,

To widen Park-road, on the east side thereof, between North Hill-street and Ellis-place. In the parish of Liverpool.

To widen Vauxhall-road, on the east side thereof, between Freemason's-row and Marybone.

2. To empower the Corporation to acquire by compulsion or agreement, and to hold lands, houses, buildings, and hereditaments in the before mentioned parishes for the purposes of

the said street widenings and other works and purposes connected therewith.

3. To empower the Corporation to purchase so much of any property as may be required for any of the purposes of the intended Act, without being subject to the liability imposed by the 92nd section of the Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845, and to exempt the Corporation from the provisions of the last-mentioned Act as to the sale of superfluous lands, and to authorise the Corporation to hold, let, lease, or sell, as they may think fit, any superfluous lands.

4. To empower the Corporation to alter or otherwise interfere with, temporarily or permanently, the lines and levels of, or to stop up, appropriate, and extinguish all rights of way over the whole or parts of any streets, lanes, courts, alleys, or places within the said city, which it may be necessary or convenient to alter or otherwise interfere with, or stop up, appropriate, or extinguish rights of way over, or which would in any manner impede or interfere with the several objects and purposes of the intended Act or any of them.

5. To empower the Corporation to stop up, appropriate, alter or divert, temporarily or permanently, all canals, bridges, sewers, watermains, pipes, tramway lines, and tramway, telegraph, telephone, and other electrical wires, tubes, and apparatus within the said city, which it may be necessary or convenient to stop up, alter, or divert in the execution or for the pur-

poses of the intended Act.

6. To alter, vary, or extinguish all existing rights and privileges connected with the lands, houses, and property to be purchased or taken under the authority of the said Act, or which would in any manner impede or interfere with the several objects and purposes of the intended Act or any of them, and to confer other rights and privileges.

To extend, alter, and enlarge the provisions contained in Part VI (Superannuation Allowance to Officers of Corporation) of the Liverpool Improvement Act, 1882, and in particular to adapt, extend, and make applicable those provisions to officers and servants who have entered or may enter the service of the Corporation since the passing of the said Act, and to widows and families of officers and servants, with or without modification.

8. To amend the Liverpool Library and Museum Act, 1852, with reference to the amount which the Corporation are by that Act authorised to levy by means of the Library and Museum Rate in that Act mentioned, and to authorise the borrowing of money for the purposes of that Act and the Acts amending the same, and to increase the said rate, and to amend the provisions of the said Act with reference to the borrowing and repayment of the moneys borrowed or to be borrowed under the powers of that Act, and to extend the period for such repayment.

9. To alter and amend the provisions of the Local Act 6 and 7 Vict., cap. 109, for the better protection of property in the borough of Liverpool from fire, in respect of warehousemen's licences, and to make provision for re-
