variations, and exceptions as may be provided for by the Bill, and to repeal or render inapplicable all or some of the enactments, bye-laws, rules, and regulations now in force within the added areas, and to exempt the added areas from all or some of the debts and liabilities now applicable thereto.

17. To continue in office the Town Clerk and all other officers and servants of the Corporation in respect of the extended borough, and to continue the auditors of the existing borough

auditors of the extended borough.

18. To extend the jurisdiction, power, authorities, rights, privileges, and duties of the Corporation to and throughout the extended borough, and to make all necessary or consequential alterations in the School Attendance Committee of the Borough and School Board, School Attendance Committee, or other school authority of the adjoining districts, and in other respects to make all necessary and proper provisions for the purposes of the Elementary Education Acts.

19. To separate the added areas from the districts of the Whitehaven Rural District Council School, Highway, and Burial Boards, School Attendance, and Local Committees, parochial committees, overseers, and other local authorities, bodies, and officers having jurisdiction in such added areas, and from the parishes or townships of Moresby, Preston Quarter, Hensingham, Hensingham and Low Keekle, and Saint Bees respectively (or so much of the areas as are within the said districts and parishes or townships), and to make such alteration in the boundaries of such districts and parishes or townships as may be necessary or expedient, and to provide for an adjustment of the property, debts, and liabilities between the authorities affected.

20. To exempt from the payment of highway and all other rates all lands, houses, and pro-

perty within the added areas.

21. To provide that prior to the inclusion within the borough of any part of the township of Preston Quarter the Guardians of the Poor of the Whitehaven Union and the Whitehaven Rural District Council, or one of those bodies, shall properly sewer, drain, and connect the sewers of the said workhouse with the sewerage system of the borough, or to make such other provision with reference thereto as the Bill may contain, or as the Corporation and the bodies aforesaid, or any of them, may agree upon or as Parliament may impose, and to confirm any agreements or arrangements with reference thereto.

22. To extend the benefit of all the property, powers, rights, and privileges of the Corporation, or some part or parts thereof, to the extended borough, and also to extend their liabilities or some part or parts thereof to the

extended borough.

Electric Lighting.

23. To extend the area of supply under the Whitehaven Electric Lighting Order, 1891, so as to include the whole of the existing or extended borough.

Generally.

24. To confer upon the Corporation all or some of the rights, powers, privileges, duties, and liabilities of overseers, and the powers, duties, and liabilities of a parish council, and to constitute the Corporation the rating authority for all purposes within the borough, and the collectors of all rates leviable in or in respect of the borough, and to abolish the office

compensation to any person injuriously affected under the before mentioned provisions, and the Bill will or may authorise and require the Guardians of the Poor of the Whitehaven Union to issue to the Corporation a precept to pay out of their borough fund and borough rate the amount of the poor rate payable in respect of the borough, and will in such case confer all necessary powers on the Corporation accordingly.

25. To make further and better provision in regard to the making, levying, collection, and recovery of rates, and to empower the Corporation to consolidate all rates leviable in or in respect of the borough (including the poor rate, borough rate, county rate, general district rate, water rate, and charges, and all other rates), for the purpose of collection at one and the same time and the manner in which this shall be done, and to provide that such rates may be collected and levied by instalments or other-

wise.

26. To repeal, alter, and vary all or any of the existing tolls, rates, duties, dues, and charges, now authorised to be taken by the Corporation, to confer, vary, or extinguish exemptions from payment of tolls, rates, rents, dues, duties, and charges, and to alter the tolls, rates, dues, and duties now authorised to be taken and levied by the Corporation, and to levy and take new tolls, rates, dues, duties, and charges in lieu of any tolls, rates, dues, duties or charges.

27. To provide for payment of the expenses of and incident to the promotion of the Bill out of the funds and revenues belonging to the Corporation, or in such manner as shall be pre-

scribed by the Bill.

28. To enable the Corporation to apply any of their corporate funds towards the proposed waterworks and other purposes of the Bill, and to borrow additional moneys for those purposes respectively, or any of them, and for any of the purposes of the Acts hereinafter mentioned, or the purposes of the Bill, on mortgage or by debenture stock or terminable or perpetual annuities, or to create and issue stock in respect thereof on the security of their several undertakings respectively, the district fund and rates, the borough fund and rate, the water rate, and of the tolls, rates, dues and charges leviable by them, and of their revenues as shall be provided by the Bill, and to enable the Corporation to sell or otherwise dispose of, or to exchange, or to mortgage any of their lands, houses or buildings, and to enable them to apply the moneys thereby obtained for the purposes of the said Acts or any of them, or for the purposes of the Bill as may be prescribed by the Bill, and if thought fit, to alter the provisions now in force as to the repayment of moneys now owing.
29. The Bill will confer on the Corporation

all such other powers, rights, authorities, and privileges which are or may become necessary or useful for carrying the objects of the Bill into execution, to vary and extinguish all rights and privileges inconsistent with or which would in any manner impede or interfere with the carrying into complete effect any of the objects and purposes of the Bill, and to confer other rights

and privileges.

30. To incorporate in the Bill and to make applicable to its purposes all or some of the powers and provisions of the following Acts (that is to say):—The Railways Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845; the Lands Clauses Acts; the Municipal Corporation Acts; the Local of collectors of poor rates therein, and to make Loans Act, 1875; the Public Health Acts; the
