

effecting junctions with the existing tramways of the Corporation.

13. To empower the Corporation to take up and remove the proposed tramway after it has been laid, and to relay the same in some other part of the street, road, or place, and to lay down double lines of rail in lieu of single, or single in lieu of double lines.

14. To apply all or some of the provisions of the Acts and Orders relating to the existing tramways of the Corporation to the proposed tramway, to authorise animals, goods, minerals, and parcels to be carried on the proposed tramway, to constitute the proposed tramway and tramway powers part of the tramway undertaking of the Corporation, to levy and take tolls, rates, and charges, and to alter the authorised tolls, rates, and charges in respect of the existing tramways.

15. To empower the Bradford and Leeds Light Railway Company, if and when incorporated, to sell or lease to the Corporation, and to empower the Corporation to purchase or take on lease and to work all or part of the light railway authorised or about to be authorised by an Order of the Light Railway Commissioners called or intended to be called the Bradford and Leeds Light Railway Order, 1898, and to authorise running powers and traffic and other arrangements between the said bodies and the division of tolls and charges in respect thereof.

Miscellaneous and General.

16. To empower the Corporation to deviate laterally and vertically from the lines and levels of the intended works (other than tramways) shown on the deposited plans hereinafter mentioned, to the extent to be shown on the said plans or to be defined in the intended Act.

17. To empower the Corporation, for any of the purposes of the intended Act, to break up, cross, alter, divert, stop up, raise, lower, and interfere with, either temporarily or permanently, any streets, roads, passages, highways, bridges, canals, railways, tramway, sewers, drains, streams, watercourses, and telegraphic, telephonic, and other electric wires, conductors, and pipes. The streets, roads, passages, and highways proposed to be permanently stopped up include the following:—Garland-fold, Dew-lane, Steander Bow, Bullough-square, Timber-place, Back Timber-place, Timber-terrace, Atlas-terrace, East Queen-street, Smithies-street, Peacock-court, Zion-row, Back Bow-street, Smithies-place, Smithies-Garth Spitalfields, Sugden's-place, Low Close-place, Lovington-street, Cherry-court, Richard-street, Back Greenwood-street, Greenwood-street, Wales-street, Cryer's-yard, Shutes-yard, Dawsons-court, Dawsons-yard, Chambers-yard, Back George-street, Ebenezer-street, Harewood Arms-yard, Union-street, and the three streets leading from Back George-street to Union-street and Back Virginia-street.

18. In connection with the street works proposed to be authorised to empower the Corporation to make junctions and communications with and widen and alter existing streets, and to alter, divert, or stop up all or any drains, sewers, or channels.

19. To empower the Corporation for the purposes of the proposed works, and for other the purposes of the intended Act, to appropriate or to purchase or acquire by compulsion or agreement, or take on lease any lands, houses, or buildings in the parishes, townships, city, and riding aforesaid, and to acquire by compulsion or agreement rights or easements in, over, or

connected with any lands, houses, or buildings.

20. To authorise the Corporation to hold any lands which they may acquire under the authority of the intended Act free from the provisions of the Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845, with respect to superfluous lands, and to exempt the Corporation from the operation of Section 92 of the Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845, so as to enable them to purchase compulsorily part only of certain properties.

21. To authorise the Corporation to appropriate and lay out for building purposes portions of any lands to be acquired or appropriated by them under the powers of the intended Act, and to sell or exchange or otherwise dispose of and grant building and other leases, and to let for building purposes all or any lands, buildings, or hereditaments for the time being belonging to them, and to sell and dispose of such annual rents and the reversion of any land or building, and to extend the powers of the Corporation with respect to the holding, retaining, or disposing of lands.

22. To require new houses and buildings, and houses and buildings about to be erected, to be provided with water-closets or such other like conveniences as the Corporation may direct, to amend Section 58 of the Leeds Improvement Act, 1866, so as to make it apply to new houses and buildings, and houses and buildings about to be erected, and in other respects to make better provision in regard to sanitary conveniences.

23. To empower the Corporation to purchase, provide, regulate, and manage swimming, Turkish, and other baths; to empower the Corporation to take charges in respect of the baths for the time being belonging to them in excess of the charges authorised by the Baths and Washhouses Acts, 1846 to 1882, and to alter or amend those Acts in regard to their application to the city.

24. To make better provision for the purchase and acquisition of land for the interment of the dead either within or beyond the city, and to extend, alter, or amend the local Acts relating to burial grounds in or near the city, and particularly to amend Section 21 of the Local Act 5 and 6 Vict., cap. 103, so as to reduce the limit of 300 yards to 100 yards as the distance from any part of a burial ground to any house.

25. To empower the Medical Officer of Health or other authorised person to enter dairies, byres, and cowsheds within the city or beyond the city if milk produced therein or supplied therefrom is believed to be sent to the city, and to examine the cows and to require the owners or occupiers of such dairies, byres, and cowsheds to render all reasonable assistance, and to prohibit the selling of milk of cows affected with tuberculosis, or any disease which might render the use of such milk dangerous or injurious to health, to provide for the giving of notice to the Corporation in cases of tuberculosis or other disease as aforesaid, and in other respects to make better provision for the prevention of infectious disease, whether within or beyond the city.

26. To prohibit any person from driving or having the care of more than one vehicle drawn by any animal or animals within the city, or from attaching any vehicle drawn by any animal or animals behind any other vehicle, and to impose penalties for any such offence, and provide for the recovery thereof, and to amend the Highway Act, 1835, and the Town Police
