By the QUEEN. A PROCLAMATION.

VICTORIA, R.

THEREAS Our Parliament stands prorogued to Thursday, the eighth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight; We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, hereby issue Our Royal Proclamation, and publish and declare that the said Parliament be further prorogued to Tuesday, the seventh day of February, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine; and We do hereby further, with the advice aforesaid, declare Our Royal will and pleasure that the said Parliament shall, on the said Tuesday, the seventh day of February, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine, assemble and be holden for the despatch of divers urgent and important affairs; and the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgesses, and the Commissioners for Shires and Burghs, of the House of Commons, are hereby required and commanded to give their attendance accordingly, at Westminster, on the said Tuesday, the seventh day of February, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine.

Given at Our Court at Windsor, this twenty-ninth day of November, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight, and in the sixty-second year of Our reign.

W HEREAS in pursuance of "The Bishops' Resignation Act 1869" a representation has been made to Her Majesty by the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Frederick by Divine Providence Lord Archbishop of Canterbury Primate of All England and Metropolitan at the instance of the Right Reverend Daniel Lewis by Divine Permission Lord Bishop of Bangor and as such a Bishop of a diocese within and of the said Province of Canterbury that the said Bishop is desirous of resigning his Bishopric by reason that he is incapacitated by permanent physical infirmity from the due performance of his duties

And whereas Her Majesty is satisfied of such incapacity and that the said Bishop has canonically

resigned.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty by and with the advice of Her Privy Council is pleased to declare and it is hereby declared that the said Bishopric of Bangor is vacant and Her Majesty by and with the like advice is pleased to direct and it is hereby directed that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Bangor.

WHEREAS by Orders made by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council on the twelfth day of February one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six and the seventeenth day of November one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, was pleased to make regulations respecting the Lower (now Second) Division of Her Majesty's Civil Service;

And whereas by subsequent Orders in Council. of which the latest is that of the twenty-first March one thousand eight hundred and ninety, the two first-mentioned Orders in Council have been amended and, as regards some of their pro-

visions, repealed;
And whereas it is expedient wholly to repea the said Orders in Council of the twelfth February one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six and seventeenth November one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, and to re-enact, with amendments, such of their provisions as are now

And whereas it appears desirable to make certain further regulations applicable to all persons in the established Civil Service of the State;

Now therefore Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :-

PART I.—Second Division.

· 1. On and after the date of this Order the said Orders in Council of twelfth February one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six seventeenth November one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight shall be and the same are hereby repealed, and this Order shall be substi-

tuted for them.

2. The Second Division of the Civil Service constituted by the said Order in Council of twelfth February one thousand eight hundred and seventysix, as amended by the said Order in Council of twenty-first March one thousand eight hundred and ninery, shall continue and shall consist of Clerks engaged to serve in any department of the Civil Service to which they may from time to time be appointed or transferred.

3. No department of the Civil Service shall be permanently increased or regulated afresh without provision being made that such of its duties as are of a suitable character shall be performed by Members of the Second Division or other officers

of a rank below that Division.

- 4. No vacancies shall be filled nor any new appointments made in any department, except by appointing Clerks of the Second Division, or other officers of a rank below that Division, until the Commissioners of the Treasury have been satisfied that the number of officers serving in such department with salaries higher than those of the Second Division will not be excessive.
- 5. The Civil Service Commissioners shall at fixed intervals, or whenever they may, with the previous approval of the Treasury, decide it to be necessary, hold competitive examinations for Clerkships of the Second Division in such subjects, and under such regulations as to limits of age and otherwise, as the Civil Service Commissioners, with the approval of the Treasury, may from time to time prescribe.

6. A list of the successful competitors shall be made out, in the order of merit, up to the prescribed number, if so many are found by the Civil Service Commissioners to be qualified for

appointments in the Second Division.

7. From the list made out as aforesaid, the Civil Service Commissioners, on the application of departments having vacancies, may assign, on probation, the requisite Clerks, whether for permanent or temporary duty. Assignments shall, as a general rule, be made by the Civil Service Commissioners according to the order of the names on the list; but they may assign any successful competitor who has shown special qualifications in any particular subject included in the scheme of examination, if special applica-tion for a Clerk so qualified be made by any department; provided that if a successful competitor has at the date of the competition served as a Boy Copyist, Boy Clerk, or Abstractor, for not less than six full months in a department, he may, on the application of the head of that department, be specially assigned to it.

8. Under conditions to be settled by the Civil Service Commissioners and the Treasury, successful competitors will be allowed, within reasonable

limits and when convenient, to select the departments in which they may wish to serve; but the requirements of the public service will take precedence of all other considerations, and any successful competitor refusing to serve in the department to which he is assigned will be finally removed from the list.

9. On a successful competitor being assigned to a situation in a public office, his name shall be

removed from the list.

10. A Clerk shall be regarded as accepted by a department if he has served twelve months in it, and a record has been made by the head of the department that his service has been approved.

A Clerk shall not, except for grave misconduct, be rejected on probation till he has served for at least three months in the department to which he

has been assigned.

If a Clerk is rejected on probation by the department to which he has been assigned, the department shall report to the Civil Service Commissioners the reasons for his rejection; and the Commissioners shall thereupon assign another Clerk in his room, and shall decide whether the rejected Clerk shall be discharged as unfit for the service generally, or whether he shall be reassigned for duty in another department.

In the event of a rejected Clerk being reassigned as aforesaid, the Civil Service Commissioners shall decide whether bis previous service should be reckoned towards increment of If they decide that his service should not be so reckoned, the fact shall be notified by the Commissioners to the Comptroller and

Auditor General.

11. No person appointed to the Second Division on the ground that it was desirable in the interest of the public service to retain him in any particular department shall be made redundant without the consent of the Civil Service Commissioners and the approval of the Treasury. The same consent and approval shall be necessary, except in the case of redundancy, before any person who has become a Clerk of the Second Division after competitive examination or by promotion may be transferred to another department.

Except as aforesaid all redundant clerks may be transferred without reference to their age or

the amount of salary due to them.

12. A Clerk shall not be promoted from the Second to the Higher Division of the Service, or to posts, not classified as Higher Division, but carrying a maximum salary exceeding five hundred pounds a year, or leading in the ordinary course of promotion to posts of which the maximum salary exceeds five hundred pounds a year, without a special certificate from the Civil Service Commissioners, to be granted exceptionally, after not less than eight years' service, upon a special recommendation from the head of the department, and with the assent of the Treasury; and every such promotion, including such recommendation, certificate, and assent, shall be published in the London Gazette, and shall take effect from and after the date of such publication.

Clause 12 of the said Order in Council of the twenty-first March one thousand eight hundred

and ninety is hereby repealed.

13. Boy Clerks already serving shall not be retained as such in any department after completing their twentieth year. No Boy Clerks shall be in future appointed.

Boy Clerks now serving may, after one year of good service, certified in writing by the Heads of their Departments to the Civil Service Commissioners, compete among themselves, at anv examination for Clerkships of the Second Division

held under this Order, for so many Clerkships as shall not exceed one-fourth of the number of Boy Clerks competing among themselves at that examination. The number of Clerkships reserved for such Limited Competition shall be reckoned as part of the prescribed number referred to in Clause 6 of the present Order.

Separate lists shall be made out of the competitors successful in the Limited Competition, and assignments to Clerkships of the Second Division shall (subject to clause 7 of this Order) be made alternately from these lists and from the lists of competitors successful in the Open Competition so far as is possible consistently with the allowance of selection under clause 8 of the present Order.

14. Below the Second Division persons may be employed for copying, routine work under direct supervision, or work inferior to that of Clerks of the Second Division, in accordance with regulations to be from time to time framed by the Civil Service Commissioners and approved by the Treasury and at rates of pay from time to time prescribed by the Treasury.

15. A permanent Civil Servant of a rank below the Second Division may be appointed to that Division on the ground of special merit with a certificate from the Civil Service Commissioners under Clause VII of the Order in Council of the fourth June one thousand eight hundred and seventy. But such certificate shall only be granted exceptionally after not less than six seventy. years' established service, upon a recommenda-tion from the Head of the Department and with the approval of the Treasury. Whenever such an appointment is made, the Treasury may, notwithstanding anything in clause 3 of the said Order in Council of the twenty-first March one thousand eight hundred and ninety, allow the person appointed to enter the scale of the divi-ion at such salary as they shall think fit, not being higher than that which he was receiving at the date of his said appointment; and he shall be allowed the same amount of annual holiday as though his previous established service had been in the Second Division. In the case of a person so appointed before the date of this Order, the Treasury may, if they think fit, increase the salary of which he is now in receipt to an amount not exceeding that of which he would have been in receipt if this Order had been in operation at the date of his appointment.

16. Clause 3 of the said Order in Council of the twenty-first March one thousand eight hundred and ninety shall be read, from and after the date of this Order, as if the words "not less than" were inserted after the words "for a daily attendance of" and before the words "seven hours."

17. Clause 5 of the said Order in Council of the twenty-first March one thousand eight hundred and ninety shall be read as if the word-"approved" were substituted for the words "in all respects satisfactory" in the first paragraph of the clause.

PART II.—GENERAL.

18. The provisions of clause 10 of the Order in Council of the fifteenth August one thousand eight hundred and ninety as to retirement on account of age shall, in future, apply to all persons in the established Civil Service of the State, but, in the case of persons to whom those provisions have not heretofore been applicable, they shall take effect after the expiration of one year from the date of this Order.

19. When a person has been selected for appointment to an office in any department of the Civil Service, and the state of business in that department makes it necessary that he should

enter upon his duties before the issue to him of a certificate by the Civil Service Commissioners, the Treasury may, if they think proper, direct that his salary shall be payable from the date on which he commences the regular discharge of his duties, provided that they are satisfied that the delay in the issue of the certificate is owing to causes wholly beyond his control. If such person is on a scale of salary, the first incremental period of such scale shall be reckoned from the date on which his salary became payable, provided that he shall in the meanwhile have obtained a certificate from the Civil Service Commissioners.

20. An annual increment of salary shall not be allowed to any person in the established Civil Service of the State without a certificate from the immediate superior of such person, countersigned by the Head of the Department, or such officer as he may designate for the purpose, to the effect that such person's conduct has during the year immediately preceding the date of such certificate

been approved.

Provided that, if, at the date when the increment would in ordinary course become due, the Head of the Department is unable to give the certificate, he (the said Head) may withhold the same until the officer shall have completed a continuous period of twelve months' approved service; and the increment shall thereupon become payable from the date of such certificate. If the officer's conduct shall thereafter continue satisfactory, the Head of the Department may, after such interval as he shall consider sufficient, but subject to the approval of the Treasury, increase the salary to an amount not exceeding that at which it would have stood if no increment had been withheld. Every such increase shall be reported to the Comptroller and Auditor-General.

21. Paragraph 3 of the Order in Council of twenty-second March one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine shall be read as if the words "or certificated by the said Commissioners under "clause seven of the Order in Council of fourth "June one thousand eight hundred and seventy" were inserted immediately before the words "as

"those Commissioners."

22. All appointments and promotions with respect to which certificates have been issued by the Civil Service Commissioners and all assignments and transfers of Second Division Clerks shall continue to be published by the Civil Service Commissioners in the number of the London Gazette first issued in each month,

W HEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the sixteenth of September, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight, in the words following, viz. :-

"Whereas by the fourth section of an Act passed in the thirty-third year of Your Majesty's reign, chapter forty-four, entitled 'The Greenwich Hospital Act, 1869,' it is enacted that the Admiralty may, under regulations to be from time to time made by them, send any non-commissioned officers or men admitted to the benefits of Greenwich Hospital to a Naval Hospital or Infirmary to be there maintained at the expense of Greenwich Hospital.

"And whereas by the third section of an Act

passed in the sixty-second year of Your Majesty's reign, chapter twenty-four, entitled 'The Greenwich Hospital Act, 1898,' it is enacted that non-commissioned officers or men may, under section four of 'The Greenwich Hospital Act, 1869,' be sent to any Hospital or Infirmary.

"And whereas we deem it expedient, in consequence of insufficient accommodation at Your Majesty's Naval Hospitals and Infirmaries, that such non-commissioned officers or men be sent when necessary into other than Naval Hospitals or Infirmaries to be there maintained at the

expense of Greenwich Hospital.

"We beg leave to recommend that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction that payment be made from the funds of Greenwich Hospital for such noncommissioned officers or men maintained in other than Naval Hospitals or Infirmaries at such rates and on such other terms and conditions as we may see fit to arrange, and to authorize the application to the men and their families of the same regulations, so far as practicable, as are in force in the case of non-commissioned officers or maintained in Your Majesty's Naval Hospitals and Infirmaries.

"And whereas by Your Majesty's Order in Council of the thirty-first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, which Order in Council was embodied in the regulations for the government of Your Majesty's Naval Service established by Your Order in Council of the fifteenth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, Your Majesty was graciously pleased to approve of special pensions not exceeding 1s. 6d. a day being awarded in lieu of maintenance in a Naval Hospital or Infirmary to non-commissioned officers or men admitted to

the benefits of Greenwich Hospital.

"And whereas by the fourth section of an Act passed in the sixty-second year of Your Majesty's reign, chapter twenty-four, it is enacted that the maximum limit of special Greenwich Hospital pensions shall be extended to £45 12s. 6d. a year

or 2s. 6d. a day.

"We humbly recommend that we be empowered in cases of exceptional need or distress to grant such special pensions in excess of 1s. 6d. a day as shall to us seem fit, but so that the amount received by any non-commissioned officer or man in respect of such special pension shall not together with his existing pension or pensions, if any, exceed the sum of £45 12s. 6d. a year or

2s. 6d. a day.

"And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased by Your Order in Council of the twelfth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, to approve of the expenditure upon special Greenwich Hospital pensions being limited to £20,000 a year, which limit was extended by Your Majesty's Order in Council of the twentieth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, to £22,000 a year.

"And whereas we deem it expedient to provide for an increase of expenditure for special pensions in consequence of the difficulty of obtaining suitable accommodation in Hospitals or Infirmaries

for non-commissioned officers or men.

"We humbly recommend that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to remove the restriction upon the amount that may be expended annually for special pensions."

And whereas the provisions of section one of "The Rules Publication Act, 1893," have been complied with.

Her Majesty, having taken the said Memorial

into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

THEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the fifth and sixth years of Her Majesty chapter one hundred and eight, and of the Act of the twenty-first and twenty-second years of Her Majesty chapter fifty-seven, which Acts are known as "The Ecclesiastical Leasing Acts," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the twenty-eighth day of July, in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight, in the words following, that is to

say:—
"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the fifth and sixth years of Your Majesty chapter one hundred and eight and of the Act of the twenty-first and twenty-second years of Your Majesty chapter fifty-seven which Acts are known as 'The Ecclesiastical Leasing Acts,' have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for making better provision for the cure of souls within the consolidated chapelry of Saint Ambrose, Leyland, a part of which was heretofore comprised within the original limits of the parish of Leyland in the county of Lancaster and in the diocese of Manchester.

"Whereas the annual value of the benefice of Leyland that is to say of the vicarage of the parish of Leyland aforesaid, has been improved under and by virtue of a certain sale of glebe lands belonging to the said vicarage which sale was made under the authority of the said Acts with the concurrence of us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, by the Reverend Octavius de Leyland Baldwin, the present Vicar or Incumbent of the said benefice of Leyland, and which sale took effect as from the date of the deed effecting the same that is to say as from the twenty-seventh day of May one thousand eight hundred and

ninety-seven.

"And whereas the moneys being the proceeds of the said sale have been in accordance with the provisions in that behalf contained in the said Acts invested by us the said Commissioners in the purchase of two thousand and nineteen pounds sixteen shillings and six pence two pounds fifteen shillings per centum Consolidated Stock to be held by us in trust to pay over to the vicar for the time being of the said parish of Leyland the annual interest or dividends from time to time arising or accruing therefrom or thereupon but subject nevertheless to the provisions contained in the said Acts with respect to making a certain portion of the improved value arising to the vicarage of Leyland aforesaid from the said sale payable to us for the benefit of our common fund or for the purpose of making better provision than now exists for the cure of souls within the original limits of the said parish of Leyland.

"And whereas after making payable to or for the benefit of the Incumbent of the consolidated chapelry of Saint Ambrose, Leyland aforesaid such portion as is hereinafter mentioned of the improved value which has arisen as aforesaid to the said vicarage of Leyland from the said sale the average annual income of the said vicarage of Leyland will not be left at a less sum than six hundred pounds.

"And whereas the Reverend Octavius de Leyland Baldwin, the vicar or Incumbent as aforesaid of the said vicarage of Leyland, is desirous that we should submit to Your Majesty in Council the recommendation and proposal hereinaster set forth.

"Now therefore, we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme the sum of four hundred and fifty pounds two pounds fifteen shillings per centum Consolidated Stock forming part of the stock in which the said sum produced by the said sale as aforesaid has been invested by us shall be held by us not for the benefit of the Vicar or Incumbent of the parish of Leyland aforesaid, but for the benefit of the Incumbent of the said consolidated chapelry (or new parish when the same shall have become a new parish) of Saint Ambrose Leyland, and that the annual interest or dividend arising from the said sum of four hundred and fifty pounds two pounds fifteen shillings per centum Consolidated Stock shall be payable and paid by us to or for the benefit of the Incumbent for the time being of the said consolidated chapelry or new parish of Saint Ambrose Leyland, and his successors for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of

Parliament."

And whereas the notice of the foregoing scheme which is required by the hereinbefore mentioned Acts has been given by the said Commissioners to the patron of the said benefice of Leyland and the said patron has not made any objection to the same scheme.

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Manchester.

W HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of Her Majesty, chapter forty-nine; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-five, duly prepared and

laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the twenty-eighth day of July, in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight, in the words following, that is

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the fiftyninth year of His Majesty King George the Third chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of Your Majesty chapter forty-nine, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Your Majesty chapter fiftyfive, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following representation as to the assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church of the Holy Trinity, Cheltenham, situate within the limits of the parish of Cheltenham in the county of colorester and in the diocese of Gloucester.

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church of the Holy Trinity, Cheltenham, situate as aforesaid.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend Charles John, Bishop of the said diocese of Gloucester (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent. that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said parish of Cheltenham which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or vlan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of the Holy Trinity, Cheltenham, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of the Holy Trinity, Cheltenham.'

" And with the like consent of the said Charles John Bishop of the said diocese of Gloucester (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said church of the Holy Trinity, Cheltenham, situate as aforesaid, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being: Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us the said Commissioners to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism or for the registration thereof.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration and to make such Order with respect thereto as to Your Majesty, in Your Royal wisdom, shall seem meet.

"All that part of the parish of Cheltenham in the county of Gloucester and in the diocese of Gloucester which is bounded upon the greater part of the north-west by the new parish of Saint Paul, Cheltenham, upon the north-east by the parish of Prestbury, upon the south-east by the new parish of All Saints, Pittville, all which cures are situate in the county and diocese aforesaid and upon the remaining sides that is to say upon the south-west and upon the remaining part of the north-west by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of All Saints Pittville from the parish of Cheltenham aforesaid at the junction of Winchcomb-street with High-street and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of eight chains or thereabouts to its junction with North-street and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of ten chains and twenty-two feet or thereabouts to its junction with Saint Margaret's-road upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Cheltenham from the new parish of Saint Paul, Cheltenham aforesaid."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Gloucester.

W HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, chapter seventy-seven of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her present Majesty chapter one hundred and thirteen, and of the Act of the thirty-seventh and thirty-eighth years of Her said Majesty chapter sixty-three duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the third day of November, in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England acting in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, chapter seventy-seven, of the Act of the third and fourth years of Your Majesty chapter one hundred and thirteen and of the Act of the thirty-seventh and thirty-eighth years of Your Majesty chapter sixty-three have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme with respect to the two Archdeaconries which are now within the diocese of Hereford, to wit the Archdeaconry of Ludlow, and to the Rural Deaneries comprised within such Archdeaconries.

"Whereas it has been represented to us by the Right Reverend John Bishop of the said diocese of Hereford that the arrangements which are hereinafter recommended and proposed with respect to the said two Archdeaconries of Hereford and of Ludlow, and to certain of the Rural Deaneries therein are desirable and should be carried into effect.

"And whereas by an Order of Your Majesty

in Council bearing date the twenty-fourth day of March in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six and published in the London Gazette on the fourth day of April following, the said Archdeaconry of Ludlow, theretofore called or known as the Archdeaconry of Salop, was given its present name, and certain transfers of territory were made as between the Rural Deanery of Clun, and the Rural Deanery of Ludlow, both within the said Archdeaconry of Ludlow.

"And whereas the said proposed arrangements involve the following changes, that is to say—(1) the transfer of certain parishes or cures or churches to and from the said Archdeaconry of Hereford and the Archdeaconry of Ludlow aforesaid, (2) the creation of one new Rural Deanery by the name of the Rural Deanery of Bishop's Castle in the said Archdeaconry of Ludlow, (3) the renaming of certain Rural Deaneries in the said Archdeaconries of Hereford, and of Ludlow, and (4) the re-arrangement of the areas of certain Rural Deaneries in the said two Archdeaconries.

"And whereas it appears to us to be convenient to set forth in the schedule to this scheme annexed the names of all the parishes cures or churches which under the arrangements hereinafter recommended and proposed will be situate within and will constitute the several Rural Deaneries of the said two Archdeaconries of Hereford and of Ludlow to the intent that so far as legally may be the said schedule may be held to be in the place of and in substitution for the statutory schedule of Rural Deaneries in the said two Archdeaconries prepared under the provisions of the hereinbefore thirdly mentioned Act.

"Now therefore with the consent of the said John Bishop of the said diocese of Hereford (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and affixed his episcopal seal to this scheme) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly recommend and propose that as from the day on which an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme shall be published in the London Gazette and without any assurance in the law other than such duly Gazetted Order, the said Archdeaconry of Hereford and the said Archdeaconry of Ludlow respectively shall comprise and consist of the rural deaneries the names of which are set down in numbered order under the name of each of the said two Archdeaconries respectively in the said Schedule to this scheme annexed, and that the name which in such Schedule is given to any rural deanery shall be the name thereof and that every parish or cure or church the name of which is set down in numbered order in the first column of the said Schedule under the name of the said Archdeaconry of Hereford or under the name of the said Archdeaconry of Ludlow and under the name of any rural deanery in either of the said two Archdeaconries respectively shall belong to and be and form a part of the Archdeaconry and of the rural deanery under the respective names of which it appears as aforesaid and shall be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of the Archdeacon of such Archdeaconry and of the rural dean of such rural deanery respectively and shall not belong to or be or form a part of any other Archdeaconry or rural deanery nor be subject to the jurisdiction or authority of any other Archdeacon

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other matter or thing with respect to the matters aforesaid or any of them under or by virtue of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Your Majesty chapter one hundred and thirteen of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Your Majesty chapter thirty-seven of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Your Majesty chapter one hundred and four and of the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Your Majesty chapter one hundred and twenty-four have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes to be taken partly out of the parish of Conisbrough and partly out of the parish of Mexbrough both in the county of York and in the diocese of York.

"Whereas it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said parish of Conisbrough and of the said parish of Mexbrough which are hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate district in

manner hereinafter set forth.

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed district any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes

of Divine worship.

."And whereas we are satisfied that each of the hereinbefore mentioned parishes is a cure wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof.

"And whereas certain hereditaments and premises situate within the limits of the said parish of Mexbrough have become vested in us under the provisions of and for the purposes of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or of some or one of them and we have in respect of such hereditaments and premises agreed to make and pay out of the common fund created by the firstly hereinbefore mentioned Act to the minister of the district hereinafter recommended to be constituted so soon as a minister shall have been appointed and licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act and to his successors a grant of fifty pounds per annum subject to the formation of the proposed district with an initial endowment of one bundred pounds per annum to be provided from private sources

"And whereas such grant as aforesaid will be made by an instrument to be executed by us under our common seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Your Majesty chapter one

hundred and eleven.

"And whereas by a deed or indenture dated on or about the twenty-eighth day of July in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight and made or expressed to be made under the provisions of the New Parishes Acts 1843 1844 and 1856 or some or one of them between the Denaby and Cadeby Collieries Limited of the one part and us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners of the other part (which said deed or indenture has been enrolled in the Chancery Division of the High Court of Justice) the said Denaby and Cadeby Main Collieries Company Limited grant to the minister of the said proposed district so soon as a minister shall have been duly licensed to such district and to his successors and to the incumbent when such minister shall have

become an incumbent of the new parish of Denaby Main and his successors, a clear yearly rent charge of one hundred pounds per annum such rent charge being charged upon and made payable on the first day of January and on the first day of July in each and every year out of four pieces of land.

"And whereas the said rent charge one hundred pounds per annum has been granted as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) we should recommend and propose to Your Majesty in Council that the whole right of patronage of the said proposed district and of the nomination of the minister thereto or (as the case may be) of the incumbent of the new parish which such district will or may hereafter become should be assigned in the manner hereinafter set forth.

"And whereas the said Denaby and Cadeby Main Collieries Limited have by an instrument dated the nineteenth day of July in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight being under their common seal nominated to us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners the following five persons as the persons to whom they desire that the patronage of the said proposed district should be assigned, viz.:-John Buckingham Pope of of No. L 2 The Albany Piccadilly in the county of Middlesex Esquire Samuel Arthur Peto of Goodnestone Park Dover in the county of Kent, Esquire, John Charles Cuninghame of Craigends, Johnstone, North Britain, Esquire, Henry Chambers of the Dale Conisbrough in the said county of York Esquire and Frederick James Osbaldeston Montagu of Melton Park in the lastnamed county Esquire their heirs and assigns for ever.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend William Dalrymple Archbishop of York (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly recommend and propose that all those portious of the said parish of Mexbrough and of the said parish of Conisbrough which are described in the schedule hereunder written all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme become and be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Denaby Main.'

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them

in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Denaby Main comprising:—
"I. All that portion of the parish of Conisbrough in the county of York and in the diocese of York which is bounded upon the west and upon the north by the parish of Mexbrough in the said county and diocese upon the north-east by the parish of Sprotbrough in the said county and diocese and upon the remaining sides that is to say upon the south-east and upon the south by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Sprotbrough from the parish of Conisbrough aforesaid at the centre of the bridge distant eighteen chains or thereabouts cast of Conisbrough Railway Station which carries the Barnsley to Barnetby line of the Great Central Railway over the River Don and extending thence south-westward and in a straight line for a distance of one chain or thereabouts to a point upon the right bank of the said river at the beginning of the footpath or lane which leads past the south-eastern side of the premises of the Great Central Railway Engineering Works and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the said footpath or lane for a distance of thirteen chains or thereabouts (thereby crossing Low-road) to the junction of such footpath or lane with Station-road and extending thence westward and in a straight line for a distance of twenty-nine chains or thereabouts (thereby passing to the scuth of North Cliff Quarry) to the point where Earnshaw's-lane opens out upon North Cliff Hill and extending thence first westward and then south-westward for a distance of twenty seven chains or thereabouts along the middle of the footpath which leads towards the coppice called Denaby Thicks, to the boundary which divides the said parish of Conisbrough from the parish of Mexbrough aforesaid.

" And we further represent recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing recommending or proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of

Parliament.

" The SCHEDULES to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference. " THE FIRST SCHEDULE.

"The territory to be annexed to the new parish of Saint Mark Newport in the county of Monmouth and in the diocese of Llandaff being :-

"dead in the Metropolis," made a representation stating that, for the protection of the public health, no new burial ground should be opened in the under-mentioned parishes without the previous approval of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and that burials should be discontinued therein with the following modifications, viz.:—

STONE, STAFFORD.—Forthwith and entirely in the Church of Saint Michael's, Stone, in the county of Stafford, and in the churchyard within four feet of its boundaries; and also in the rest of the churchyard after the thirtyfirst of December one thousand nine hundred

except as follows :--

(a) In vaults and wholly walled graves now existing, burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

(b.) In earthen graves now existing, burials may be allowed of the relations of those already interred therein provided the bodies can be deposited at or below the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or

disturbing human remains.

(c.) In reserved grave spaces which have never before been buried in and which when opened are free from water, burials may by allowed of so many members of the families to whom they may be allotted as can be buried at or relow the depth of five feet:— And forthwith and entirely in the Christchurch, Stone, in the county of Stafford; and also in

the churchyard after the thirty-first of December one thousand nine hundred except

as follows :---

(a.) In vaults and wholly walled graves now existing burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

(b.) In earthen graves now existing, burials may be allowed of the relations of those already interred therein provided the bodies can be deposited at or below the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or dis-

turbing human remains.

(c.) In reserved grave spaces which have never before been buried in, and which when opened are free from water, burials may be allowed of so many members of the families to whom they may be allotted as can be buried at or below the depth of five feet.

THE following Statutes, made on the twenty-eighth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight, by the Governing Body of the College of Saint John the Evangelist, in the University of Cambridge, amending Statutes XLIII and LIV of the Statutes of the College, have been submitted for the approval of Her Majesty in Council and notice of their having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions contained in "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877":—

STATUTES to alter and amend the Statutes of the College of Saint John the Evangelist in the University of Cambridge such amending Statutes being duly made at a General Meeting of the Governing Body of the said College specially summoned for this purpose held on the twenty-eighth day of October one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight and passed at such meeting by the votes of the whole number of persons present and voting and now submitted for the approval of Her Majesty the Queen in Council.

Whereas the Governing Body of our said College in exercise of the powers conferred by the fifty-fourth section of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act 1877" did on the fourth day of December one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three make two Statutes to alter the Statutes framed for our said College by the Commissioners appointed under the said Act viz. Statute XXX intituled "The Foundation Scholars" and Statute XLIII intituled "Distribution of Revenues."

And whereas the said altered Statutes were approved by Her Majesty the Queen in Council on the eleventh day of August one thousand eight

hundred and eighty-four.

And whereas the Governing Body of our said College in further exercise of the powers conferred by the same fifty-fourth section of the said Act did on the sixth day of November one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six make an additional Statute intituled Statute LIV "Power to suspend vacant Fellowships."

And whereas the said additional Statute was approved by Her Majesty the Queen in Council on the sixth day of April one thousand eight

hundred and eighty-nine.

And whereas it is considered expedient to alter and amend one of the said altered Statutes viz. Statute XLIII intituled "Distribution of Revenues" and also the said additional Statute LIV intituled "Power to suspend vacant Fellowships."

Now we the Governing Body of the said College by virtue of the said Act and according to the provisions thereof do hereby make the following alterations in the existing Statutes of our said College viz.

The existing Statute XLIII intituled "Distribution of Revenues" is repealed and there is substituted therefor the following Statute.

STATUTE XLIII.

Distribution of Revenues.

The income of the College, after payment of the ordinary expenses, including all commons allowed by these Statutes, and of such stipends and salaries to the Lecturers and other officers and the servants of the College as shall have been fixed by the Council, shall be paid, applied, and distributed as follows, that is to say:

To the Master a fixed annual stipend of seven hundred and ninety pounds (£790) as provided by

the Statute for that purpose.

To each Fellow of the College holding a Professorship in the University the stipend whereof is reduced by two hundred pounds (£200) when the Professor holds a Fellowship (hereinafter and in Statute LIV designated a Professorial Fellow) the sum of two hundred pounds (£200).

To each of the Scholars such annual payment, not being less than forty pounds (£40), as the Council shall subject to the provisions of Statute XXX determine, the whole sum so distributed in Scholarships being not less than two thousand seven hundred pounds (£2700) in each year.

To each of the Minor Scholars such annual payment, not being less than fifty pounds (£50) nor more than eighty pounds (£80), as the

Council shall determine.

To each of the nine Sizars such annual payment (if any) as the Council shall from time to time

determine.

And, subject to these payments and to the payment in each year of the contribution to the University under Statute XLII and to such other payments as in the judgment of the Council may be required for the purposes of the College and the management or improvement of its estates and property, there shall be paid:—

To every Fellow of the College other than a Professorial Fellow as hereinbefore defined such sum as the Council shall fix for the dividend of the year, not exceeding two hundred and fifty

pounds (£250).

. To the Master a sum equal to three and threefifths times the amount of such dividend.

To each Member of the Council a sum equal to one-fifth of such dividend, in addition to his dividend.

And to each Professorial Fellow as hereinbefore

defined the sum, if any, by which the dividend of the year shall exceed two hundred pounds (£200).

Provided, that if any person shall have been Master, Member of the Council, Fellow, Foundation Scholar, Minor Scholar, Sizar, or Officer of the College, for a part only of the year, he shall be entitled only to one-fourth part of his annual stipend, dividend, or allowance for each quarter of the year, or part of a quarter greater than a half, during which he may have been Master, Member of the Council, Fellow, Foundation Scholar, Minor Scholar, Sizar, or Officer.

All Fellows of the College shall be entitled, in addition to such dividend as is above provided, to rooms and commons, if in residence, or to such pecuniary allowances in lieu thereof as the Council shall from time to time determine.

The existing Statute LIV intituled "Power to suspend vacant Fellowships" is also repealed and there is substituted therefor the following Statute.

STATUTE LIV.

Power of suspending vacant Fellowships.

If it shall at any time appear to the Council that the revenues of the College do not produce the amount required to afford to every Fellow an income of two hundred pounds a year (exclusive of rooms and commons but inclusive of other allowances) they may by a resolution in which not less than nine votes shall have concurred declare that a Fellowship then vacant is suspended. And the dividend of any vacant Fellowship so suspended shall not be paid to the capital of the Pension Fund but shall in each year be wholly assigned:

To or towards the payment of the Contribution

to the University under Statute XLII.

And to or towards the payment to each Professorial Fellow as defined in Statute XLIII of the difference by which the fixed sum of two hundred pounds (£200) assigned by Statute XLIII may exceed the dividend of the year.

The Council may at any time by a resolution in which not less than nine votes shall have concurred declare that a suspended vacant Fellowship is no longer suspended and it shall thereupon be dealt with in the manner provided by the Statutes of the College.

THE following Statutes, made on the twenty-second day of October, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight, by the Governing Body of Trinity College, Cambridge, amending Statutes of the College, have been submitted for the approval of Her Majesty in Council and notice of their having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions contained in "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877":—

STATUTES to alter and amend the Statutes of Trinity College in the University of Cambridge. Such amending Statutes being duly made at a general meeting of the Governing Body of the said College (specially summoned for this purpose and held on the twenty-second day of October one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight) and passed at such meeting by the votes of more than two-thirds of the number of persons present and voting, there being then present more than twenty-

five Fellows, and now submitted for the approval

of Her Majesty the Queen in Council.

We the Master Fellows and Scholars of the said College do hereby in exercise of the powers given us by the fifty-fourth section of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act 1877" alter and amend the Statutes framed by the Commissioners appointed under the said Act in relation to our said College in the following manner:-

By adding after Statute VI intituled "The Foundation of the College" the following further Statute to form Statute VIA :-

STATUTE VIA .- THE ELY FELLOWSHIPS.

1. In addition to the Fellows mentioned in the Statute for the foundation of the College there shall be such number as hereinafter provided of Ely Fellows on the foundation of Ashley William Graham Allen. Such last-mentioned Fellows shall be elected under the same titles from among the same persons and in the same manner and shall hold their fellowships on the same tenures subject to the same conditions and with the same rights powers privileges and advantages in every respect as the other Fellows of the College and all provisions contained in the Statutes of the College affecting or relating to Fellows or fellowships of the College shall save as in this Statute provided apply as well to the Ely Fellows or Ely fellowships respectively as to the other Fellows or fellowships respectively of the College in like manner as if the Ely fellowships had been founded by the Council under the powers of founding additional ordinary fellowships contained in the Statutes of the College.

2. The number of Ely fellowships to be founded shall be such as in the opinion of the Council the income of the property bequeathed to the College by the said Ashley William Graham Allen including any such additions thereto as hereinafter mentioned (which said property and additions are hereinafter called the Allen estate) shall be sufficient to maintain. Provided that the said Ely fellowships shall be founded either together or separately at such time or times as the Council shall determine. Provided nevertheless that not less than three Ely fellowships shall be founded within five years after the approval of this Statute

by Her Majesty in Council.

3. It shall be lawful for the Council at their discretion either to keep the Allen estate as a separate fund and to pay from the income thereof to the general revenue of the College such sums as they shall from time to time determine or if and when they shall think fit to unite it with the other

property of the College.

4. It shall be lawful for the Council from time to time out of the income of the Allen estate and the securities representing the same (whether the same be kept as a separate fund or not) to set aside and invest and accumulate such sums as they from time to time think proper and to sell or dispose of the whole or any part of such investments and to apply such investments and accumulations and the income thereof and the proceeds of any such sale or any part thereof respectively towards supplying from time to time any deficiency in the income of the Allen estate and to add the same or any part thereof not so applied as aforesaid to the capital of the Allen estate. Provided that the powers conferred by this section shall be in addition to and not in substitution for any and every other power of the Council under the Statutes for the time being of the College.

By repealing section 3 of Statute XI intituled "Vacancies to be filled up" and substituting happen. No. 27029.

therefor the following section to form an amended section 3 of the same Statute:-

STATUTE XI.-VACANCIES TO BE FILLED UP.

3. For the purpose of each annual election of Fellows the Council shall compute the number of vacant fellowships in manner hereinbefore provided and shall ascertain the average number of vacancies occurring annually in the fellowships of the College according to the number of fellowships_ which shall actually have become vacant in the ten years ending at such annual election. And if at the time of any annual election of Fellows it shall appear that the computed number of vacant fellowships exceeds the average number of vacancies by unity at least it shall be competent for the Council if they think fit to suspend one or more fellowships in number not exceeding such excess If on the other hand it shall appear that the computed number of vacant fellowships falls short of the average number of vacancies by unity at least it shall be competent for the Council if they think fit to provide for such annual election one or more temporary additional fellowships in number not exceeding such defect. The computed number of vacant fellowships or the computed number so reduced or increased as the case may be shall at such annual election of Fellows be placed by the Council at the disposal of the Board of Electors hereinafter mentioned. Provided that for the purposes of this section a newly-founded permanent fellowship shall not be deemed to have actually become vacant at the date of its foundation.

By adding to the same Statute XI the following sections to form sections 4, 5 and 6 of that

Statute:-

4. At any election of Fellows the vacant fellowships shall be arranged in order of the dates at which they were respectively varated or in the case of newly-founded fellowships at which they were founded and any additional fellowships temporarily provided shall follow after all the other fellowships to be filled up. And the Fellows elected shall be deemed to have been elected into such fellowships in order according to the seniority of their degrees. Provided that fellowships vacated at the same time shall be deemed to have been vacated in the order in which the Fellows vacating them stood on the roll of Fellows. Provided also that if at any time the computed number of vacant fellowships is increased by reason of any Fellow becoming the holder of a pension-fellowship his fellowship shall for the purposes of this section be deemed to have been vacated when it became a pension fellowship.

5. If at any annual election of Fellows the said Board of Electors are of opinion that it is desirable to fill up from among the candidates only a number of fellowships smaller than the whole number then at their disposal it shall be competent for them to fill up only such smaller number. Provided that in such case any temporary additional fellowship or fellowships not filled up shall forthwith be extinguished. Provided also that any fellowship or fellowships not filled up (other than such additional fellowships) shall be suspended in like manner as if it or they had been suspended by the Council under the power hereinbefore con-

6. Every fellowship suspended under either of the powers hereinbefore contained at any annual election of Fellows may be afterwards filled up by election under any of the titles $(\beta)(\gamma)(\delta)$ and (ϵ) , and shall be suspended from such annual election of Fellows until it is so filled up or until the next annual election of Fellows whichever shall first

By repealing section 2 of Statute XII intituted "The Annual Election of Fellows" and substituting therefor the following section to form an amended section 2 of the same Statute:—

STATUTE XII.

THE ANNUAL ELECTION OF FELLOWS.

2. Subject to the provisions hereiubefore contained the fellowships at the disposal of the Board of Electors shall be filled up (a) from among the persons eligible as next hereinafter provided that is to say any Member of the College (or if in any year the Council shall think fit any Member of the University) who shall have been admitted in the University to the title of Bachelor Designate in Arts or to some equal title and who is not of standing to be admitted to incept in Arts or in any other faculty shall be eligible at each or any of the three annual elections taking place or which might have taken place next after the end of three years and six months from the beginning of the term in which he commenced residence. Provided however that if a Member of the College has been by illness or other grave cause prevented from proceeding to a degree at the regular time the Council may if they think fit prolong in his case the said period of three years and six months so as to make him eligible at each or any of the three annual elections taking place or which might have taken place next after the time when he shall have been admitted to the title of Bachelor Designate in Arts or to some equal title. Provided always that to determine the eligibility of Students of Affiliated Colleges and of Advanced Students respectively this section shall be read as if the words "two years" and "one year" respectively were substituted for the words "three years" whereever the same occur.

By repealing section 7 of Statute XV intituled "Tenure and Vacating of Fellowships" and substituting therefor the following section to form an amended section 7 of the same Statute:—

. STATUTE XV.

TENURE AND VACATING OF FELLOWSHIPS.

7. If any Fellow entitled to retain his fellowship in virtue of his holding any qualifying office in the University other than the offices of Public Orator Registrary or Librarian shall at any time be permitted or required, under the Statutes of the University, during a period exceeding four weeks, to discharge the duties of his office by deputy, the time during which such duties shall be so discharged shall not be reckoned as part of the period of service after which such Fellow shall either become entitled to hold his fellowship until the end of one year from his ceasing to hold a qualifying office or as hereinafter provided be discharged from the obligation to hold such office, or after which he shall be entitled to any increase of his dividend.

By adding to the same Statute XV after section 7 the following section to form section 7a of that Statute:—

7a. If any Fellow entitled to retain his fellowship in virtue of his holding the office of Public Orator Registrary or Librarian in the University shall at any time in term on account of absence from the University or for other reason be permitted or required under the Statutes of the University during a period exceeding four weeks to discharge the duties of his office by deputy, the time during which such duties shall be so discharged shall not be reckoned as part of the period of service after which such Fellow shall either become entitled to hold his fellowship until the end of one year from his ceasing to hold a qualifying office or as hereinafter provided be

discharged from the obligation to hold such office.

By repealing section 8 of the same Statute XV and substituting therefor the following section to form an amended section 8 of that Statute:—

8. If any Fellow entitled to retain his fellowship in virtue of his holding any qualifying College office shall at any time be prevented during a period exceeding four weeks from discharging the duties of such office by reason of illhealth, or of absence from Cambridge for the purpose of study out of the University, or of occupation in any special educational work to which the Council may appoint him, or of other grave cause to be approved by the Council, the time during which he shall so be prevented from discharging such duties shall not be reckoned as part of the period of service after which such Fellow shall either become entitled to hold his fellowship until the end of one year from his ceasing to hold a qualifying office or as hereinafter provided be discharged from the obligation to hold such office, or after which he shall be entitled to any increase of his dividend, or after which he shall be compelled to retire from office as hereinafter provided.

By repealing section 1 of Statute XX intituled "The Major Scholars" and substituting therefor the following section to form an amended section 1 of the same Statute:—

STATUTE XX.—THE MAJOR SCHOLARS.

1. There shall be at least seventy-four Major Scholars exclusive of the Supernumerary Scholars (if any). The Council may in virtue of new benefactions found additional Major scholarships to be held subject to the provisions herein contained.

By adding to section 3 of the same Statute XX the following provise:—

Provided also that with reference to those students who by the Statutes and Ordinances of the University are enabled to proceed to their first degree after keeping by residence less than nine terms the Council shall make regulations from time to time determining whether and under what conditions they or any of them shall be eligible for scholarships.

By adding after Statute XXI intituled "The Minor Scholars" the following further Statute to

form Statute XXIA :-

STATUTE XXIa. SUPERNUMERARY SCHOLARS.

Any Major or Minor Scholar may, with the consent in writing of his Tutor, declare in writing to the Master his intention of becoming a Supernumerary Scholar. Such Supernumerary Scholar shall not thenceforth be entitled to any payment in respect of his scholarship but save as aforesaid he shall remain a Scholar to all intents and purposes and hold his Scholarship for the like time and under the like conditions and enjoy the like privileges and advantages in respect thereof as if he had not made such declaration. Provided that a person elected to an ordinary Major Scholarship shall not become a Supernumerary Major Scholar by reason of any such declaration made by him with reference to any scholarship previously held by him. Provided also that no account shall be taken by the Electors at any. election to scholarships of any such declaration previously made by any candidate either with reference to any scholarship previously held by him or otherwise.

By repealing section 2 of Statute XXVIII intituled "The Vice-Master" and substituting therefor the following section to form an amended section 2 of the same Statute:—

STATUTE XXVIII. THE VICE-MASTER.

2. If he cease to be a member of Council, he shall cease to hold the office of Vice-Master.

By repealing section 2 of Statute XLIII intituled "The Common Seal" and substituting therefor the following section to form an amended section 2 of the same Statute :-

STATUTE XLIII. THE COMMON SEAL.

2. If any of them leave the College he shall deposit his key as the Council shall from time to time direct and no one shall have two keys in his keeping at the same time.

By repealing Statute XLIV intituled "Presentation to Benefices" and substituting therefor the following Statute to form an amended Statute

XLIV :-

STATUTE XLIV.

PRESENTATION TO BENEFICES.

The Council shall present to the several b ne-

fices in the patronage of the College.

By repealing Statute L intituled "Suspended Followship Fund" and substitu ing therefor the following Statute to form an amended Statute

STATUTE L.

Suspended Fellowship Fund.

There shall be a fund called the Suspended Fellowship Fund. If in any year there shall have been any fellowship or fellowships suspended under the provisions hereinbefore contained there shall be paid to this fund in respect of each such fellowship such sum (if any) as would have been received by way of proper dividend in respect of such fellowship by a person not holding or having held any of the offices of Prælector Bursar Dean Tutor Assistant-Tutor Lecturer or Assistant-Lecturer or of Regius Professor of Greek who should have held such fellowship during the period of its suspension. This fund may be employed under the direction of the Council in meeting as far as possible the cost of any temporary additional fellowships established under the provisions hereinbefore contained.

This section shall not apply to the owner or occupier of any land, or to any person authorized by the owner or occupier of any land, killing or taking any Wild Bird on such land not included in the Schedule hereto annexed.

Secondly: The Secretary for Scotland may, upon application by the County Council of any administrative county, by Order prohibit:-
