

improved value which has arisen as aforesaid to the said vicarage of Leyland from the said sale the average annual income of the said vicarage of Leyland will not be left at a less sum than six hundred pounds.

"And whereas the Reverend Octavius de Leyland Baldwin, the vicar or Incumbent as aforesaid of the said vicarage of Leyland, is desirous that we should submit to Your Majesty in Council the recommendation and proposal hereinafter set forth.

"Now therefore, we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme the sum of four hundred and fifty pounds two pounds fifteen shillings per centum Consolidated Stock forming part of the stock in which the said sum produced by the said sale as aforesaid has been invested by us shall be held by us not for the benefit of the Vicar or Incumbent of the parish of Leyland aforesaid, but for the benefit of the Incumbent of the said consolidated chapelry (or new parish when the same shall have become a new parish) of Saint Ambrose Leyland, and that the annual interest or dividend arising from the said sum of four hundred and fifty pounds two pounds fifteen shillings per centum Consolidated Stock shall be payable and paid by us to or for the benefit of the Incumbent for the time being of the said consolidated chapelry or new parish of Saint Ambrose Leyland, and his successors for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the notice of the foregoing scheme which is required by the hereinbefore mentioned Acts has been given by the said Commissioners to the patron of the said benefice of Leyland and the said patron has not made any objection to the same scheme.

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Manchester.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of Her Majesty, chapter forty-nine; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-five, duly prepared and

laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the twenty-eighth day of July, in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight, in the words following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of Your Majesty chapter forty-nine, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Your Majesty chapter fifty-five, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following representation as to the assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church of the Holy Trinity, Cheltenham, situate within the limits of the parish of Cheltenham in the county of Gloucester and in the diocese of Gloucester.

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church of the Holy Trinity, Cheltenham, situate as aforesaid.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend Charles John, Bishop of the said diocese of Gloucester (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said parish of Cheltenham which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of the Holy Trinity, Cheltenham, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of the Holy Trinity, Cheltenham.'

"And with the like consent of the said Charles John Bishop of the said diocese of Gloucester (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said church of the Holy Trinity, Cheltenham, situate as aforesaid, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being: Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us the said Commissioners to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism or for the registration thereof.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration and to make such Order with respect thereto as to Your Majesty, in Your Royal wisdom, shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Holy Trinity, Cheltenham, being:—

"All that part of the parish of Cheltenham in the county of Gloucester and in the diocese of Gloucester which is bounded upon the greater part of the north-west by the new parish of Saint Paul, Cheltenham, upon the north-east by the parish of Prestbury, upon the south-east by the new parish of All Saints, Pittville, all which cures are situate in the county and diocese aforesaid and
