WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her Majesty chapter ninety-four of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her Majesty chapter ninety-four and of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her Majesty chapter ninety-four duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme or representation bearing date the third day of November, in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Your Majesty chapter ninety-four, of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Your Majesty chapter ninety-four, and of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Your Majesty chapter ninety-four, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme or representation for altering the boundaries of the new parish of Saint Paul Penzance and of the new parish of Saint John the Baptist Penzance both in the county of Cornwall and in the diocese of Truro.

“ Whereas by the authority of an Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the nineteenth day of March in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven and published in

the London Gazette upon the twenty-second day of the same month a part of the chapelry of Saint Mary Penzance then described as being in the parish of Madron in the said county of Cornwall and at that time in the diocese of Exeter but now in the diocese of Truro was assigned as a district chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Paul situate within the limits of the said chapelry of Saint Mary Penzance, and the said district chapelry was called ‘The District Chapelry of Saint Paul Penzance.’

“ And whereas the said district chapelry of Saint Paul Penzance has under the provisions of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Your Majesty chapter one hundred and four become a new parish of the character contemplated by the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Your Majesty chapter thirty-seven and by the above-mentioned Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Your Majesty chapter ninety-four.

“ And whereas by another Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the twenty-fourth day of March in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one, and published in the London Gazette on the twenty-eighth day of the same month a part of the said parish of Madron was assigned as a district chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Mary situate at Penzance within the limits of the chapelry of Saint Mary Penzance aforesaid and the same district chapelry was called ‘The District Chapelry of Saint Mary Penzance.’

“ And whereas the said district chapelry of Saint Mary Penzance has under the provisions of the said Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Your Majesty chapter one hundred and four also become a new parish of the character aforesaid.

“ And whereas by the authority of another Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the sixth day of February in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two and published in the London Gazette on the fourteenth day of the same month a part of the said new parish of Saint Mary Penzance was assigned as a district chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint John the Baptist situate within the limits of the said new parish of Saint Mary Penzance and the same district chapelry was called ‘The District Chapelry of Saint John the Baptist Penzance.’

“ And whereas the said district chapelry of Saint John the Baptist Penzance has under the provisions of the said Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Your Majesty chapter one
