

In the High Court of Justice.—Companies
(Winding-up).

Mr. Justice Wright.

In the Matter of the Companies Acts 1862 to 1890 and in the Matter of Mills Hunter and Willson Limited.

NOTICE is hereby given that a petition for the winding up of the above named Company by the High Court of Justice was on the 30th day of November 1898 presented to the said Court by Ingrams Ltd. of 6 Creechurch-lane in the city of London Wine Merchants and Haig and Haig Limited of 1, 2, and 3 Trinity-place Tower Hill in the city of London Distillers.
