IT is hereby notified, that the Marquis of Salisbury, K.G., Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, has received a Telegraphic Despatch from Rear-Admiral Noel, commanding Her Majesty's Naval Forces in Cretan Waters, to the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, announcing that the Admirals in command of the British, French, Italian, and Russian Naval Forces have issued a Notification to the effect that the Blockade of the Island of Crete, established on the 21st of March, 1897 (of which notice was given in the London Gazette of the 19th of March, 1897), is raised from the 5th December, but that the importation of arms and munitions of war into Crete is absolutely prohibited.

The Wild Birds Protection (County of Dunbarton) Order, 1898.

WHEREAS by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1896, as applying to Scotland, it is, amongst other things, provided as follows:—

Firstly.—Any person who, between the first day of March and the first day of August in any year, shall, knowingly and wilfully, shoot, or attempt to shoot, or shall use any boat for the purpose of shooting, or causing to be shot, any Wild Bird, or shall use any lime, trap, snare, net, or other instrument for the purpose of taking any Wild Bird, or shall expose or offer for sale, or shall have in his control or possession after the fifteenth day of March, any Wild Bird recently killed or taken, shall, on conviction of any such offence before the Sheriff, in the case of any Wild Bird which is included in the Schedule hereunto annexed, forfeit and pay for every such bird in respect of which an offence has been committed a sum not exceeding one pound, and, in the case of any other Wild Bird, shall for a first offence be reprimanded and discharged on payment of costs, and for every subsequent offence forfeit

NOTE.—By an Order of the Secretary for Scotland, dated 27th July, 1891, the close time enacted by this section has been extended, so far as regards the county of Zetland, to the 31st day of August in each year.

and pay for every such Wild Bird in respect of which an offence is committed a sum of money not exceeding five shillings, in addition to the costs. This section shall not apply to the owner or occupier of any land, or to any person authorized by the owner or occupier of any land, killing or taking any Wild Birds on such land not included in the Schedule hereto annexed.

Secondly.—The Secretary for Scotland may, upon application by the County Council of any administrative county by Order prohibit—

- (1) The taking or destroying of Wild Birds' eggs in any year or years in any place or places within that county; or
- (2) The taking or destroying the eggs of any specified kind of Wild Birds within that county or part or parts thereof, as recommended by the said County Council, and set forth in the said Order.

Thirdly.—The Secretary for Scotland may, on the representation of the Council of any administrative county, order that the principal Act shall apply within that county, or any part or parts thereof, to any species of Wild Bird not included in the Schedule of that Act, as if that species of Wild Bird were included in the Schedule of that Act.

Fourthly.—The powers exerciseable by the Secretary for Scotland shall extend to the making of an Order prohibiting, for special reasons mentioned in the application, the taking or killing of particular kinds of Wild Birds during the whole or any part of that period of the year to which the protection of Wild Birds under the Act of 1880 does not extend, or the taking or killing of all Wild Birds in particular places during the whole or any part of that period.

Now, therefore, I, the Right Honourable Alexander Hugh, Lord Balfour of Burleigh, Her Majesty's Secretary for Scotland, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the said Acts, and upon application by the County Council of the County of Dunbarton, do hereby make the following Order:—

NOTICE is hereby given that the Secretary for Scotland has confirmed the following Bye-law passed by the Fishery Board for Scotland, viz.:—
BYE-LAW (No. 17) made by the Fishery Board for Scotland under the powers conferred on the Board by the Sea Fisheries (Scotland) Amendment Act, 1885.

I. Bye-law (No. 12) made by the Fishery Board for Scotland on the 30th day of October, and confirmed by the Secretary for Scotland on the 29th day of December, 1893, is hereby revoked.

II. This bye-law shall apply to the whole of the sea adjoining Scotland, and within the exclusive fishery limits of the British Islands, provided that its application shall not extend to the Solway Firth nor the Pentland Firth, nor to (1) beam trawling (under conditions duly authorized from time to time) in the waters inside of three straight lines drawn (a) from Garroch Head, Island of Bute, to Gull Point, Little Cumbrae; (b) from Gull Point to Portincross Castle on the Ayrshire coast; and (c) from Colintrave Hotel, Argyllshire, to a point due south (magnetic) on the Island of Bute; nor (2) beam trawling for shrimps (under conditions duly authorized from time to time) in the waters inside of a straight line drawn from Eggerness Point, on the Wigtownshire coast, to Ringdoo Point, at the west side of Fleet Bay, on the Kirkcudbrightshire coast.

III. From and after the date when this bye-law shall come into force it shall not be lawful within the said limits for any person, unless on the service, or possessing the written authority of the Fishery Board for Scotland, under the hand of the Secretary thereof, to use, by trailing or dragging along the bottom of the sea, any net (including a seine or circle net) or other instrument for the capture of sea fish other than herrings, sprats, sparlings, and shell fish.

IV. Nothing in this bye-law shall affect the validity of bye-law (No. 13) made by the Fishery Board for Scotland on the 8th day of March, and confirmed by the Secretary for Scotland on the 19th day of April, 1895.

V. This bye-law shall come into force from and after the date of its confirmation by the Secretary for Scotland.

THE Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice, that the following Regulations have been approved by the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, viz.:—

REGULATIONS respecting Temporary Boy Messengers in Government Departments.

1. A Register of Boys for employment as Temporary Boy Messengers in Government Departments will be kept by the Civil Service Commissioners.

2. The limits of age for registration will be 14 to 16, and Boy Messengers will not be retained as such after reaching the age of 20.

3. Boys may present themselves for examination, at such times as the Commissioners may fix, at the Civil Service Commission, Cannon-row, Westminster. They must be of good health and character, must satisfy the Commissioners of their ability to read and write,* and must pay a fee of 1s.

4. Whenever the occasional service of Boy Messengers is required by a Department for any period, whether short or long, application will be made to the Civil Service Commissioners, who will select a boy from the list above mentioned. The insertion of a name on the Register will not, however, imply a certainty of employment; it will merely render a boy eligible for employment in case there should be a demand for his services.

5. The pay of Boy Messengers will be at the rate of 7s. 6d. per week, rising by 1s. 6d. per week for each year of approved service.

4. Candidates must be at least 5 feet in height, and no officer will be retained in the Service who does not attain the height of 5 feet 4 inches before completing his nineteenth year.

5. No Candidate will be admitted to examination who does not, at such time as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners, produce an undertaking, signed by his parent or guardian, that he will, if successful, reside within a suitable distance from the Post Office, either with his parents or guardians, or with relations or friends approved by such parents or guardians.

6. Persons holding situations in the Civil Service, Engineer Students in the Navy, and Apprentices in Her Majesty's Dockyards, will not be eligible unless they produce to the Civil Service Commissioners the written permission of the authorities of their Department to attend the Examination, dated before the commencement of the competition.

7. Application for permission to attend an Examination must be made at such times and in such manner as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners.

8. A fee of 4s. will be required from every Candidate attending the Examination.
