Kentish Knock and N.E. Longsand—Signal, 1 gun, 1 rocket; to be repeated every 10 minutes.

Shipwash, Whiting, and Bawdsey—Signal, 1 gun, 1 rocket; to be repeated every 5 minutes.

Cork, Cutler, and West Rocks—Signal, 1 gun, 1 rocket; to be repeated every 3 minutes.

North Sunk and Gun Fleet—Signal, 2 guns, 2 rockets; interval of firing, 60 seconds; to be repeated every 5 minutes.

S.W. Sunk, Barrow, Buxey, Foulness, Middle Sand, Knock John—Signal, 2 guns, 2 rockets; interval of firing, 15 seconds; to be repeated every 5 minutes.

Sands west of the line between Maplin and Girdler Lights—Signal, 1 gun, 1 rocket; to be repeated every 5 minutes.

S.W. Long Sand, Tongue, Girdler, Shingles, and Margate—Signal, 2 guns, 2 rockets; interval of firing, 60 seconds; to be repeated every 5 minutes.

North Goodwin—Signal, 1 gun, 1 rocket; to be repeated every 3 minutes.

South Goodwin—Signal, 1 gun, 1 rocket; to be repeated every 5 minutes.

North-West Goodwin and Brake—Signal, 2 guns, 2 rockets; interval of firing, 15 seconds; to be repeated every 3 minutes.

**CAUTION.**—The short intervals of firing between the guns and rockets as described above will be adhered to as nearly as possible, but they should be regarded as approximate only. The rockets (fired at night only) make little sound, but are of great brilliancy. The Maplin and Gunfleet use explosive rockets in place of guns.

The Would, Shipwash, Longsand, Kentish Knock, Tongue, North Goodwin and East Goodwin Light-vessels will, when firing distress signals, also exhibit the Blue Peter over a ball from the gaff end.

**NOTE.**—The information relating to these signals given on Admiralty Charts Nos. 1630, Orfordness to Blakeney, and 1543, Yarmouth and Lowestoft roads, should be erased.
