FOREIGN AND COLONIAL POST.

TREASURY WARRANT.

WE, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers given to us by the Post Office Acts, or any of them, and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, made on the representation of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same) order, direct, and declare as follows:-

Warrant to be Read with Foreign and Colonial Post Warrant, 1892.

1. This Warrant shall be read as one with the Foreign and Colonial Post Warrant, 1892 (hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Warrant") and all warrants amending the same.

Rates on British Letters.

2.—(1.) On every British letter there shall be charged and paid (in lieu of the rates of postage payable under the Principal Warrant) the following rates, that is to say :-

On every letter not exceeding half-an-ounce in weight... On every letter exceeding half-an-ounce in

weight, for every half-ounce, or frac-tional part of half-an-ounce (2.) A British letter means and includes—

(a.) An outgoing letter posted in the United Kingdom for transmission to any country or place specified in the schedule hereto, or to any of Her Majesty's ships of war, whether on the high seas or in any port or place outside the United Kingdom.

(b.) A letter sent from any of Her Majesty's ships of war, whether on the high seas or in any port or place outside the United Kingdom, to any place in the United Kingdom, or to any country or place specified in the schedule

(c.) A letter deposited in a letter-box on board a British ship, or in the hands of the Commander of such ship, when on the high seas or in a port in any country or place specified in the schedule hereto, for transmission to the United Kingdom or to any country or place specified in the said schedule.

(3.) The rates fixed by this clause in relation to letters to and from Her Majesty's ships of war, shall apply only to letters transmitted in closed mails to or from such ships.

Incoming Letters Re-directed.

3. Where an incoming letter liable to be charged with the rates of postage specified in this Warrant is re-directed to any country or place to which such rates do not apply, there shall be charged and paid on such letter an amount which, together with the amount chargeable thereon under this Warrant, shall be equal to the rates of postage on letters charged and paid under the Principal

Short Title of Amendment Warrant, 1895.

4. Clause 1 of the Foreign and Colonial Post Amendment Warrant, 1895, is hereby repealed, and that Warrant may be cited as "The Foreign and Colonial Post (Amendment No. 2) Warrant, 1895."

Short Title.

5. This Warrant may be cited as " The Foreign and Colonial Post (Amendment No. 3) Warrant, 1898."

Commencement.

6. This Warrant shall come into operation on the twenty-fifth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight.

WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of East Suffolk) Order, 1898, dated 19th December, 1898.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1893, and upon application by the County Council of the Administrative County of East Suffolk, I hereby make the following Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of East

Suffolk) Order, 1898.

2. The time during which the taking and killing of Wild Birds (other than the Wild Duck) is prohibited within the Administrative County of East Suffolk, shall be extended so as to be from the 1st March to the 1st September in each year, the close time for the Wild Duck remaining as fixed by "The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880," namely, from the 1st day of March to the 1st day of August in every year.

3. The taking or destroying Wild Birds' eggs is prohibited in the years 1899, 1900, 1901, 1902, 1903, and 1904, in the following places within the Administrative County of East Suffolk, namely, the sea coast, beach, foreshore, sandhills, saltings, or salt marshes, situate between the sea or estuaries and the land side of the sea or estuarial wall, embankment, ditch, fence, or other artificial or natural boundary separating the same from the cultivated land, from the north side of

the River Blyth to Landguard Point (excluding the estuary of the Alde above the ferry at Slaughden Quay, Aldeburgh).

4. This Order shall come into force on the 1st January, 1899, from which date the Orders of the 24th December, 1895, the 5th June, 1896, and the 2nd June, 1897, are hereby repealed.

Jizo Saki, Niudo Saki—Lights Exhibited.

THE Japanese Government has given notice, that on and after 20th November, 1898, the two following lights of the first order would be exhibited :-

1. Jizo Saki Light is white flashing, showing a single flash every thirty seconds, elevated 273 feet above high water, and visible in clear weather from a distance of 23 miles, between the bearings of S. 60° E., through south and west, and N. 57° E.

It is shown from a stone cylindrical tower 23 feet high, painted white, and situated on the north point of Miho Bay.

Hakodate Harbour-Wreck Removed, Time Signal Established.

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners No. 429 of 1898 :-

Information, dated 11th September, 1898, has been received from Lieutenant and Commander E. H. Grafton, Her-Majesty's ship "Redpole," that the wreck of the small steam-vessel about half a mile north-eastward of Anama Saki has been removed, and the light boat marking it withdrawn.

Also, that a time signal is made by means of a red and white flag hoisted at the Meteorological flagstaff on the east side of Hakodate Harbour. This flag is shown at the dip five minutes before noon, hoisted right up at two minutes before, and dipped at noon, Japan mean time, corresponding to 15h. 6m. 0s. Greenwich mean time, and Oh. 22m. 55s. local mean time.

The time is transmitted by electricity from the Observatory at Tokyo, by which the signal is regulated.
