ORDER of the Local Government Board: District Auditor: Assignment of District and Duties (Supplemental):—

Herefordshire and Monmouthshire Audit District.
Llangynwyd Joint Burial Committee.
To Alfred Walker Dolby, District Auditor:—

To the Joint Committee appointed by the Urban District Councils of Glyncoerwg and Maesteg and the Parish Councils of the Parishes of Lower Llangonoyd and Middle Llangonoyd to exercise the powers and duties of a Burial Board;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by Section 4 of "The District Auditors Act, 1879," it is enacted that the Local Government Board may from time to time assign to District Auditors their Duties, and the Districts in which such Auditors respectively are to act; and may from time to time change wholly or in part such Duties or Districts;

And whereas by an Order dated the 2nd day of January, 1895, We, the Local Government Board, certified the appointment of the said Alfred Walker Dolby as a District Auditor, and ordered that the District in which he should act as Auditor, and which should be termed "The Herefordshire and Monmouthshire Audit District," should, for the performance of the duties assigned to him by Article I of the Order, comprise the area for the time being included in the several Unions and Districts named in the Schedules to that Order, and in paragraph (5) of the said Article I and in the Districts or areas referred to in paragraph (7) of such Article;

And whereas it is prescribed by the said Article I that it shall be the duty of the said District Auditor to audit the Accounts of the Authorities and their Officers mentioned or referred to in paragraphs (1), (2), (3), (4), (5), and (6) of that Article, as well as the Accounts of such of the other Authorities whose Accounts are or may be by law subject to be audited by a District Auditor, and whose Districts or the areas of whose jurisdiction are for the time being partly situated within one or more of the said Unions, as We might by Order under Seal thereafter prescribe;

And whereas the Joint Committee appointed by the Urban District Councils of Glyncoerwg and Maesteg and the Parish Councils of the Parishes of Lower Llangonoyd and Middle Llangonoyd to exercise the powers and duties of a Burial Board is an Authority whose Accounts are subject to be audited by a District Auditor, and the District or area of jurisdiction of the said Committee is partly situated within one or more of the Unions named in the said Schedule;

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We hereby Order and Prescribe that it shall, until We otherwise prescribe, be the duty of the said Alfred Walker Dolby to audit the Accounts of the said Joint Committee in conformity with the provisions contained in the above-cited Order; and that for the purpose of such Audit the District or area of jurisdiction of the said Joint Committee shall be deemed to be within the said Herefordshire and Monmouthshire Audit District.
