ORDER OF SECRETARY OF STATE, No. 3 (d).

(26th December, 1898.)

EXPLOSIVES ACT, 1875 (38 Vic., c. 17).

ORDER of Secretary of State modifying the General Rules as to the packing for conveyance of gunpowder, and of explosives other than gunpowder.

WHEREAS by Part I (section 33) of the Explosives Act, 1875 (in this Order referred to as the Act), General Rules are set forth to be observed with respect to the packing of gunpowder for conveyance:

And whereas by the said section 33 it is enacted that the Secretary of State may from time to time make, and when made, repeal, alter, and add to, rules for the purpose of rescinding, altering, or adding to the General Rules contained in this section, and the rules so made by the Secretary of State shall have the same effect as if they were enacted in this section:

And, whereas, in pursuance of the Explosives Act, 1875, an Order of Secretary of State (known as Order of Secretary of State, No. 3) was made on the 27th day of November, 1875, adapting the General Rules relating to the packing of gunpowder, contained in Part I of the Act, to the packing of explosives other than gunpowder; and whereas by section 83 of the Act, it is provided that a Secretary of State may, by

Order, from time to time revoke, add to, or alter any previous Orders of the Secretary of State:

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers aforesaid, I, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, hereby order as follows:—

I. Notwithstanding anything in the said section 33, and the said Order of Secretary of State, No. 3, contained, it shall be lawful to enclose inner packages containing authorized small arm nitro-compound with inner packages containing gunpowder, or with inner packages containing another authorized small arm nitro-compound in the same outer package, provided—

(a.) That the total amount of such gunpowder and small arm nitro-compound contained in any one outer package shall not exceed 50 lbs.; and

(b.) That every such outer package shall be marked as required by the said Act and Order of Secretary of State separately, in respect of each explosive contained therein.

In this Order, the words "Authorized Small Arm Nitro-compound," shall be deemed to mean nitro-compound adapted and intended exclusively for use with small arms authorized to be manufactured for general sale, or to be imported for general sale for the time being.

II. Notwithstanding anything in the said Order of Secretary of State, No. 3, contained, the amount of gun-cotton, when mixed with sufficient water to be absolutely unflammable, contained in any one inner or outer package, may be unlimited.

III. There shall be appended to Part E, Rule 1, of the said Order of Secretary of State, No. 3, the following provisions:—

Provided—

(a.) That in the case of pin-fire cartridges for pistols, the said cartridges shall be so packed that the bases lie alternately in opposite directions, and the bases and pins shall be so fitted into perforations in millboard or other suitable material as to prevent the firing of any one of the said cartridges by an explosion in any other of the said cartridges;

(b.) That when the number of the said cartridges exceeds 50, they shall be packed in an inner and outer package, the inner package containing not more than 50 of the said cartridges; and

(c.) That in addition to the marking required by the said Order of Secretary of State, No. 3, every outer package containing the said cartridges, there shall be affixed in conspicuous characters, the words "Pin-Fire Cartridges."

WHEREAS by Section 4 of "The District Auditors Act, 1879," it is enacted that the Local Government Board may from time to time assign to District Auditors their Duties, and the Districts in which such Auditors respectively are to act, and may from time to time change wholly or in part such Duties or Districts;

And whereas by an Order dated the 14th day of April, 1896, We, the Local Government Board, certified the appointment of the said Ernest George Easton as a District Auditor, and ordered that the District in which he should in future act as Auditor, and which should be termed "The Gloucestershire Audit District," should, for the performance of the Duties assigned to him by the Order, comprise the area for the time being included in the several Unions named in the Schedule to that Order, and in the Districts named in paragraphs (3) and (4) of Article I of that Order, and in the Districts or areas referred to in paragraph (6) of such Article;

And whereas it is prescribed by Article I of the said Order that it shall be the duty of the said District Auditor to audit the Accounts of the Authorities and their Officers mentioned or referred to in paragraphs (1), (2), (3), (4), and (5) of that Article, as well as the Accounts of such of the other Authorities whose Accounts are or may be by law subject to be audited by a District Auditor, and whose Districts or the areas of whose jurisdiction are for the time being partly situated within one or more of the said Unions, as We might by Order under Seal thereafter prescribe;

And whereas the Urban District Council of Malvern and the Malvern and Guarlford Joint Burial Committee are Authorities whose Accounts are subject to be audited by a District Auditor, and whose Districts or the areas of whose jurisdiction are partly situate within one or more of the said Unions;

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We hereby Order and Prescribe that it shall, until We otherwise prescribe, be the duty of the said Ernest George Easton to audit the Accounts of the Urban District Council of Malvern and of the Malvern and Guarlford Joint Burial Committee, and of their Officers, in conformity with the provisions contained in the above-cited Order; and that for the purpose of such Audit the Districts or areas of jurisdiction of the said Authorities shall be deemed to be within the Gloucestershire Audit District.

WHEREAS by Section 4 of "The District Auditors Act, 1879," it is enacted that the Local Government Board may from time to time assign to District Auditors their Duties, and the Districts in which such Auditors respectively are to act,

and may from time to time change wholly or in part such Duties or Districts;

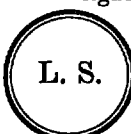
And whereas by an Order dated the 7th day of May, 1883, We, the Local Government Board, certified the appointment of the said Sir Richard Dansey Green-Price as a District Auditor, and ordered and prescribed that the District in which he should in future act as Auditor, and which was thereby assigned to him, should, until We should otherwise prescribe, comprise the area for the time being included in the several Unions named in the Schedule to that Order, and that such District should be termed "The Shropshire and Worcestershire Audit District";

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We hereby Order and Prescribe that it shall, until We otherwise prescribe, be the duty of the said Sir Richard Dansey Green-Price to audit the Accounts of the Bromsgrove, Droitwich, and Redditch Hospital Committee, and of their Officers, in conformity with the provisions contained in the above-cited Order; and that for the purpose of such Audit the District of the said Hospital Committee shall be deemed to be within the Shropshire and Worcestershire Audit District.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

(DATED 4TH JANUARY 1899.)

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in
exercise of the powers in them vested under the
Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of
every other power enabling them in this behalf,
do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

The Orders described in the Schedule to this
Order are hereby revoked: Provided that nothing
herein shall be deemed to invalidate or make
unlawful anything done under the Orders hereby
revoked before the date of this revocation, or
interfere with the institution or prosecution of
any proceeding in respect of any offence committed
against, or any penalty incurred under, the Orders
hereby revoked before the date of this revocation.
