ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

(DATED 4TH JANUARY 1899.)

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in
exercise of the powers in them vested under the
Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of
every other power enabling them in this behalf,
do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

The Orders described in the Schedule to this
Order are hereby revoked: Provided that nothing
herein shall be deemed to invalidate or make
unlawful anything done under the Orders hereby
revoked before the date of this revocation, or
interfere with the institution or prosecution of
any proceeding in respect of any offence committed
against, or any penalty incurred under, the Orders
hereby revoked before the date of this revocation.

fourth day of January, one thousand
eight hundred and ninety-nine.
