PRESENT,
The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the twenty-first day of February, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight, in the words following, viz. :—

"Whereas by Your Majesty's Order in Council of the thirteenth October one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven it is provided that a certain water area at Gibraltar shall be placed under the jurisdiction of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty; and that powers should be conferred upon them to make Regulations for the proper control of the same;

"And whereas it is desirable that an alteration should be made in the Chart attached to the said Order in Council;

"We beg most humbly to recommend that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to revoke Your said Order in Council, and to sanction the following proposals:—

"All the water area lying between the Admiralty Harbour Works, now in course of construction, and the shore, together with the water area two hundred yards in width on the outside of those works and to the south thereof, as far as Rosia Mole, such water areas being more particularly shown by a red colour on the chart attached hereto, shall be deemed to be Admiralty waters.

"From and after a date to be fixed by the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, in communication with the Secretary of State for the Colonies, the control over the said Admiralty waters shall cease to be vested in the Captain of the Port of Gibraltar, to such extent as shall from time to time be determined by the said Lords Commissioners, and such control, to such extent as aforesaid, shall be vested in the Senior Naval Officer at Gibraltar, or in such person as may, by direction of the said Lords Commissioners, be performing the duties of Queen's Harbour Master.

"Notices defining the area over which the control shall be vested in the Senior Naval Officer or other person and specifying the date of such vesting, shall be published in the London Gazette and in the Gibraltar Official Gazette.

"It shall be lawful for the Senior Naval Officer, or for the person performing the duties of Queen's Harbour Master, from time to time, to

make, and, when made, to alter or revoke, such Regulations, in writing, as he may deem expedient for the exclusion or admission of merchant and other private vessels from and to the Admiralty waters at Gibraltar, or from or to such part of them, the control over which is, for the time being, vested in the Senior Naval Officer at Gibraltar, or in the person performing the duties of Queen's Harbour Master; and also for the government of the whole or any part of the said Admiralty waters, and of all ships and boats therein.

"All such Regulations shall be confirmed by the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, and shall be published in the London Gazette and the Gibraltar Official Gazette, and shall be in force from the latest of the two dates at which they are so published.

"Notwithstanding any such Regulations as aforesaid, access to the Commercial Mole and to the waters surrounding it, by way of the entrance between the north end of the detached Mole and the Commercial Mole, shall, at all times, be free and unrestrained, under such Rules as the Queen's Harbour Master shall make for the necessary regulation of traffic to prevent collisions or blocking of approach to the Admiralty waters.

"The masters of all merchant and other private vessels admitted to the Admiralty waters shall be subject to the directions of the Senior Naval Officer at Gibraltar, or of the person performing the duties of Queen's Harbour Master, in all matters connected with anchoring, mooring, securing, or shifting berth in those waters.

"If the Master of any vessel within Admiralty waters does not moor, anchor, place, secure, move, unmoor, or remove the same according to directions given by the Senior Naval Officer at Gibraltar, or by the person performing the duties of Queen's Harbour Master, in conformity with any Regulations made under this Order, or if there is no person on board of any such vessel to attend to such directions, the Senior Naval Officer, or person performing the duties of Queen's Harbour Master, may cause the vessel to be moored, anchored, placed, secured, moved, unmoored, or removed, and for that purpose may cast off, loose, or unshackle, and (if need be) sever any chain or rope of the vessel, first putting on board a sufficient number of persons for the protection of the vessel in case there is not a sufficient number of persons on board to protect the same, and all expenses attending the exercise of these powers shall be paid by the Master of the vessel.

"All merchant and other private vessels permitted to use the Admiralty waters shall be subject to the payment of all such general Harbour or Light dues as may from time to time be levied by the Colonial Government of Gibraltar, as if they were anchored, moored, or placed in the Mercantile Port of Gibraltar.

"The Senior Naval Officer, or the person performing the duties of Queen's Harbour Master, may call upon the owner, or person in charge of any wreck, or other thing, being an obstruction in the Admiralty waters, to remove or destroy such wreck or thing, and the owner or person in charge shall forthwith remove or destroy such wreck or thing, and every fragment of such wreck or thing, which may arise in course of removal or destruction, to the satisfaction of the Senior Naval Officer, or of the person performing the duties of Queen's Harbour Master.

"No explosive shall be used for the purpose of destroying any wreck or thing, without the concurrence of the Senior Naval Officer, and in such manner as he may direct.

"If the owner or person in charge fails or neglects to remove or destroy such wreck or thing within a reasonable time, to be determined by the Senior Naval Officer or the person performing the duties of Queen's Harbour Master; or if, in the opinion of the Senior Naval Officer, the removal of such wreck or thing is a matter of urgency, the Senior Naval Officer, or person performing the duties of Queen's Harbour Master, may give notice to the owner or person in charge, or to his accredited agent at Gibraltar, that, on the expiration of the period stated in such notice, the said Senior Naval Officer, or the person performing the duties of Queen's Harbour Master, will remove or destroy such wreck or thing, and on the expiration of such period may proceed to do so.

"Should any difficulty arise in effecting service of such notice on the owner, or person in charge, or on his accredited agent, such notice may be published in the 'Gibraltar Official Gazette.'

"The expenses incurred by the Senior Naval Officer, or by the person performing the duties of Queen's Harbour Master, in the removal or destruction of such wreck or thing, and in the temporary lighting, buoying, or marking thereof, shall be repaid by the owner or person in charge thereof, and the person performing the duties of Queen's Harbour Master may detain, and, in case of non-payment of expenses on demand, may sell the wreck or thing, and out of the proceeds of the sale pay those expenses and the expenses of the sale, rendering the surplus (if any), to the owner or person entitled thereto on demand, and any deficiency may be recovered as a Civil debt from the owner or person in charge. Provided always that no such sale shall (except in the case of property of a perishable nature) be made until at least seven clear days' notice of the intended sale has been given by advertisement in the 'Gibraltar Official Gazette.'

"For the purposes of this Order, the owner of a wreck or thing shall be deemed to be the person owning such wreck or thing, when such wreck or thing becomes an obstruction in the Admiralty waters, notwithstanding any subsequent sale, transfer, or abandonment.

"Any person contravening any rule or regulation for the time being in force under this Order shall be liable to such fine or penalty, not exceeding twenty pounds, as may be fixed by any such rule or regulation.

"All fines, penalties and forfeitures imposed by any rule or regulation made under this Order shall be recovered in a summary manner subject

to the provisions contained in the Justices Ordinance, Gibraltar, 1890, which said Ordinance shall be deemed and taken to be incorporated with this Order for the purposes thereof.

"All fines and penalties recovered under this Order shall be paid into the Colonial Treasury, for the use of Her Majesty, Her heirs, and successors.

"Your Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Colonies has signified his concurrence in these proposals."

Her Majesty having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

REGULATIONS for the Control of the Admiralty Waters at Gibraltar, as defined by the Order in Council of 7th March, 1898.

The limits of the Admiralty waters are as follows:—

All the water area lying between the Admiralty Harbour Works and the shore, together with the water area 200 yards in width on the outside of these works, and to the south thereof as far as Rosia Mole.

The northern limit includes the northern entrance, and from the south-east corner of the Commercial Mole runs south 25° east (true) for 150 yards, and from that point north 88° east (true) to the shore.

These boundaries are delineated on the chart annexed to the Order in Council.

The term Queen's Harbour Master used in these regulations includes any person performing the duties of Harbour Master under the direction of the Senior Naval Officer.

- No merchant or other private vessel shall enter, anchor, or moor within Admiralty waters without the permission of the Senior Naval Officer; and no vessel having received such permission shall enter without a qualified pilot or other authorized person; but no such permission is required to pass through the northern entrance for the purpose of going to or coming from the Commercial Mole.

- To prevent chance of collisions with Her Majesty's ships, both in the northern entrance and in the southern entrance when vessels have permission to use it, the following regulations will be observed:—

When any of Her Majesty's ships are about to enter or leave Admiralty waters, and it becomes necessary to indicate the same by means of flags to insure the entrance being kept free, the following signals will be made:—

The Union Jack displayed at the masthead of the ship carrying the Senior Naval Officer's flag will indicate that the southern entrance is going to be used, and the Union Jack with a red flag immediately underneath it, that the northern entrance is going to be used.

In this latter case, a red flag will also be displayed at the boarding station and the dockyard.

When these signals are displayed, no merchant or other private vessel shall attempt to enter, leave, or get under weigh in Admiralty waters for the purpose of using the entrance indicated.

- Moorings for Her Majesty's ships, mark buoys or other aids to navigation, and such other buoys as may be required for any purpose in connection with naval or military operations, shall be placed by the Queen's Harbour Master, as from time to

time the requirements of Her Majesty's Service may demand.

4. Moorings for private vessels may be laid with the permission in writing of the Queen's Harbour Master, and in such positions as he shall deem fit, but such moorings shall be forthwith removed on the requisition of the Queen's Harbour Master to that effect.

5. If at any time the anchor of any merchant or other private vessel hooks any Government moorings, or any electric cables, or moorings for buoys, the master or other person in charge of such vessel shall not proceed to unhook the same, but shall forthwith give notice thereof to the Senior Naval Officer or Queen's Harbour Master, in order that aid may be given for clearing such moorings or cables without doing damage to the same.

6. No merchant or other private vessel or boat shall make fast to, or lie at, any of the Government buoys, piles, or mark buoys without permission from the Senior Naval Officer, or Queen's Harbour Master.

7. No ballast, stones, sand, earth, clay, refuse, ashes, rubbish, dust, sewage, filth of any description, or any other material shall be thrown overboard within that portion of the Admiralty waters enclosed by the breakwaters.

8. The steam syren shall not be used within Admiralty waters except to prevent collision or in case of fog.

9. All merchant or other private vessels within Admiralty waters shall carry out such instructions as they may receive from time to time from the Senior Naval Officer, or other officer acting on his behalf, with respect to putting out fires or lights or other precautions deemed necessary for the prevention of fire.

10. No fire-arms shall be discharged from any ship or other vessel or boat within Admiralty waters.

11. The master of every merchant or other private vessel, or person in charge of any boat to which these regulations apply, shall observe, and cause to be observed, the regulations as far as they apply to his vessel or boat; and if any master, or other person, acts in any respect in contravention of any of these regulations, or fails to observe or cause to be observed in any respect any of these regulations, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds.

NOTE.—The regulations for preventing collisions at sea made from time to time under the Merchant Shipping Act shall apply to all vessels and boats within Admiralty waters.

NOTE.—By an Order of the Secretary for Scotland, dated 27th July, 1891, the close time enacted by this section has been extended, so far as regards the county of Zetland, to the 31st day of August in each year.

SCOTLAND.

SOUTHERN DISTRICT.

The Wild Birds Protection (Stewartry of Kirkcudbright) Order, 1899.

WHEREAS by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1896, as applying to Scotland, it is, amongst other things, provided as follows:—

Firstly.—Any person who between the first day of March and the first day of August in any year shall knowingly and wilfully shoot or attempt to shoot, or shall use any boat for the purpose of shooting or causing to be shot, any Wild Bird, or shall use any lime, trap, snare, net, or other instrument for the purpose of taking any Wild Bird, or shall expose or offer for sale, or shall have in his control or possession after the fifteenth day of March, any Wild Bird recently killed or taken, shall, on conviction of any such offence before the Sheriff, in the case of any Wild Bird which is included in the Schedule hereunto annexed, forfeit and pay for every such bird in respect of which an offence has been committed a sum not exceeding one pound, and, in the case of any other Wild Bird, shall for a first offence be reprimanded and discharged on payment of costs, and for every subsequent offence forfeit and pay for every such Wild Bird in respect of which an offence is committed a sum of money not exceeding five shillings, in addition to the costs. This section shall not apply to the owner or occupier of any land, or to any person authorized by the owner or occupier of any land, killing or taking any Wild Bird on such land not included in the Schedule hereto annexed.

Schedule to Act of 1880 as amended by Act of 1881.

American Quail, Auk, Avocet, Bee-eater, Bittern, Bonxie, Colin, Cornish Chough, Coulteneb, Cuckoo, Curlew, Diver, Dotterel, Dunbird, Dunlin, Eider Duck, Fern-owl, Fulmar, Gannet, Goatsucker, Godwit, Goldfinch, Grebe, Greenshank, Guillemot, Gull (except Black-backed Gull), Hoopoe, Kingfisher, Kittiwake, Lapwing, Lark, Loon, Mallard, Marrot, Merganser, Murre, Night-hawk, Nightjar, Nightingale, Oriole, Owl, Ox Bird, Oyster Catcher, Peewit, Petrel, Phalarope, Plover, Ploverspage, Pochard, Puffin, Purree, Razorbill, Redshank, Reeve or Ruff, Roller, Sanderling, Sandpiper, Scout, Sealark, Seamew, Sea Parrot, Sea Swallow, Shearwater, Sheldrake, Shoreller, Skua, Smew, Snipe, Solan Goose, Spoonbill, Stint, Stone Curlew, Stonehatch, Summer Snipe, Tarrock, Teal, Tern, Thicknee, Tystey, Whaup, Whimbrel, Wigeon, Wild Duck, Willock, Woodcock, Woodpecker.

Secondly.—The Secretary for Scotland may, upon application by the County Council of any administrative county by Order prohibit—

- (1) The taking or destroying of Wild Birds' eggs in any year or years in any place or places within that county; or
- (2) The taking or destroying the eggs of any specified kind of Wild Birds within that county or part or parts thereof, as recommended by the said County Council, and set forth in the said Order.

Thirdly.—The Secretary for Scotland may, on the representation of the Council of any administrative county, order that the principal Act shall apply within that county, or any part or parts thereof, to any species of Wild Bird not included in the Schedule of that Act, as if that species of Wild Bird were included in the Schedule of that Act.

Fourthly.—The powers exercisable by the Secretary for Scotland shall extend to the making of an Order prohibiting, for special reasons men-

tioned in the application, the taking or killing of particular kinds of Wild Birds during the whole or any part of that period of the year to which the protection of Wild Birds under the Act of 1880 does not extend, or the taking or killing of all Wild Birds in particular places during the whole or any part of that period.

Now, therefore, I, the Right Honourable Alexander Hugh, Lord Balfour of Burleigh, Her Majesty's Secretary for Scotland, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the said Acts, and upon application by the County Council of the Stewartry of Kirkcudbright, do hereby make the following Order:—

I.—BIRDS.

1. The "Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880," shall apply within the Stewartry of Kirkcudbright during the currency of this Order to the following species of Wild Birds as if they had been included in the Schedule to the said Act, viz.:—

Bullfinch (*Pyrrhula europea*). Buzzard (*Buteo vulgaris*). Crossbill (*Loxia curvirostra*). Dipper (*Cinclus aquaticus*). Hawfinch (*Coccothraustes vulgaris*). Jay (*Garrulus glandarius*). Kestrel (*Falco tinnunculus*). Merlin (*Falco aësalon*). Osprey (*Pandion haliaetus*). Peregrine Falcon (*Falco peregrinus*). Quail (*Coturnix communis*). Raven (*Corvus corax*). Siskin (*Chrysomitis spinus*). Tufted Duck (*Fuligula cristata*).

2. The taking or killing of any of the following kinds of Wild Birds is prohibited, so far as concerns the said Stewartry, throughout the whole year during the currency of this Order:—

Buzzard (*Buteo vulgaris*). Chough (*Pyrrhocorax graculus*). Dotterel (*Eudromias morinellus*). Goldfinch (*Carduelis elegans*). Great-crested Grebe (*Podiceps cristatus*). Kestrel (*Falco tinnunculus*). Kingfisher (*Alcedo isilda*). Osprey (*Pandion haliaetus*). Owl, Barn (*Strix flammea*). Owl, Long-eared (*Asio otus*). Owl, Short-eared (*Asio accipitrinus*). Owl, Tawny (*Syrnium aluco*). Peregrine Falcon (*Falco peregrinus*). Woodpecker, Great Spotted (*Dendrocopos major*).

II.—EGGS.

3. The taking or destroying the eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited within the said Stewartry during the currency of this Order, viz.:—

Bullfinch (*Pyrrhula europea*). Buzzard (*Buteo vulgaris*). Chough (*Pyrrhocorax graculus*). Crossbill (*Loxia curvirostra*). Dipper (*Cinclus aquaticus*). Dotterel (*Eudromias morinellus*). Eider Duck (*Somateria mollissima*). Goldfinch (*Carduelis elegans*). Great-crested Grebe (*Podiceps cristatus*). Gull, Common (*Larus canus*). Hawfinch (*Coccothraustes vulgaris*). Jay (*Garrulus glandarius*). Kestrel (*Falco tinnunculus*). Kingfisher (*Alcedo isilda*). Mallard (*Anas bosca*). Merlin (*Falco aësalon*). Nightjar (*Caprimulgus europaeus*). Osprey (*Pandion haliaetus*). Owl, Barn (*Strix flammea*). Owl, Long-eared (*Asio otus*). Owl, Short-eared (*Asio accipitrinus*). Owl, Tawny (*Syrnium aluco*). 4. The taking or destroying the eggs of the Lapwing (*Vanellus cristatus*) is prohibited within the said Stewartry after the fifteenth day of April in each year during the currency of this Order.

III.—CURRENCY OF ORDER.

5. This Order shall take effect on the sixth day of February, 1899, and shall remain in force until the thirty-first day of December, 1901.

IV.—TITLE.

6. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (Stewartry of Kirkcudbright) Order, 1899."

V.—REPEAL.

7. The Order of 14th May, 1896, is hereby repealed.
