Greenock—Wreck Marked by Buoy.

THE Clyde Lighthouse Trustees have given notice, dated 10th January, 1899, that a wreck of a brig lies sunk in 22 feet at low water, with the north-west extreme of Prince's Pier bearing S. 62° W., distant 1¼ miles, and Roseneath Point N. 27° W. This wreck is marked by a green wreck-buoy.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in consideration of a benefaction of two thousand pounds sterling, which has been paid to us to be held or invested by us for the permanent spiritual benefit of the parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Dukinfield, in the county of Chester, and in the diocese of Chester, do hereby, in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, and subject as hereinafter mentioned, grant to the Incumbent for the time being of the vicarage of the said parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Dukinfield, one yearly sum or stipend of sixty pounds, such yearly sum or stipend to be payable out of the common fund under our control, and to be calculated as from the thirty-first day of December, in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight, and to be receivable in four equal portions, on the first day of February, the first day of May, the first day of August, and the first day of November in each and every year: Provided always, that the annual sum or stipend so granted by us to the Incumbent of the said vicarage shall be paid only upon the production to us on or after each of the said lastly-mentioned days in each and every year of a certificate under the hand of the Bishop of the said diocese of Chester, that an Assistant-Curate, duly licensed by such Bishop, has been employed within the parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Dukinfield aforesaid, during the quarter of the year then ended, and is in receipt of a salary after a rate of not less than one hundred and twenty pounds per annum: Provided also, that such yearly sum or stipend shall continue payable as aforesaid so long only as may to us appear to be expedient under the circumstances from time to time affecting the said vicarage and parish.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in consideration of a benefaction con-

sisting of a piece or parcel of land, comprising four hundred and fifty-four square yards or thereabouts, which has been permanently secured as a site for a parsonage or house of residence for the vicarage of All Souls, Radford, in the county of Nottingham, and in the diocese of Southwell, do hereby, in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, sections five and eleven, grant and appropriate out of our common fund to the said vicarage of All Souls, Radford, to meet such benefaction, one capital sum of two hundred and eighty-three pounds sterling, to be applicable towards defraying the cost of providing a parsonage or house of residence for the said vicarage, according to plans and a specification approved or to be approved by us, such capital sum, or the balance thereof unapplied to such purpose, to remain in the meantime in our hands at interest after the rate of two pounds and ten shillings per centum per annum, and such interest to be paid to the Incumbent for the time being of the said vicarage.
