BY an Order made in the above matters by Mr. Justice Wright dated the 12th day of January 1899 on the petition of George William Flowers Tomlin of Fernleigh Dunstable in the county of Bedford Gentleman a contributory of the above named Company it was ordered that the voluntary winding up of the said Company be continued but subject to the supervision of this Court and any of the proceedings under the said voluntary winding up may be adopted as the Court should think fit.
