NOTICES TO MARINERS.

(Nos. 30 to 36 of the year 1899.)

[The bearings are magnetic, and those concerning the visibility of lights are given from seaward.]

No. 30.—GREECE.

The Peiræus—Harbour Works.

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners No. 744 of 1898:—

The Hellenic Government has given further notice, dated 28th December, 1898, respecting the harbour works now in progress in the Peiræus:—

a. Fifty yards of the southern portion of the shoal off the saluting battery will eventually be removed by the dredging now in progress. The red fixed light hitherto shown from a red pyramid has been discontinued, and will be re-exhibited at the southern end of the remaining portion of the shoal when the work is completed.

During the operations the dredger employed (which will work from south to north) will show a red flag during the day and a red fixed light by night on her outer extremity as a mark for the limit of the passage.

b. The buoy (red) marking the works in connection with the breakwater extending from Cara Krakari is now moored near the position of its projected head, with Cara Krakari Column bearing N. 9° W., distant 1½ cables, and north extreme of Cape Miaulis N. 88° E.

Approximate position, lat. 37° 56' N., long. 23° 37' E.

c. From the point about 1½ cables westward of Cape Miaulis, it is proposed to construct a mole extending about 120 yards N.W. by W. from the point. A buoy will mark its proposed head before the work commences.

No. 31.—BRITISH COLUMBIA—STRAIT OF GEORGIA.

Sisters Rocks—Light Exhibited.

THE Government of the Dominion of Canada has given notice, dated 29th December, 1898, that a dioptric light of the 7th order has been exhibited from a lighthouse recently erected in the place of the beacon on the eastern of the Sisters Rocks, Strait of Georgia.

Sisters Rock Light is white fixed, elevated 46 feet above high water, and visible in clear weather from a distance of 12 miles.
