PRESENTATIONS.

The privilege of making presentations to The Queen at a Drawing Room is restricted to those Ladies who have themselves been previously presented to Her Majesty, and who are themselves present at the Drawing Room.

Under such circumstances a Lady has the privilege of presenting one Lady only at a Drawing Room in addition to her Daughters or Daughters-in-law.

This restriction does not apply to Ladies who, from official position or other circumstances, are specially priviléged to make presentations to Her Maiesty.

The Lady who proposes to present another must send in writing the name of such Lady to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than two days previous to the Drawing Room, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the name to Her Majesty, when, if it be approved, presentation cards will be forwarded.

Printed Forms for this purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Ladies to be presented be very distinctly written on the presentation cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Drawing Room, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

The number of Presentations at each Drawing Room is limited to 200,

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at the Drawing Room, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

Any Gentleman who under these circumstances should desire to be presented to The Queen will observe the same regulations as are in force for Her Majesty's Levces.

GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government. Board: Metropolis: Separate Workhouse Schools: Exclusion of certain Classes of Children:—

To the Guardians of the Poor of the several Poor Law Unions named in the Schedule to this Order;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by certain Orders issued by the Poor Law Board and by Us, the Local Government Board, regulations have been prescribed for the government of the Separate Schools provided for the reception and training of poor children by the Guardians of the Poor of the Poor Law Unions named in the Schedule to this Order, including regulations as to the admission of children into the said Schools, and as to the duties of the Medical Officers of such Schools; and it is expedient that further provision should be made as hereinafter mentioned in regard to the said Schools:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We do hereby Order that, notwithstanding anything contained in any of the Orders above referred to, the following regulations shall have effect in regard to the said Schools:—

ARTICLE I.—No child under the age of three years shall, unless We otherwise direct, be admitted into any of the said Schools.

ARTICLE II.—No child suffering from any contagious affection of the scalp or of the skin or of the eyes shall be admitted into any of the said Schools; and the order of admission to be signed by the Clerk to the Guardians, or by the Master of the Workhouse, as the case may be, prior to the admission of any child into the School shall not be given unless the Medical Officer of the Workhouse has examined the child on the day of

the proposed removal of the child to the School, or on the day immediately preceding, and has signed a certificate in the following form, which certificate the Medical Officer of such Workhouse is hereby required to give, upon the request of such Clerk to the Guardians or of the Master of such Workhouse, in every case in which, after due examination, he may find the child to be as therein described; that is to say:—

Medical Certificate.

I, the undersigned, do hereby certify that I have this day personally examined

, and that he is, in my judgment, free from any contagious affection of the scalp, of the skin, or of the eyes, and that he is in such a state of health as will permit of h taking part at once in the ordinary discipline and occupations of the School.

Medical Officer of the Workhouse of the Poor Law Union. day of , 18

ARTICLE III.—The Medical Officer of the School shall, once at least in every calendar month, and as often as may be necessary, examine each child in the School, and report to the Guardians immediately after such periodical examination the case of any child suffering from any contagious affection of the scalp, or of the skin, or of the eyes, and such child shall forthwith be separated from the children in health.

ARTICLE IV.—It shall be the duty of the Superintendent of the School to provide proper facilities for the examination prescribed by Article III of this Order.

ARTICLE V.—The provisions of this Order shall be substituted for any provisions contained in the Orders above referred to in regard to the admission of children into the said Schools, and to the periodical examination of the children in such School.

ARTICLE VI.—In this Order the expression "Workhouse" includes any House provided by the Guardians for the reception of children preliminary to their admission into the School.

ARTICLE VII.—This Order shall come into operation from and after the twenty-sixth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine

These Bye-laws shall extend and apply to all a main roads or other highways within the Administrative County of Lancaster, and within all | municipal boroughs therein having, according to the census of 1881, a population of less then 10,000, but shall not extend or apply to the permission or consent which may be granted by any municipal borough under sections 1 and 3 of the Locomotives Act, 1898.

Highways.

1. A locomotive shall not be used on any highway to draw more than three loaded or unloaded waggons, exclusive of any waggon solely used for carrying water for the locomotive, except with the consent of the County Council.

Where a locomotive, with the consent of the

County Council, draws more than three loaded or unloaded waggons, a communication cord shall be attached, connecting the rearmost waggon with the locomotive, so as to facilitate the stopping of the train, when required, by any person in charge of a vehicle overtaking the train, and one man shall be in or near the rearmost waggon.

2. Except as provided in the Bye-laws next following, a locomotive shall not be allowed to stand upon a highway for a greater length of time than 20 minutes, unless from accident the stoppage of such locomotive, for a period exceeding that time, has been rendered unavoidable.

3. Where the carriageway of a highway is for a distance of not less than 100 yards continuously of a less width than 16 feet a locomotive shall not enter thereon unless and until one of the persons in charge is sent forward to see that such highway is, in such narrow part, clear of all vehicles; and when the locomotive does enter thereon one of the persons in charge shall precede it at a sufficient distance, not being less than the length of such narrow part, to warn drivers of vehicles of its approach. , î,

A locomotive shall not, for the purpose of obtaining water, or for any other purpose, be allowed to stand on a bridge or culvert, nor shall the wheels thereof rest within ten feet of such bridge or culvert, except in the case of an accident, or from any other unavoidable cause.

General.

5. The Police may stop any locomotive, and examine it and the waggons attached to it, in order to ascertain whether the provisions of the Locomotives Acts, or any Bye-laws or orders made thereunder, have been complied with, and the owner, driver, or other person in charge of such locomotive shall stop it when required, and shall give all reasonable assistance in making such examination.

6. Nothing in these Bye-laws shall apply to a steam roller for the time being employed as such, within its jurisdiction, by any highway authority within the said county.

7. The Clerk of the County Council and his Deputies are authorized to act for the County

Council for the purposes of this Act.
