The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by section sixteen of "The Pluralities Act 1838" it is, amongst other things, enacted, "That whenever it shall appear to " the Archbishop of the Province, with respect to "his own diocese, and whenever it shall be "represented to him by the Bishop of any " diocese, or by the Bishops of any two dioceses, "that two or more benefices, or that one "or more benefice or benefices, and one or "more spiritual sinecure rectory or rectories, "vicarage or vicarages, in his or their diocese or "dioceses, being either in the same parish "or contiguous to each other, and of which the "aggregate population shall not exceed one thousand five hundred persons, may, with advantage to the interests of religion, be united "into one benefice, the said Archbishop of the " Province shall inquire into the circumstances of "the case; and if on such inquiry it shall appear "to him that such union may be usefully made, and will not be of inconvenient extent, and that "the patron or patrons of the said benefices, " sinecure rectory or rectories, vicarage or vicar-"ages respectively, is or are consenting thereto, " such consent being signified in writing under the "hands of such patron or patrons, the said Arch-bishop shall, six weeks before certifying such "inquiry and consent to Her Majesty as herein-" after directed, cause, with respect to his own dio-"cese, a statement in writing of the facts, and in other cases a copy in writing of the aforesaid "representation to be affixed on or near the prin-"cipal outer door of the church, or in some public " and conspicuous place in each of such benefices, " sinecure rectories, or vicarages, with notice to any person or persons interested, that he, she, or "they, may, within such six weeks, show cause in "writing under his, her, or their hand or hands, "to the said Archbishop, against such union; " and if no sufficient cause be shown within such "time, the said Archbishop shall certify the in-" quiry and consent aforesaid to Her Majesty in "Council, and thereupon it shall be lawful for "Her Majesty in Council to make and issue an "Order or Orders for uniting such benefices, "sinecure rectory or rectories, vicarage or vicar-ages, into one benefice, with cure of souls, " for ecclesiastical

T the Court at Windsor, the 7th day of ["shall be lawful for Her Majesty in Council to "give directions for regulating the course and "succession in which the patrons, if there be more than one patron, shall present or nominate to " such united benefice, from time to time, as the " same shall become vacant."

> And whereas the Lord Archbishop of Cauterbury pursuant to the provisions of the said Act, hath duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a certificate in writing, bearing date the twentieth day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine, in the words following, that is to say:

> "We the undersigned Frederick, Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury, Primate of All England and Metropolitan do hereby certify to Your Majesty in Council:

> "That the Right Reverend Edward Lord Bishop of Lincoln as Bishop of the diocese within which are situate the rectory of Creeton and the vicarage of Swinsted otherwise Swinstead both in the county of Lincoln having represented unto us that the said benefices being contiguous to each other and of which the aggregate population does not exceed one thousand five hundred persons and the aggregate yearly value does not exceed five hundred pounds might with advantage to the

interests of religion be united into one benefice,

we enquired into the circumstances of the case.

"That on such enquiry it appeared to us that such union might be usefully made and would not be of inconvenient extent and that the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain for and on behalf of Your Most Gracious Majesty (being the patron or person entitled to present to the said benefice of Creeton if the same were now vacant and the Right Reverend Gilbert Henry Heathcote Drummond Willoughby Earl of Ancaster being the patron or person entitled to present to the said benefice of Swinsted otherwise Swinstead if the same were now vacant) consent to the proposed union.

"That six weeks and upwards before certifying such enquiry and consent to Your Majesty in Council we caused a copy in writing of the aforesaid representation of the said Lord Bishop to be affixed on the principal outer door of the parish church of each of the said benefices with notice to any person or persons interested that he she or they might within such six weeks show cause in writing under his her or their hand or hands to us the said Archbishop against such purposes only; and it union and no cause has been shown.

"The representation of the Lord Bishop of Lincoln, our enquiry into the circumstances of the case, the statement of circumstances in reply thereto, the consent in writing of the patrons before referred to and the copies of the representation and notices before mentioned are hereunto annexed.

"And we do hereby certify the enquiry and consent aforesaid to Your Majesty in Council to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do, make and issue an Order for uniting the said benefices into one benefice with cure of souls for ecclesiastical purposes."

Now therefore Her Majesty in Council by and with the advice of Her said Council is pleased to order, as it is hereby ordered that the rectory of Creeton and the vicarage of Swinsted both in the county and diocese of Liucoln be united into one benefice with cure of souls for ecclesiastical

purposes only.

And Her Majesty in Council by and with the advice of Her said Council is further pleased to direct that the course and succession in which the respective patrons for the time being shall present or nominate to such united benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows: the first and second turns in every three turns shall belong to and be exercised by the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain for the time being his successors and assigns, and the third turn in every three turns shall belong to and be exercised by the Right Honourable Gilbert Henry Heathcote Drummond Willoughby Earl of Ancaster his heirs executors administrators or assigns and so on in the same order for ever.

HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, and of the Act of the seventeenth and eighteenth years of Her Majesty, chapter eighty four, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the twenty-sixth day of January, in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninetynine, in the words and figures following, that is

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Your Majesty chapter one hundred and thirteen and of the Act of the seventeenth and eighteenth years of Your Majesty chapter eighty-four have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for apportioning the income of the benefice (being a vicarage) of Soberton in the county of Southampton and in the diocese of Winchester between that benefice and a certain other benefice vizt. the benefice (being a vicarage) of the Holy Trinity Newtown which said lastnamed benefice is also situate in the said county Southampton and in the said diocese of

"Whereas the Right Reverend Randall Thomas Bishop of the said diocese of Winchester is as

such Bishop the patron of the said benefice of Soberton and also of the said benefice of the Holy Trinity Newtown and as such patron has expressed to us his desire that the apportionment of income between the said two benefices which is hereinafter set forth should be effected.

"And whereas it has been made to appear to us that the said benefice of the Holy Trinity Newtown is at present insufficiently endowed and that the said benefice of Soberton has endowments of such an amount as that after the apportionment of the same endowments which is hereinafter recommended and proposed shall have been effected and shall have come into operation the last-mentioned benefice will notwithstanding such apportionment be sufficiently endowed.

"And whereas we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England are of opinion that it is desirable that additional provision should be made for the cure of souls within the new parish of the Holy Trinity Newtown aforesaid by means of that apportionment of the income of the said benefice of Soberton which is hereinafter recommended

and proposed.

"And whereas the said benefice of Soberton is now full of a Clerk and the vicar or incumbent thereof the Reverend William Hammond Morley Clerk in Holy Orders is willing that the said apportionment shall be made accordingly and has executed this scheme in token of such his willing-

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Frederick Archbishop of Canterbury acting as Archbishop of the Province within which each of the said two benefices is situate in testimony whereof he has to this scheme set his hand and affixed his Archiepiscopal Seal and with the consent of the said Randall Thomas Bishop of the said diocese of Winchester acting as such Bishop and as such patron as aforesaid (in testimony whereof he has to this scheme set his hand and affixed his episcopal seal) and with the consent of the said William Hammond Morley acting as vicar or incumbent as aforesaid of the said benefice of Soberton (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day on which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the following apportionment of the income of the said benefice of Soberton shall without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same as aforesaid take place that is to say all those the apportioned tithe commutation rent charges belonging to the said benefice of Soberton and amounting to one hundred and seventy-two pounds seven shillings and seven pence per annum or thereabouts the particulars of which said apportioned tithe commutation rent charges are set out in the schedule to this scheme appended shall be severed from the said benefice of Soberton and shall be annexed and belong to the said benefice of the Holy Trinity Newtown.

"And we further recommend and propose that as from the day aforesaid and without any conveyance or assurance other than as aforesaid the incumbent for the time being of the said benefice of the Holy Trinity Newtown shall as to the tithe commutation rent charges to be annexed to his benefice as hereinbefore mentioned have all such rights and powers of ownership in respect of the same as are now enjoyed by the Incumbent of the said benefice of Soberton.

"And we further recommend and propose that

nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures or of either of them or of any other Act of relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them

"All that portion of the parish of Marton in the said county and diocese which has become isolated from the main portion of such parish by the formation of the consolidated chapelry of Saint Barnabas, Linthorpe in the said county and diocese and which is bounded upon all sides as follows namely, upon the south by the said consolidated chapelry upon the east by the new parish of the Holy Trinity North Ormesby in the said county and diocese and upon the north-east and upon the north-west by the said new parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Middlesbrough.
