

benefice (being a vicarage) of Chapeltown, the benefice (being a vicarage) of East Knottingley, the benefice (being a vicarage) of Holliseroft, the benefice (being a vicarage) of Saint Paul Sculcoates, the benefice (being a vicarage) of Saint Matthew, Carver-street, Sheffield, the benefice (being a vicarage) of Pitsmoor, and the benefice (being a perpetual curacy) of Saint Luke, Thornaby-on-Tees.

"Whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Saint Thomas Worsborough Dale is vested in Your Majesty and Your successors and in the Archbishop of York for the time being alternately.

"And whereas under the provisions of the twenty-first section of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Your Majesty chapter thirty-seven the right of patronage of and presentation to each of the twelve other benefices mentioned above at present belongs to and is exercised alternately by Your Majesty and Your successors and by the Archbishop of York for the time being.

"And whereas it has been proposed to us that the patronage of the said thirteen benefices should be assigned and transferred by way of exchange in manner hereinafter recommended and proposed.

"And whereas we have made due enquiry and calculation as to the circumstances and relative values of the said benefices and patronage and we do hereby certify to Your Majesty that the circumstances and present values of the said benefices respectively are as set forth in the schedule hereunto annexed.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend William Dalrymple Archbishop of York as the alternate patron of each of the said six benefices of Saint Thomas Brightside, Heeley, Saint Mark Hull, Saint Jude Eldon-street, Sheffield, Moorfields Sheffield and Saint Thomas Worsborough Dale (in testimony of which consent he the said Archbishop has affixed his signature and Archbishopal seal to this scheme) and with the consent of the Right Honourable Arthur James Balfour the First Lord of Your Majesty's Treasury acting on behalf of Your Majesty as the alternate patron of each of the said seven benefices of Chapeltown, East Knottingley,

Holliseroft, Saint Paul Sculcoates, Saint Matthew Carver-street Sheffield, Pitsmoor and Saint Luke Thornaby-on-Tees (in testimony of which consent he the said Arthur James Balfour has signed and sealed this scheme) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the alternate right of patronage of and presentation to each of the said six benefices of Saint Thomas Brightside, Heeley, Saint Mark Hull, Saint Jude Eldon-street Sheffield, Moorfields Sheffield, and Saint Thomas Worsborough Dale which now as aforesaid belongs to and is exercised by the said William Dalrymple Archbishop of York shall be transferred from him the said Archbishop and from his successors in the same Archbishoprick and shall thereupon and thenceforth belong to and may from time to time be exercised by Your Majesty Your heirs and successors for ever in such manner that the whole advowson of each of the said six benefices shall hereafter belong to Your Majesty Your heirs and successors for ever and that in exchange for the same the alternate right of patronage of and presentation to each of the said seven benefices of Chapeltown, East Knottingley, Holliseroft, Saint Paul Sculcoates, Saint Matthew Carver-street Sheffield Pitsmoor and Saint Luke Thornaby-on-Tees which now as aforesaid belongs to and is exercised by Your Majesty shall be transferred from Your Majesty Your heirs and successors and shall thereupon and thenceforth belong to and may from time to time be exercised by the said William Dalrymple Archbishop of York and his successors Archbishops of York for ever in such manner that the whole advowson of each of the said seven benefices shall hereafter belong to the said William Dalrymple Archbishop of York and his successors Archbishops of York for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament.
