The Block House Shoal Buoy will be discontinued, and a buoy placed to mark the northwestern extremity of the Middle Ground. The newly-formed channel immediately north of the Middle Ground will be buoyed.

Rapid changes are now taking place in this neighbourhood; these alterations must therefore be considered temporary until further notice is given.
