Gentlemen who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levées are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

PRESENTATIONS.

Gentlemen who propose to present others must send in writing the name of such Gentlemen to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than *two days* previous to the Levée, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the names to Her Majesty, when, if they are approved, Presentation Cards will be forwarded. Forms for the purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

Gentlemen who wish to be presented officially

should communicate with the heads of their Department, who will provide them with the necessary cards and instructions.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Gentlemen to be presented be *very distinctly written* on the Presentation Cards delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Levée, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

The State Apartments will be open for the reception of Company coming to Court at half-past one o'clock.

THE following Scheme for the adjustment of the property, rights, liabilities, &c., of the Urban District Council of Smethwick, in the county of Stafford, and for other purposes, as settled by a Committee of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, is published in pursuance of the provisions of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882.

WHEREAS by the Municipal Corporations Acts, 1882 and 1885, it is enacted that where a Petition for a Charter of Incorporation is referred to the Committee of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council and it is proposed by the Charter to extend the Municipal Corporations Acts to the Municipal Borough to be created by the Charter the said Committee of Council may settle a Scheme for the purposes in the said Acts named and containing such provisions as are in the said Acts particularized.

And whereas certain Inhabitant Householders of the District of Smethwick, in the county of Stafford, in the month of July, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, petitioned Her Majesty the Queen praying for a grant of a Charter of Incorporation.

And whereas the said Petition for a Charter was referred to the Committee of Council and it was proposed by the Charter to create the Local Government District of Smethwick hereinafter described a Municipal Borough and to incorporate the inhabitants thereof and by the Charter to extend the Municipal Corporations Acts to the Municipal Borough to be created by the Charter.

And whereas by an Order of Her Majesty in Council dated the twenty-second day of April, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-six, Smethwick was constituted a Local Government District

and was governed by a Local Board of Health constituted pursuant to and under the provisions of "The Public Health Act, 1848," but such Local Board of Health has now become an Urban District Council by virtue of the provisions of "The Local Government Act, 1894."

And whereas by "The Smethwick Local Board (Gas) Act, 1876" (hereinafter referred to as the Act of 1876) the Urban District Council of Smethwick (then known as the Local Board of Health for the district of the Hamlet of Smethwick, in the county of Stafford) and hereinafter referred to as the Local Board were empowered to acquire and have since acquired from the Corporation of Birmingham such portion of the Gas Undertaking of the Corporation as was within the district of the Local Board, and were also empowered to acquire the lands referred to in the Act of 1876, and to erect and maintain gasworks thereon and for such purposes were authorized to borrow such moneys as they might require for the purchase of such portion of the said Gas Undertaking, and in addition thereto such further moneys not exceeding fifty thousand pounds as they might from time to time require for the other purposes of the Act of 1876, and to secure the same by mortgage of the Gas Undertaking and the revenue of the same and the District Fund and General District Rates.

And whereas by a Provisional Order of the Local Government Board, dated the fourth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, and confirmed by "The Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation (No. 3) Act 1882," which Order and Act are hereinafter respectively referred to as the Order of 1882 and the confirming Act of 1882, the Act of 1876 was amended so as to enable the then Local Board now the Urban District Council of Smethwick, hereinafter referred to as the District Council, subject to the sanction of the Local Government Board, to borrow under the provisions of the Act of 1876 a sum not exceeding £75,000 in addition to the sum of £50,000 therein mentioned.

And whereas by another Provisional Order of the Local Government Board dated the twenty-fourth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, and confirmed by "The Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation (No. 9) Act, 1893," which Order and Act are hereinafter respectively referred to as the Order of 1893 and the confirming Act of 1893 the Act of 1876 was amended and so much of the confirming Act of 1882 as related to the Order of 1882 (except so far as the same had been acted upon) was repealed and such amendment and repeal enabled the then Local Board now the District Council with the sanction of the Local Government Board, to borrow on the security of the revenue arising from their Gas Undertaking and of the District Fund and General District Rate the respective sums of £6,000 and £14,328.

And whereas under and in pursuance of the Act of 1876 and of the respective Orders and confirming Act of 1882 and 1893, the District Council then the Local Board have borrowed the sum of £169,381 2s. 0d., the repayment whereof with interest is charged upon the Gas Undertaking and the revenue of the same and the District Fund and General District Rates.

And whereas £9,409 19s. 5d. part of the said sum of £169,381 2s. 0d., so charged as lastly mentioned, has been repaid.

And whereas a Sinking Fund has been formed for the payment of such of the moneys borrowed upon the Gas Undertaking of the District Council

as are not payable by yearly or half-yearly instalments and the amount now invested in such Sinking Fund is £22,459 19s. 9d.

And whereas the District Council has whilst acting as a Local Board of Health and since it has become a District Council, pursuant to and under the provisions of "The Public Health Act, 1875," borrowed various sums of money of which the sum of £135,751 now remains outstanding and unpaid.

And whereas a Sinking Fund has been formed for the repayment of the last-mentioned moneys and the District Council have now invested therein the sum or £21,728 15s. 7d.

And whereas it is expedient that provision be made for the continuance, transfer and vesting of the Gas Undertaking of the District Council and other property, rights, powers and privileges conferred by or acquired under the Act of 1876, and the respective Orders and confirming Acts of 1882 and 1893 as by this Scheme mentioned.

And whereas by an Order of Her Majesty in Council dated the nineteenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, made pursuant to the provisions of "The Burial Act, 1857," it was ordered that the Local Board of Health for the Hamlet of Smethwick (now the District Council) should be the Burial Board for the district of such Local Board.

And whereas the Local Board, in their capacity as Burial Board for the district of Smethwick, borrowed sums amounting to £9,500, which sums are still unpaid, but a Sinking Fund has been formed for the repayment thereof, and there is now invested in such sinking fund the sum of £1,436 2s. 7d.

And whereas the district of Smethwick was formerly part of the parish of Harborne, and such parish was divided into two Local Government Districts, namely, the Local Government District of Harborne, and the Local Government District of Smethwick.

And whereas under and by virtue of "The Elementary Education Act, 1870," and the various Acts amending the same, a School Board was formed for the parish of Harborne (which then included the district of Smethwick), and the two Local Government Districts of Harborne and Smethwick became one School Board District and the School Board for such district was known as "The Harborne School Board."

And whereas by a Provisional Order of the Local Government Board dated the fifteenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, and confirmed by "The Local Government Board's Provisional Order Confirmation (No. 13) Act, 1891," which Order and Act are hereinafter respectively referred to as the Order of 1891, and the confirming Act of 1891, it was provided *inter alia* that the boundary of the then existing city of Birmingham should be altered and extended so as to include amongst other places the Local Government District of Harborne and that the city so extended should be a School district and that the Harborne School Board should cease to have jurisdiction in any part of the added areas (one of such added areas being the Local Government District of Harborne) and that the school sites and buildings, furniture and fittings of the School Boards within the added areas should vest in the City School Board and that all contracts, debts, liabilities and engagements which on the ninth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, were existing or owing in respect of any such school sites, buildings, furniture or fittings should enure to and be discharged and satisfied by the City School Board.

And whereas it was by the said Order and confirming Act of 1891, provided that any doubt or difference arising in relation to the last recited provision should on the application of any of the School Boards interested stand referred to and be determined by the Education Department.

And whereas it was by the said confirming Act of 1891 also provided that the loans raised by each of the three School Boards therein mentioned (the Harborne School Board being one of such School Boards) and remaining unpaid on the ninth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, and the interest accruing thereon should be apportioned between the City School Board and each of the three School Boards respectively in the same proportions as the rateable value of the portion of the added area taken from each School Board District bore to the rateable value of the whole of such School Board District.

And that so much of the loans as should be apportioned to the City School Board and the interest accruing thereon should be charged on the School Fund and the local rate for the time being chargeable with the expenses of the City School Board and that all such sums should be repaid (or provisions made for their repayment) by the City School Board within the respective periods (if any) for which the loans were originally sanctioned.

And whereas it was by the said confirming Act of 1891 also provided that as regarded the annual charge for maintenance of the existing schools in the parts of the districts of *inter alia* the Harborne School Board not added to the city, the City School Board should contribute such an amount (if any) annually as might be agreed upon between them and the Harborne School Board or in default of agreement as might be determined by the Education Department.

And whereas by an agreement dated the second day of September, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, and made between the School Board for the city of Birmingham therein and hereinafter called the Birmingham School Board (but referred to in the Order of 1891 and the confirming Act of 1891 as "the City School Board") of the one part, and the School Board for the extra municipal part of the parish of Harborne, in the county of Stafford therein called the Harborne School Board (but now known as the Smethwick School Board) of the other part.

It was agreed that the Harborne School Board should remain indebted to the various mortgagees with whom loans had been contracted by them, but that the amounts of the principal and interest of such loans should be apportioned, and the Birmingham School Board did thereby become responsible for and agree to pay to the Harborne School Board (now the Smethwick School Board) the same proportion of the principal of the said loans and of the half-yearly payments of interest from time to time accruing due thereon as the rateable value of the added district as valued on the ninth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, bore to the rateable value of the whole of the district of the Harborne School Board, as such last-mentioned district existed immediately before the passing of the confirming Act of 1891, and that such payments should be made by the Birmingham School Board to the Harborne School Board (now the Smethwick School Board) half-yearly on the first day of December and the first day of June in each year;

And it was by the said agreement further provided that so much of the loans apportioned to be paid by and for which the Birmingham School

Board did thereby become responsible and the payments to be made in respect thereof should be and the same were thereby charged on the School Fund and Local Rate for the time being of the Birmingham School Board;

And that the proportion of the loans and interest to be paid as aforesaid calculated on the basis before mentioned was equal to one-fifth of the whole of the outstanding loans of the Harborne School Board and of the interest due on the ninth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, and thereafter to become due;

And whereas it was by the said agreement further provided that the annual contribution to be made by the Birmingham School Board to the Harborne School Board (now the Smethwick School Board) in respect of the annual charge for the maintenance of schools in that part of the district of the Harborne School Board which was not added to the city of Birmingham should be a sum bearing the same proportion to the total annual cost to the rates for the maintenance of all the Board Schools in the School District of Harborne (such School District of Harborne meaning that part of the District of the Harborne School Board not added to the city of Birmingham) existing on the ninth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, as the net produce of a penny rate in the part of the city of Birmingham formerly constituting the Local Government District of Harborne bears to the total net produce of a penny rate in the said part of the city together with the said School District of Harborne less a sum bearing the same proportion to the annual cost to the rates for the maintenance of the Board School in High-street Harborne existing on the ninth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, as the net produce of a penny rate in the School District of Harborne bears to the total net produce of a penny rate in the said School District together with the said part of the city and also that the cost to the rates for the maintenance of each school should be that shown in the Form IXB submitted to the Education Department for such school for the school year last ended before the twenty-ninth day of September in question, and also that the net produce of a penny rate shall be calculated from the produce of the school rate last collected before the twenty-ninth day of September in question.

And that nothing in the said agreement contained should prevent the said School Boards parties thereto from agreeing to substitute a fixed annual payment for the varying annual payments calculated according to the said agreement.

And whereas by a Provisional Order of the Local Government Board dated the fifth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, as altered and confirmed by "The Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation (Joint Boards) Act, 1877," by another Provisional Order of the Local Government Board dated the tenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, as confirmed by "The Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation Birmingham Tame and Rea, &c. Act 1881," and by another Provisional Order of the Local Government Board, dated the twelfth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six, as confirmed by the Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation (No. 12) Act, 1896, certain Urban Districts (including amongst others the then existing city of Birmingham and the Local Government District of Smethwick) and certain parts of Rural Districts were formed into a United District termed the Birmingham

Tame and Rea Main Sewerage District for the purposes mentioned in the Order of 1877.

And whereas the Birmingham Tame and Rea District Drainage Board being the Joint Board for the said United District and hereinafter referred to as the Joint Board now consists of certain elective and ex-officio members, one elective member being chosen by the District Council of Smethwick.

And whereas by an Order of a Joint Committee appointed by the respective Councils of the counties of Stafford and Worcester, and the county borough of Birmingham, made pursuant to the provisions of the Local Government Acts 1888 and 1894, and known as "The King's Norton Joint Committee Order 1894" it was provided that that part of the parish of Harborne outside the county borough of Birmingham (being the Local Government District of Smethwick) should be called and known by the name of the parish of Smethwick.

And whereas by another Order of a Joint Committee appointed by the respective Councils before mentioned and made pursuant to the powers given by the last-mentioned Acts and known as "The King's Norton Joint Committee Amendment Order, 1896," the name of the Harborne School Board was changed to that of the Smethwick School Board.

And whereas it is intended that arrangements shall be made for the consolidation of the Police Force of the borough of Smethwick when constituted by charter with the Police Force of the county of Stafford.

And whereas the parish of Smethwick for Poor Law purposes is part of and is situate in the King's Norton Poor Law Union, which Union comprises parishes situate in the counties of Stafford and Worcester, and the county borough of Birmingham.

And whereas the Public Libraries Acts, 1892 and 1893, are in force within the district of the District Council.

And whereas the following Acts have been adopted by and are in force within the district of the District Council, namely, "The Infectious Disease (Notification) Act, 1889," "The Infectious Disease (Prevention) Act, 1890," "The Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1890," and "The Private Street Works Act, 1892."

And whereas the District Council is the Urban Sanitary Authority for the said District of Smethwick, and such Urban Sanitary Authority, and the Guardians of the Poor of the King's Norton Union in the county of Worcester, and the Burial Board and the School Board are Local Authorities within the meaning of Part XI of the Municipal Corporations Acts, 1882 and 1885.

And whereas this Scheme was, before being settled by the Committee of Council, referred for consideration to Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, to the Local Government Board, and to the Committee of the Lords of the Privy Council on Education (hereinafter referred to as the Education Department).

And whereas it is expedient that a Scheme should be made and settled containing the provisions hereinafter set forth.

Now therefore pursuant to the Municipal Corporations Acts, 1882 and 1885, and every other power enabling them in that behalf the said Committee of Council have settled a scheme containing the provisions herein and do hereby direct, order and declare as follows:—

Preliminary Provisions.

This Scheme may be cited for all purposes as the Borough of Smethwick Scheme, 1899.

The Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Smethwick are in this Scheme referred to as the Corporation.

Borough and Municipal Borough mean the Borough of Smethwick.

The term "property" in this Scheme means and includes all property, real and personal, and all things in action, and all rights of common and commonable rights, and rights to toll, and all franchises, privileges, and rights which have any pecuniary value and all charters, records, deeds, books and documents, and all rights and all claims to relief, and all rights to avoid contracts or otherwise, and includes any estate or interest, legal or equitable, in or in respect of any property so defined.

Commencement of Scheme.

This Scheme when confirmed shall be deemed to have come into operation on the day of the first meeting of the Council of the Municipal Borough created by the said Charter and this Scheme shall be construed and applied as if it had been dated and confirmed by Parliament or Order in Council on the day before the day of the said first meeting and everything thereunder shall be done and had accordingly. This date is hereinafter referred to as "the commencement of this Scheme." So far as may be necessary this Scheme shall operate retrospectively.

Sanitary Authority.

The Municipal Borough created by the said Charter shall from and after the commencement of this Scheme and thenceforward be placed within the jurisdiction of the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the borough of Smethwick acting by the Council of the borough as the Sanitary Authority of the said borough.

Urban District Council Abolished.

The District Council and their powers, duties, rights, obligations, liabilities, and privileges shall continue and be deemed to have continued to exist until the commencement of this Scheme unaffected in any manner whatsoever by the grant of the said Charter or the creation of the said borough and the District Council shall from the date of the grant of the Charter until the commencement of this Scheme be deemed to have been continued and continue to enjoy, be subject to and exercise the said powers, duties, rights, obligations, liabilities, and privileges as if no such Charter had been granted and all their acts from the date of the grant of the said Charter until the commencement of this Scheme shall be and shall be deemed to have been as valid and effectual as if no such Charter had been granted. From and after the commencement of this Scheme the District Council and their district shall be abolished and shall thenceforth be dissolved and cease to exist.

Transfer of Jurisdiction, Property, &c., of Urban District Council.

All the jurisdiction, powers, duties and property vested in or possessed by the District Council, or by any person or body in trust for them or any of their members as such or applicable for the benefit or under the direction of the District Council, or any of their members as such (and not otherwise dealt with or transferred by or under any part of this Scheme) shall vest in the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the borough of Smethwick and shall be held and applied for the municipal and public purposes of the said borough.

All liabilities which immediately before the commencement of this Scheme attached to and were enforceable against the District Council or the property thereof, shall attach to and be enforceable against the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the borough of Smethwick.

Any investigations, legal proceedings or remedy in respect of any debt, liability, penalty or forfeiture due to or incurred by or on behalf of the District Council before the commencement of this Scheme, may be continued, prosecuted or enforced by or against the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the borough of Smethwick.

The District Fund and the General District Rate of the borough of Smethwick shall take the place of and be substituted for the District Fund and General District Rate respectively of the District Council and all sums of money respectively payable to, from or out of and all liabilities charged upon or attaching to the District Fund or General District Rate of the Urban District shall be paid to, from or out of and shall be charged upon the said District Fund and General District Rate of the said borough respectively.

With respect to the hereinbefore recited Acts and the Orders of the Local Government Board relating respectively to the Gas Undertaking of the District Council and to the Birmingham, Tame and Rea Main Sewerage District and to any matters and things to be done thereunder the following provisions shall have effect :—

The Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the borough of Smethwick acting by the Council shall be substituted for the District Council and all the rights, property, powers, authorities, privileges, duties and liabilities vested in, devolving upon or exercisable by the District Council shall be transferred to vested in devolve upon and be exercisable by and shall be enforceable against the said Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses.

No act done or purporting to be done under the authority of such Acts or Orders between the commencement of this Scheme and its confirmation by Parliament or by Order in Council (as the case may be) shall be invalidated by this Scheme but such act shall be and continue to be valid if the same would have been valid but for the operation of this Scheme.

All the rights, interests, powers, property, obligations and liabilities whatsoever of the District Council acting as the Urban Sanitary Authority of the district of Smethwick by virtue of the following Acts, namely, "The Public Health Act, 1875," "The Infectious Disease (Notification) Act, 1889," "The Infectious Disease (Prevention) Act, 1890," "The Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1890," and any Act amending or extending the same, the Sanitary Acts as defined by "The Public Health Act, 1875," "The Private Street Works Act, 1892," the Public Libraries Acts, 1892 and 1893, and any local or general Act for purposes the same or similar to those of the aforesaid Acts shall be transferred to, vested in, devolve upon and be exercisable by and shall be enforceable against the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the borough of Smethwick.

The Town Clerk of the borough of Smethwick shall be substituted for and perform the duties of the Clerk to the District Council.

Bye-Laws.

The bye-laws and regulations and lists of fees and charges made under the authority of any of the said Acts and now in force in the district of Smethwick shall until the same be repealed or

altered continue in force and be enforced within the borough.

The bye-laws for the good rule and government of the administrative county of Stafford, so far as they are now in force in the district of Smethwick, shall continue in force and be enforced within the borough of Smethwick, until the same are repealed or varied as respects the said borough.

Burial Board.

With respect to the Burial Board the following provisions shall have effect :—

From and after the commencement of this Scheme the Burial Board shall be dissolved and cease to exist.

The Council of the borough of Smethwick shall be substituted for the said Burial Board and all the rights, property, powers, authorities, duties and liabilities vested in, devolving upon or exercisable by the said Board shall be transferred to, vested in, devolve upon and be exercisable by and shall be enforceable against the said Council of the borough and the Council shall be the Burial Board for and within the said borough.

The clerk, officers and servants of the Burial Board shall become the clerk, officers and servants respectively of the Council of the Borough acting as the Burial Board of the said Borough.

The borough rate shall for all Burial Board purposes be substituted for the poor rate of the parish of Smethwick and all sums of money respectively payable to, from, or out of and all liabilities charged upon or attaching to the said poor rate in respect of things done by the said Council as a Burial Board shall be paid to, from, or out of and shall be charged upon and attach to the borough rate.

All regulations as to fees, charges and payments made by the Burial Board and in force at the commencement of this Scheme shall continue in force until the same are repealed or varied in manner provided by law

School Board.

The Smethwick School Board shall be the School Board for the Borough of Smethwick by the name of the Smethwick Borough School Board in all respects to the same extent and in the same manner as if at the time of the formation of the Smethwick School Board by the Education Department the Borough of Smethwick had been a Municipal Borough. Everything in connexion with the said Board shall be done, had and construed accordingly.

All the rights, interests, powers, property, obligations, liabilities and assets attaching to and vested in the Smethwick School Board immediately before the commencement of this Scheme, including those contained and comprised in the Order of 1891 and the confirming Act of 1891 and in the before recited agreement of the second September, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, shall be and continue attached to and vested in the Smethwick Borough School Board and all charges charged on the School Fund and in respect of liabilities of the Smethwick School Board on the Poor Rate of the parish of Smethwick immediately before the commencement of this Scheme shall respectively be charged upon the School Fund of the Smethwick Borough School Board and upon the Borough Rate or fund of the said Borough and not otherwise.

Any bye-laws made by the Smethwick School Board under the Acts relating to public elementary education and in force at the date of this Scheme shall continue in force and apply to the Smethwick Borough School District.

Any act done by the Education Department or the said Smethwick School Board or the Council of the said Borough or any Justice since the grant of the Charter shall be deemed to have been lawfully done if the said Department, School Board, Council or Justice might have lawfully done the same if no Charter had been granted or the said School Board had been the School Board for the said Borough.

Savings for Rates, &c.

Notwithstanding the incorporation of the borough and the provisions of this Scheme, all rates, assessments, compositions, charges, mortgages, contracts, leases, conveyances, deeds, documents, acts, matters and things made, entered into or done before the commencement of this Scheme by, to or with reference to the District Council shall be as good, valid and effectual to all intents and purposes whatsoever for, against and with reference to the Corporation, as if the same had been made, entered into or done by, to or with reference to the Corporation instead of the District Council, and may be proceeded on and enforced in the same manner in all respects as if the Corporation instead of the District Council had been party or privy to the same and been named or referred to therein.

Compensation for Existing Officers.

In case any officer of the District Council or of any of the public bodies for whom the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the borough of Smethwick, or the Council of the said borough are respectively substituted, who shall have been employed by the District Council or by any of the said public bodies as the case may be, shall not be employed for a period of two years from the commencement of this Scheme by the Council of the said borough or offered by the said Council for such period a position in their employ of a similar character, and of an equal value to that formerly held by him, such officer unless dismissed from his employment for misconduct shall be entitled to be paid, by way of compensation for the loss of his position, out of the funds of, or under the control of, the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the borough of Smethwick such gratuity or annual allowance as on a full consideration of the circumstances of the case may seem to the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, or any two or more of them to be a reasonable and just compensation for the loss of his position, and the said Lords Commissioners in awarding the said compensation shall be guided by the principles which would be applicable in the case of an award of compensation under the provisions of "The Superannuation Act, 1859," to a person retiring or removed from the public service in consequence of the abolition of his office.

Provided that no special minute within the meaning of the said Act, stating any special grounds for granting such allowance, shall be necessary or be made.

Provided that the term "officer" shall include any persons employed by the District Council whose salaries or emoluments are payable at intervals of not less than one month, and no other persons.

Provided also that the said Lords Commissioners or any two or more of them shall be the sole judges as to the right, title, or claim of any officer to any compensation whatever, and as to the amount thereof, and the said Lords Commissioners or any two or more of them shall be the only judges upon any question which may arise under this clause and further every determination of the said Lords Commissioners upon any such right,

title, claim, amount, or question, shall be absolutely final and conclusive, and every such officer shall have such rights only under this clause as the said Lords Commissioners or any two or more of them consider just and reasonable. Any determination of the said Lords Commissioners or any two or more of them may be evidenced by writing under the hands of any two of them.

The accounts of the District Council and their officers shall be (as soon as conveniently may be) audited by the District Auditor in like manner and subject to the like powers, duties, provisions, and right of appeal as if the Charter had not been granted and the provisions of sections two hundred and forty-seven and two hundred and fifty of "The Public Health Act, 1875," as amended by "The District Auditors Act, 1879," and any regulations duly issued by the Local Government Board with respect to the audit of accounts of Urban District Councils and of their officers shall apply to such audit and the provisions of this Scheme with respect to the District Council shall be construed so as to admit of such exceptions as may be necessary to enable such audit to be duly made, but such exceptions shall be strictly limited in time, extent, character and operation, to the purposes of such audit. Any money certified by the District Auditor at such audit to be due from any person shall be paid by such person to the Borough Treasurer.

Considering how long is the voyage made by such vessels, and that they cannot sail except with the monsoon in their favour, and cannot return to India during the present time.

Considering that on account of the want of proper means of guarding the coast (fiscalisation), the non-admission of dhows and similar sailing vessels might result in their landing at points of the coast where there are no authorities or means of rigorous disinfection.

Acting in conformity with the finding of the Board of Health,

It is decreed to annul the Decree No. 31 of January 17th, and allow the craft referred to to have free pratique after submitting to quarantine and rigorous disinfection.

No. 194.—SOUTH PACIFIC.

Tonga Islands—Non-Existence of Certain Outlying Dangers.

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners No. 753 of 1898:—

Further information has been received respecting the following reported dangers, in the vicinity of the Tonga, or Friendly, Islands; which having been searched for unsuccessfully by Captain A. M. Field, R.N., Her Majesty's surveying-vessel "Penguin," have been expunged from the Admiralty Charts:—

1. North Star Reef, marked on the Admiralty Chart in lat. $20^{\circ} 49' S.$, and long. $174^{\circ} 40' W.$, was reported by Captain Sir Everard Home, Bart., R.N., of Her Majesty's ship "North Star" in 1844. On 6th August in that year the "North Star" left Tongatabu in the evening under double-reefed topsails and fore topmast staysail, and shortly after midnight the foresail was set; at about 20 minutes to 1 A.M. on 7th August breakers were seen on the lee beam, and the helm was put down, but the vessel struck on a reef and was carried over it into deep water. A cast of 7 fathoms was obtained.

The area in the vicinity of this reported danger has been carefully sounded over for five days, and it is believed that the "North Star" must have struck on the reefs at the south-east side of the bank on which the Nomuka Group of Islands are situated, or in approximately lat. $20^{\circ} 34' S.$, long. $174^{\circ} 36' W.$, as no danger was discovered excepting in this position. The discrepancy in all probability arose from an insufficient allowance for leeway when under such easy sail as double-reefed topsails and fore topmast staysail.

The reef shown in lat. $20^{\circ} 49' S.$, and

long. $174^{\circ} 40' W.$, has consequently been expunged from the Chart.

2. Dangers on Nomuka Bank.—The southern and eastern sides of the Nomuka Bank have been recently defined by Her Majesty's ship "Penguin," and a line of dangers discovered extending in a southerly direction from Telekitonga Island for a distance of $11\frac{1}{2}$ miles to lat. $20^{\circ} 33' S.$, long. $174^{\circ} 36' W.$ Eastward of these dangers the depths increase rapidly to over 100 fathoms. As parts of these dangers break in the manner described by the Captain of the "North Star," there can be little doubt that that vessel struck hereabouts.

3. Sand-bank in latitude $19^{\circ} 52' S.$, longitude $174^{\circ} 7' W.$ —Captain A. M. Field also made a careful search for the sand-bank marked in the above position on the Admiralty Chart, occupying three days in sounding the locality and examining the ground for a distance of 30 miles eastward of the Haapai Group. No sign of any danger or of breaking water was discovered, the depth increasing gradually from the Haapai Group to 1,500 fathoms. This sand-bank has consequently been expunged from the Admiralty Chart.

4. Disney Reef, marked on the Admiralty Chart as P.D. in latitude $19^{\circ} 15' S.$, and longitude $178^{\circ} 40' W.$, was originally reported in 1841 by Captain Disney, of the whaling ship "Frolic," who obtained a sounding of 9 fathoms hereabouts.

This reef was searched for by His Imperial Germanic Majesty's ship "Hertha" in 1896, and in September, 1898, by Her Majesty's surveying-vessel "Penguin," also again in November, 1898, when soundings were obtained over a large area round its reported position without any sign of danger being discovered, or any shoaling of the water, the depths increasing slowly and steadily eastward of the Akkumanes Banks to 2,000 fathoms. It is therefore considered probable that Captain Disney really sounded on the Falcon Bank, which is in nearly the same latitude as the position he reported, but 24 miles further west. Disney Reef has consequently been expunged from the Admiralty Chart.

5. Bethune Patch, latitude $19^{\circ} 34' S.$, longitude $174^{\circ} 20' W.$ —Careful search was made for this patch, which was reported to have 3 fathoms on it, but no sign of danger was discovered. It had previously been unsuccessfully searched for by Her Majesty's ship "Espiegle" in 1884, and His Imperial Germanic Majesty's surveying-vessel "Gazelle" in 1876, and as none of the captains of the steamers running between Haapai and Vavau know anything of its existence it has been expunged from the Admiralty Charts.

6. Falcon Island, latitude $20^{\circ} 19' S.$, longitude $175^{\circ} 25' W.$ —On the morning of the 9th December, 1898, Her Majesty's surveying-vessel "Penguin" approached to within 2 miles of the position where Falcon Island formerly existed. Nothing was then visible above water, but the sea was breaking heavily over the area the island originally occupied. A notation to this effect has been placed on the Admiralty Chart.

7. Reef in lat. $18^{\circ} 0' S.$, long. $171^{\circ} 28' W.$ —This reef, reported as existing 4 miles westward of Funua Lai Island, was searched for unsuccessfully by Her Majesty's ship "Penguin," and has been expunged from the Admiralty Charts.
