TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S LEVÉES TO BE HELD AT ST. JAMES'S PALACE, ON BEHALF OF HER MAJESTY.

By Her Majesty's Command,

Gentlemen who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levées are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names clearly written thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

#### PRESENTATIONS.

Gentlemen who propose to present others must send in writing the name of such Gentlemen to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than two days previous to the Levée, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the names to Her Majesty, when, if they are approved, Presentation Cards will be forwarded. Forms for the purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

Gentlemen who wish to be presented officially should communicate with the heads of their Department, who will provide them with the necessary cards and instructions.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Gentlemen to be presented be very distinctly written on the Presentation Cards delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Levée, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

#### Privy Council Office, Whitehall. April 20, 1899.

THE following Scheme for the adjustment of the property, rights, liabilities &c. of the Urban District Council of Abergavenny, in the administrative county of Monmouth, and for other purposes, as settled by a Committee of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, is published in pursuance of the provisions of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1882":—

WHEREAS by "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1882," it is enacted that where a petition for a Charter of Incorporation is referred to the Committee of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, and it is proposed by the charter to extend the Municipal Corporations Acts to the municipal borough to be created by the charter, the said Committee of Council may settle a scheme for the purposes in the said Acts named, and containing such provisions as are in the said Acts particularized.

And whereas certain inhabitant householders of the urban district of Abergavenny in the administrative county of Monmouth, in the month of May, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven, petitioned Her Majesty the Queen, praying for a grant of a Charter of Incorporation.

And whereas the said petition for a charter was referred to the Committee of Council and it was proposed by the charter to create the said urban district of Abergavenny a municipal borough and to incorporate the inhabitants thereof, and by the charter to extend the Municipal Corporations Acts to the municipal borough to be created by the charter.

And whereas a Local Act of Parliament was passed in the thirty-fourth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act for paving and otherwise improving the town of Abergavenny and the limits thereof in the country of Manuarth"

in the county of Monmouth."

And whereas another Local Act of Parliament was passed in the fifty-fifth year of the reign of His said Majesty, intituled "An Act to amend an Act of His present Majesty, for paving and otherwise improving the town of Abergavenny in the county of Monmouth."

And whereas another Local Act of Parliament was passed in the seventeenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty the Queen, intituled "An Act for more effectually paving lighting and improving the town of Abergavenny in the county of Monmouth, for maintaining the markets within such town, and for supplying the same with water," and the said Act may be cited as "The Abergavenny Improvement Act, 1854."

And whereas the recited Acts of the thirty-fourth and fifty-fifth years of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third were repealed by the said "Abergavenny Improvement Act, 1854."

And whereas another Local Act of Parliament was passed in the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of the reign of Her present Majesty the Queen intituled "An Act for amending the Abergavenny Improvement Act 1854 for enabling the Commissioners to construct works, and supply their District with Water and Gas, and for other purposes," and the said Act may be cited as "The Abergavenny Improvement Act, 1860."

And whereas another Local Act of Parliament was passed in the thirty-fourth and thirty-fifth years of the reign of Her present Majesty the Queen intituled "An Act for amending the Abergavenny Improvement Act, 1860, and for other purposes," and the said Act may be cited as "The Abergavenny Improvement Act, 1871."

And whereas by a Provisional Order made by the Local Government Board intituled "Provisional Order for altering the Abergavenny Improvement Act, 1854," and confirmed by the Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation (Abergavenny &c.) Act, 1880, the Abergavenny Improvement Commissioners were empowered to purchase certain lands described in the Schedules of the Abergavenny Order (1) intituled "Provisional Order to enable the Sanitary Authority for the Urban Sanitary District of Abergavenny to put in force the Compulsory Clauses of the Lands Clauses Consolidation Acts, 1860, 1869."

And whereas by the said Local Government Board's Provisional Order intituled "Provisional Order for altering the Abergavenny Improvement Act, 1854," and confirmed by the said Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation (Abergavenny &c.) Act, 1880, the limits of the town of Abergavenny were altered and extended so as to include portions of the Rural Sanitary District of the Abergavenny Union, comprising certain portions of the parishes of Abergavenny and Llantillio Pertholey and a part of the division of Llanwenarth Citra.

And whereas under and by virtue of the provisions of the Local Government Act, 1894, the County Council for the administrative county of Monmouth have by an Order made on the twelfth July one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four and confirmed by the Local Government Board on the twenty-fourth October, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, combined the said portions of the parishes of Abergavenny and Llantillio Pertholey into one parish under the name of Abergavenny Urban; and by another Order, made on the third March, one

thousand eight hundred and ninety-six, and confirmed by the Local Government Board on the eleventh August, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six, added that part of the parish of Llanwenarth Citra, which was situate within the Urban Sanitary District of Abergavenny to the parish of Abergavenny as constituted by the said Order of twelfth July one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four.

And whereas the said parish of Abergavenny Urban and the Urban District of Abergavenny

are co-extensive.

And whereas by a Provisional Order made by the Local Government Board intituled "Provisional Order for altering certain Local Acts and a Confirming Act, and confirmed by the Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation (No. 15) Act, 1893," a certain portion of "The Abergavenny Improvement Act, 1860," was repealed and power was given to the Abergavenny Improvement Commissioners upon the land described in the Schedule to the said Order to construct, alter, enlarge, or when necessary remove buildings, apparatus, and works for the manufacture and storage of gas and residuals, and to borrow money for the purposes of their gas undertaking, and also to borrow money for the purposes of their market undertaking.

And whereas by virtue of "The Local Government Act, 1894," the title of the Abergavenny Improvement Commissioners was altered to that of the Urban District Council of Abergavenny.

And whereas "The Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1890," and "The Infectious Diseases (Notification) Act, 1889," have been adopted by the said Abergavenny Improvement Commissioners as the local authority described in those Acts.

And whereas a Burial Board was constituted under the Burial Acts in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty-three, for the then existing parish of Abergavenny now divided into the parishes of Abergavenny Urban and Abergavenny Rural.

And whereas the said Burial Board have borrowed the sum of six thousand nine hundred pounds for the purposes of a new cemetery for the aforesaid parishes of Abergavenny Urban and Abergavenny Rural, of which sum the amount of six thousand and thirty pounds is now outstanding.

And whereas the charges for interest and sinking fund upon the said sum of six thousand and thirty pounds and the costs and expenses attending the two cemeteries and the officials connected therewith are apportioned to the said parish of Abergavenny Urban and the parish of Abergavenny Rural in proportion to their respective assessable values to the poor rate.

And whereas under and by virtue of the provisions of "The Local Government Act 1894" the Burial Board ceased to exist and their powers duties liabilities and obligations were transferred to the Urban District Council of Abergavenny and the Parish Council of Abergavenny Rural and the powers and duties of the former Burial Board are now exercised by a joint committee consisting of eight members of the Urban District Council of Abergavenny and four members of the Parish Council of the parish of Abergavenny Rural.

And whereas under the provisions of the said recited Acts, and Provisional Orders, and under sanctions of the Local Government Board by virtue of "The Public Health Act, 1875," the total sum of ninety-six thousand pounds three shillings and ninepence has been borrowed for permanent works, of which sum the amount of sixty-two thousand pounds, part of the said sum

of ninety-six thousand pounds three shillings and ninepence, the repayment whereof is charged upon the improvement rates, rents, tolls, and profits, or some of them, of the urban district of Abergavenny, is still outstanding and unpaid.

And whereas the Urban District Council of Abergavenny are the urban sanitary authority for the said urban district of Abergavenny as extended by the said Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation (Abergavenny &c.) Act, 1880,—and the said Urban District Council is a local authority within the meaning of Part XI of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1882."

And whereas it is expedient that the County Council of the administrative county of Monmouth should retain in and for the borough of Abergavenny all the powers duties and liabilities in relation to the several matters set out in section thirty-nine of "The Local Government Act, 1888," which have heretofore been exercisable by or attached to the said County Council.

And whereas this scheme has been referred for consideration to Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, and to the Local Government Board.

And whereas it is expedient that a scheme should be made and settled containing the provisions hereinafter set forth.

Now therefore pursuant to "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1882," and every other power enabling them in that behalf the said Committee of Council have settled a scheme containing the provisions herein and do hereby direct, order, and declare as follows:—

#### Short Title.

This scheme may be cited for all purposes as the Borough of Abergavenny Scheme, 1899.

#### Commencement of Scheme.

This scheme when confirmed shall be deemed to have come into operation on the day of the first meeting of the Council of the Municipal Borough created by the said Charter, and this scheme shall be construed and applied as if it had been dated and confirmed by Parliament or Order in Council on the day before the day of the said first meeting, and everything thereunder shall be done and had accordingly. This date is hereinafter referred to as "the commencement of this scheme." So far as may be necessary this scheme shall operate retrospectively.

#### Sanitary Authority.

The Municipal Borough created by the said Charter shall from and after the commencement of this scheme and thenceforward be placed within the jurisdiction of the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the borough of Abergavenny, acting by the Council of the Borough as the Sanitary Authority of the said borough.

#### Urban District Council Abolished.

The Urban District Council for the Urban District of Abergavenny, and their powers, duties, rights, obligations, liabilities, and privileges, shall continue and be deemed to have continued to exist until the commencement of this scheme, unaffected in any manner whatsoever by the grant of the said Charter or the creation of the said borough; and the said Urban District Council shall from the date of the grant of the said Charter until such commencement be deemed to have continued and continue to enjoy be subject to, and exercise, the said powers, duties, rights, obligations, liabilities and privileges as if no such Charter had been granted, and all their acts from the date of the grant of the said Charter until the

commencement of this scheme shall be and shall be deemed to have been as valid and effectual as if no Charter had been granted. From and after the commencement of this scheme the said Urban District Council shall be abolished.

# Transfer of Jurisdiction, Property, &c., of the Urban District Council.

All the jurisdiction, powers, duties, and property vested in or possessed by the Urban District Council, or by any person or body in trust for them, or any of their Members as such (and not otherwise dealt with or transferred by or under any part of this scheme), shall vest in the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the borough of Abergavenny, and shall be held and applied for the sanitary purposes of the said borough.

All liabilities which immediately before the commencement of this scheme attached to and were enforceable against the Urban District Council, or the property thereof, shall attach to, and be enforceable against the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the borough of Abergavenny.

Any investigations, legal proceedings, or remedy in respect of any debt, liability, penalty, or forfeiture due to or incurred by or on behalf of the Urban District Council before the commencement of this scheme may be continued, prosecuted, or enforced by or against the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the borough of Abergavenny.

The term "property" in this scheme means and includes all property, real and personal, and all things in action, and all rights of common and commonable rights, and rights which have any pecuniary value, and all charters, records, deeds, books and documents, and all rights and claims to relief, and all rights to avoid contracts or otherwise, and includes any estate or interest, legal or equitable, in or in respect of any property so defined.

The Improvement Rates authorized by the Abergavenny Improvement Acts shall take the place of and shall be substituted for the rates leviable by the Urban District Council of Abergavenny, and all sums of money payable to from or out of and all liabilities charged upon or attaching to the said Improvement Rates shall be charged upon the said Improvement Rates leviable in the said borough.

The Council of the said borough shall not exercise any of the powers or duties or be subject to the liabilities under any of the Acts relating to the police force or other matters mentioned in section thirty-nine of "The Local Government Act, 1888," but all the powers duties and liabilities in respect of such matters shall be exercised by and attached to the County Council of the Administrative County of Monmouth and the area of the borough shall for all purposes of the Acts relating to the County Police Force or other matters mentioned in the said section form part of the county in like matter as if it were not a borough.

#### $Bye extbf{-}Laws.$

The Bye-laws and regulations of the Abergavenny Improvement Commissioners and the Bye-laws of the Urban District Council of Abergavenny, and the regulations made by the said Urban District Council as follows, in force at the commencement of this scheme, shall until the same are repealed, revoked, or varied by the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses, continue in force and be enforced within the borough in like manner and with the like effect as if the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses, acting by the Council, and the borough of Abergavenny were referred to therein instead of the said Improvement Commissioners or

the said Urban District Council, and the district of the said Commissioners or District Council; namely:

- (1.)—(a.) The existing Bye-laws made by the Abergavenny Improvement Commissioners with respect to regulating the use of the Town Hall and Corn Exchange and proceedings therein and for preventing nuisances and obstructions therein and in the approaches thereto.
- (b.) The existing Bye-laws made by the said Commissioners for preventing obstructions nuisances and offences in the public streets and public places within the town; for preventing street music; for regulating the use of public water closets and urinals and for preventing disorderly conduct by persons resorting thereto; and for preventing the defacing of walls and fences within the town by placards or writings upon such walls or fences.
- (c.) The existing Bye-laws made by the said Commissioners for regulating the use of the Cattle Market Place.
- (d.) The existing Bye-laws made by the said for the prevention Commissioners nuisances arising from snow, filth, dust, ashes, and rubbish, and for the prevention of the keeping of animals on any premises so as to be injurious to health.

(e.) The existing Bye-laws made by the said Commissioners for the district of Aber-gavenny acting as the Urban Sanitary Authority with respect to new streets and

buildings in the said district.

(f.) The existing Bye-laws made by the said Commissioners for the district of Abergavenny acting as the Urban Sanitary Authority with respect to slaughter houses in the said district.

(g.) The existing Bye-laws made by the said Commissioners for the regulation of the

general market at Abergavenny.

(h.) The existing Bye-laws made by the said Commissioners for the district of Aber-gavenny acting as the Urban Sanitary Authority with respect to the pleasure ground in the said district.

(i.) The existing Bye-laws made by the said Commissioners for the district of Abergavenny acting as the Urban Sanitary Authority with respect to new buildings in

the said district.

(j.) The existing Bye-laws made by the said Commissioners for the district of Abergavenny acting as the Urban Sanitary Authority with respect to hackney carriages in the Improvement Act District of Abergavenny.

(k.) The existing Bye-laws made by the said Commissioners for the district of Abergavenny acting as the Urban Sanitary Authority with respect to nuisances in connection with the removal of offensive or

noxious matters.

(1.) With respect to the alteration of buildings in the Improvement Act District of Aber-

(m.) With respect to new streets and buildings in the Improvement Act District of Abergavenny.

The existing Bye-laws made by the Urban District Council of Abergavenny.

(n.) With respect to common lodging-houses in the urban district of Abergavenny.

(o.) With respect to Bailey Park Pleasure Ground in the urban district of Abergavenny. (2.) The regulations made by the Urban District Council of Abergavenny under the Dairies and Milkshops Order, 1885.

The Joint Burials Committee.

From and after the commencement of this scheme the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgeses of the borough, acting by the Council, shall be empowered to appoint annually eight Members of the Council of the borough as their representatives on the Joint Committee for the purpose of burials established by virtue of the Local Government Act, 1894, for the parish of Abergavenny Urban and the parish of Abergavenny Rural.

Savings for Rates, &c.

Notwithstanding the incorporation of the borough and the provisions of this scheme, all rates, assessments, compositions, charges, mortgages, leases, conveyances, deeds, documents, acts, matters and things made, entered into, or done before the commencement of this scheme by, to, or with reference to the Urban District Council or their predecessors, shall be as good, valid, and effectual to all intents and purposes whatsoever, for, against, and with reference to the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses as if the same had been made, entered into, or done by, to or with reference to the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses instead of the Urban District Council or their predecessors, and may be proceeded on and enforced in the same manner in all respects as if the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses instead of such Urban District Council or their predecessors had been party or privy to the same and been named or referred to therein.

Compensation for Existing Officers.

In case any officer of the Urban District Council or any officer of any joint committee appointed in conjunction with any other authority shall not be employed by the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses, nor offered by the said Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses a position in their employ of a similar character and of an equal value to that formerly held by him, such officer shall be entitled to be paid by way of compensation for the loss of his position, out of the funds of or under the control of the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the said borough acting by the Council as the urban sanitary authority for the said borough such gratuity or annual allowance as on a full consideration of the circumstances of the case may seem to the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury or any two or more of them to be a reasonable and just compensation for the loss of his position, and the said Lords Commissioners, in awarding the said compensation, shall be guided by the principles which would be applicable to the case under the provisions of "The Superannuation Act, 1859," to a person retiring or removed from the public service in consequence of the abolition of his office. Provided that no special minute stating any special grounds for granting such allowance shall be necessary or be made. Provided nevertheless that if any officer be so employed by the said Council and discharged by them—otherwise than for misconduct—within two years of the first meeting of the Council he shall be entitled to compensation in the same manner as if he had not been employed by the said Council. Provided also that the term officer shall include any persons employed by the Urban District Council whose salaries or emoluments are payable at intervals of not less than one month, and no other persons. Provided also that the said Lords Commissioners or any two or more of them shall be the sole judges as to the right title or claim of any officer to any compensation whatever, and as to the amount thereof, and the said Lords Commissioners or any two or more of them shall be the only judges upon any question which may arise under this clause, and further every determination of the said Lords Commissioners upon any such right, title, claim, amount, or question shall be absolutely final and conclusive, and every such officer shall have such rights only under this clause as the said Lords Commissioners or any two or more of them consider just and reasonable. Any determination of the said Lords Commissioners or any two or more of them may be evidenced by writing under the hands of any two of them. But this clause shall not apply to any officer engaged or employed by the Urban District Council subsequent to the thirty-first December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six.

The accounts of the Urban District Council and their officers shall be (as soon as conveniently may

be) audited by the District Auditor in like manner and subject to the like powers, duties, provisions, and right of appeal as if the Charter had not been granted; the provisions of sections two hundred and forty-seven and two hundred and fifty of "The Public Health Act, 1875," as amended by "The District Auditors Act, 1879," and any regulations duly issued by the Local Government Board with respect to the audit of accounts of Improvement Commissioners and of their officers shall apply to such audit; and the provisions of this scheme with respect to the Urban District Council shall be construed so as to admit of such exceptions as may be necessary to enable such audit to be duly made, but such exceptions shall be duly limited in time, extent, character, and operation to the purposes of such audit. Any money certified by the District Auditor at such audit to be due from any person shall be paid by such person to the Borough Treasurer

Afterwards, although wounded, he continued firing steadily and coolly, and also helped to carry the wounded to the place prepared for them.  When Lieutenant Watson left, in order to fetch assistance for the wounded, Corporal Smith held the position till that Officer's return, exposing his life freely in watching the enemy and directing the fire of his men.
