REGULATIONS

TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S LEVÉES TO BE HELD AT ST. JAMES'S PALACE, ON BEHALF OF HER MAJESTY.

By Her Majesty's Command,

Gentlemen who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levées are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names clearly written thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

PRESENTATIONS.

Gentlemen who propose to present others must send in writing the name of such Gentlemen to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than two days previous to the Levée, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the names to Her Majesty, when, if they are approved, Presentation Cards will be forwarded. Forms for the purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

Gentlemen who wish to be presented officially should communicate with the heads of their Department, who will provide them with the necessary cards and instructions.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Gentlemen to be presented be very distinctly written on the Presentation Cards delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Levée, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

The State Apartments will be open for the reception of Company coming to Court at half-HOPETOUN, past one o'clock.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Representative at Sofia enclosing the following Quarantine Notice issued by the Bulgarian Government, viz.:—

Circulaire.

A Messieurs les Médecins de quarantine à Varna et Bourgas, les Médecins d'arrondissement à Aitos, Baltchik, Toutrakan, Nicopol, Rahovo, Tzeribrod, Doubnitza et Harmanli.

A tous les Préfets et Médecins de district, les Directeurs de douanes et les chefs des postes-

douaniers.

D'après les renseignements parvenus jusqu'à présent, il est établi que la peste n'a pas diminué en Arabie et qu'avec le retour des pélérins musulmans de la Mecque, il y a danger que la peste ne soite transporté à Constantinople ou dans un autre endroit de la Turquie d'Europe. Il n'y a pas de doute que dans ce cas la Bulgarie, comme voisine de la Turquie, sera exposée en premier lieu à ce danger.

En conséquence et pour protéger la Principauté par son ordonnance No. VI du 6 Mars, a.c., le Conseil des Ministres a approuvé la décision suivante du Conseil Médical Supérieur du 23

Février.

1. Au cas où la peste ferait apparition à Constantinople ou dans un autre endroit de la Turquie d'Europe, les mesures suivantes seront immédiatement appliquées:

(a.) Constantinople ou l'endroit où il y aurait un cas de peste seront déclarés comme contaminés.

(b.) Les voyageurs arrivant de Constantinople ne pourront entrer dans la Principauté que par Varna, Bourgas et Hebibtchévo.

(c.) Les voyageurs seront soumis à une quarantaine de dix jours et leurs effets, bagages ainsi que les récipients contenant l'eau bénite subiront une désinfection par la vapeur, les provisions des voyageurs seront brulées.

(d.) Les quarantaines seront organisées d'après le service des hôpitaux, en fournissant la nourriture à tous ceux qui seront entrés en quarantaine conformément au réglement en vigueur.

(e.) La taxe de traitement sera 2 frs. par jour.

(f.) Ceux des ressortissants bulgares qui sont indigents, seront recus gratuitement. Après leur sortie de la quarantaine, ils devront certifier leur indigence par un certificat communal, dans le cas contraire, la taxe sera percue par voie exécutoire.

(g.) Après leur sortie de la quarantaine, les voyageurs seront soumis dans leurs résidences à une surveillance de cinq jours. A cet effet, les détails et les formalités seront réglés par la Direction Sanitaire.

(h.) Au cas où la peste ferait apparition en ; Macédoine, les voyageurs qui arrivent de cette province ne pourront entrer dans la Principauté que par Dédé-Bair et Kotcharinovo d'après la manière indiquée dans les § § c., d., e., f., et g.

(i.) Les trains arrivant de la Turquie s'arrê-

teront à Hébibtchévo et, après avoir déchargé les voyageurs et leurs bagages, retourneront en

Turquie.

(j.) Les voyageurs qui quittent la quarantaine pour entrer dans la Principauté devront prendre des trains purifiés.

(k.) Ne pourront entrer en Bulgarie aucunes marchandises provenant d'endroite contaminés.

(1.) Des pharmacies de quarantaine seront organisées et le personnel nécessaire de médecins, pharmaciens, infirmiers, soeurs de charité, domestiques, &c., qui sera pris des hôpitaux existants sera institué auprès des quarantaines.

(m.) Il sera payé double appointement à tout le personnel sanitaire et aux domestiques auprès

de la quarantaine.

(n.) Les quarantaines seront pourvues dès à présent de serum contre la peste et d'instruments

nécessaires à cet effet ; et

(o.) En ce qui concerne la garde-frontière et les propriétés mixtes, des instructions complémentaires seront données par le Ministère de l'Intérieur en base d'une décision du Conseil Médical Supérieur pour chaque cas réparé.

Les mesures susmentionnées seront appliquées dès que Constantinople ou un autre endroit de la Turquie d'Europe serait déclaré comme contaminé par la peste, et des dispositions nouvelles seront

prises à cet effet.
