

(h.) Au cas où la peste ferait apparition en Macédoine, les voyageurs qui arrivent de cette province ne pourront entrer dans la Principauté que par Dédé-Bair et Kotcharinovo d'après la manière indiquée dans les §§ c., d., e., f., et g.

(i.) Les trains arrivant de la Turquie s'arrêteront à Hébibtchévo et, après avoir déchargé les voyageurs et leurs bagages, retourneront en Turquie.

(j.) Les voyageurs qui quittent la quarantaine pour entrer dans la Principauté devront prendre des trains purifiés.

(k.) Ne pourront entrer en Bulgarie aucunes marchandises provenant d'endroit contaminés.

(l.) Des pharmacies de quarantaine seront organisées et le personnel nécessaire de médecins, pharmaciens, infirmiers, soeurs de charité, domestiques, &c., qui sera pris des hôpitaux existants sera institué auprès des quarantaines.

(m.) Il sera payé double appointement à tout le personnel sanitaire et aux domestiques auprès de la quarantaine.

(n.) Les quarantaines seront pourvues dès à présent de serum contre la peste et d'instruments nécessaires à cet effet ; et

(o.) En ce qui concerne la garde-frontière et les propriétés mixtes, des instructions complémentaires seront données par le Ministère de l'Intérieur en base d'une décision du Conseil Médical Supérieur pour chaque cas réparé.

Les mesures susmentionnées seront appliquées dès que Constantinople ou un autre endroit de la Turquie d'Europe serait déclaré comme contaminé par la peste, et des dispositions nouvelles seront prises à cet effet.
