Gentlemen who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levées are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

## PRESENTATIONS.

Gentlemen who propose to present others must send in writing the name of such Gentlemen to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than *two days* previous to the Levée, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the names to Her Majesty, when, if they are approved, Presentation Cards will be forwarded. Forms for the purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

Gentlemen who wish to be presented officially should communicate with the heads of their Department, who will provide them with the necessary cards and instructions.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Gentlemen to be presented be *very distinctly written* on the Presentation Cards delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Levée, in order that

there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

**THE** following Address was presented to Her Majesty on the occasion of the laying of the Foundation Stone of the Victoria and Albert Museum, South Kensington, on the 17th instant.

The Right Honourable Sir Matthew White Ridley, Bart., Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, was in attendance on Her Majesty:—

*May it please Your Majesty,*

WE, the Lords of the Committee of Council on Education, approach Your Majesty with the expression of our heartfelt affection and loyalty.

It is interesting to note, in connection with the ceremony in which Your Majesty has so graciously consented to take part, that the germ of the movement which expanded into the formation of the South Kensington Museum can be traced to the auspicious year of Your Majesty's Accession.

Beginning with the purchase, in 1837, of a few objects for the purpose of instruction in Design and Ornamental Art in a School of Design which was opened at Somerset House on the 1st of June in the same year, a Museum of Ornamental Art (including a large number of objects purchased for the Nation from the Great Exhibition of 1851) was inaugurated at Marlborough House on the 6th of September, 1852.

It was subsequently decided to form a systematic collection representing the application of Fine Art to industry of all periods, the first, as it is appears, of its kind in Europe, and; with the view to rendering it in the highest degree instructional, attention was specially directed to the illustration of the progress and highest excellence attained in manufacture, as to treatment, workmanship, and decoration.

The next step was the removal of the collections to South Kensington, and their installation in the present buildings.

This was largely due to the instrumentality of Your Majesty's Illustrious and Lamented Consort, who, as Chairman of the Royal Commission for the Exhibition of 1851, proposed that the surplus of £150,000 should be expended on the purchase of land to be devoted to Institutions for promoting Science and Art.

By the co-operation of Parliament, an estate of 88 acres was procured, and the Museum erected, which was opened by Your Majesty, accompanied by the Prince Consort, on June 22nd, 1857, and has since been declared to be under Your Majesty's "special and personal protection."

Upon the benefits conferred by such an Institution on the various industries, to which Art is a handmaid it is unnecessary to dwell. They have been abundantly recognized by the manufacturers of this country, and the testimony and imitation of our principal competitors abroad.

By the unexampled bounty of private donors and the liberality of Parliament the collections have increased so enormously, and the educational functions of the Museum, in connection with local ancillary institutions have been so widely extended, that the task of completing the building could no longer be delayed with safety to its contents or proper arrangements for their exhibition, and Your Majesty is now asked to take the initial step towards housing them in a manner which shall be adequate for their accommodation, and worthy, from an architectural point of view, of the priceless value and importance of the objects themselves.

In praying Your Majesty to associate yourself with this, the crowning act of a long series of beneficent labours for the peaceful progress and industrial enlightenment of Your people, and to give the Museum a name that shall commemorate the august influences by which it was established and fostered, it is our earnest hope that, when complete, it may for successive generations witness to the silent yet persuasive supremacy of those educational and moral forces the growth of which has so emphatically signalized the long and prosperous reign of our most gracious Sovereign.

To which Address Her Majesty was pleased to return the following Most Gracious Answer:—

"I THANK you for your Loyal and Dutiful Address.

"It is a great pleasure to Me to be here to lay the Foundation Stone of the Building which will worthily contain the magnificent Collection of objects illustrating the Fine and Industrial Arts which have been brought together on this site during the period of My Reign.

"My interest in this great Institution, which, in its inception and during its early days, I shared with My dear Husband, has grown with its progress and development; and I rejoice that I have been able to take a personal part in the completion of a Scheme which will be not the least Distinction of My Reign, and which will, I trust, continue to be a powerful factor in the industrial enlightenment and the artistic training of My people.

"I am pleased that the priceless Collection of treasures which the munificence of private persons and the Public Spirit of Parliament have brought together will always be associated with My name and My dear Husband's. In compliance with your Prayer, I gladly direct that in future this Institution shall be styled 'the Victoria

and Albert Museum'; and I trust that it will remain for ages a Monument of discerning Liberality and a Source of Refinement and Progress."

THE Japanese Government has given notice, dated 13th March, 1899, that the Master of the steamship "Tsukishima Maru" reports having passed close to the assigned position of Boudrouet Rocks, off the east coast of Formosa, without seeing any indication of their existence, though a careful look-out at the masthead was kept for them.

These rocks were originally reported in December, 1864, by M. Boudrouet, of the French ship "Robur," who described them as a group of rocks about 20 metres high, perpendicular on all sides, and distant about 4 or 5 miles: they do not appear to have been seen since.

In 1898, the Captain of His Imperial Majesty's Austrian ship "Frundsberg" reported that his vessel (approaching from the south-westward) passed at about 5 miles from the reputed position of these rocks without seeing them, but at the same time he saw, dipping on the horizon, Kurmi Island, which appeared like a scattered group of small rocks. It is probable that M. Boudrouet saw Kurmi Island a long way off appearing like rocks, that a rain squall hid it for a time whilst he was sailing towards it, and that when he next saw Kurmi Island he recognized it.

The above reports are considered sufficient to justify the belief that Boudrouet Rocks do not exist; they have therefore been erased from the Charts.
