Gentlemen who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levées are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

PRESENTATIONS.

Gentlemen who propose to present others must send in writing the name of such Gentlemen to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than *two days* previous to the Levée, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the names to Her

Majesty, when, if they are approved, Presentation Cards will be forwarded. Forms for the purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

Gentlemen who wish to be presented officially should communicate with the heads of their Department, who will provide them with the necessary cards and instructions.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Gentlemen to be presented be *very distinctly written* on the Presentation Cards delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Levée, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

THE following Address of the Ministers and Elders of the Church of Scotland convened in General Assembly, having been transmitted by His Grace the Lord High Commissioner to the Right Honourable Lord Balfour of Burleigh, Her Majesty's Secretary for Scotland, has been by him laid before the Queen, who was pleased to receive the same very graciously:—

To the QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty.

May it please Your Majesty,

WE, Your Majesty's faithful subjects, the Members of the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland, have been deeply gratified by the terms of the gracious Letter sent to us by Your Majesty through His Grace the Lord High Commissioner. That our Meeting and proceedings are observed with such interest by our revered Sovereign will be a further stimulus to us to be watchful guardians of the Reformed faith, and to labour for the moral and religious welfare of the people committed to our charge.

We and those whom we represent always receive with gladness Your Majesty's renewed assurances of Your purpose to countenance and support the Church of Scotland, and to maintain it in the full possession of its rights and privileges. If anything were needed to deepen our loyalty, it would be found in the confirmation given to these assurances by Your Majesty's joining in the ordinances of our National worship during Your residences in Scotland. We find ourselves strengthened in our endeavours to promote the happiness and spiritual advancement of our

people, by our Monarch's sharing in the offices of religion through which we endeavour to promote these ends, as well as by Her ready sympathy with the joys and sorrows of all who are under Her rule.

The occurrence of Your Majesty's eightieth birthday during our Session enables the Assembly to express in this form, as well as by a special religious service, their gratitude to Almighty God for continuing through so many years a life and reign so rich in blessing to the Empire. We feel that for the stability which has accompanied its remarkable progress and expansion, and for the hope of peaceful and prosperous times in the future, we are in great measure indebted to the wise and impartial rule of our earthly Sovereign under the Supreme Majesty of our Heavenly King. Our earnest prayer to Him is that for the confirmation and increase of these blessings Your Majesty's life may be prolonged and its example be thereafter transmitted with the Crown to many generations.

The General Assembly congratulates itself on the appointment of the Right Honourable the Earl of Leven and Melville as Lord High Commissioner. His selection by Your Majesty as representative of the Sovereign, and our recollections of his uniform courtesy during his former tenure of the office, make his return among us doubly welcome.

We have to express our gratitude for the generous gift of which he is the bearer, and to assure Your Majesty that it will be our care to employ it so as to further the ends for which it has been bestowed.

We trust that in this and all the other duties to which we are called at this time we shall have the guidance of Him, to whose Fatherly care Your Majesty commends us, and that all our Counsels will be carried out in a Christian spirit. When our deliberations are concluded we shall continue to pray that the Divine Blessing may be with Your Majesty here and hereafter.

May it please Your Majesty, Your Majesty's loyal Subjects and Servants, the Ministers and Elders of the Church of Scotland convened in General Assembly.

Whereas We have deemed it expedient that a Commission should forthwith issue to inquire into the causes of the accidents, fatal and non-fatal, to servants of Railway Companies and of truck owners, and to report on the possibility of adopting means to reduce the number of such accidents, having regard to the working of railways, the rules and regulations made, and the safety appliances used by Railway Companies :

Now know ye that We, reposing great trust and confidence in your knowledge and ability, have nominated, constituted, and appointed, and do by these Presents nominate, constitute, and appoint, you, the said Henry, Baron James of Hereford ; Henry Robert, Viscount Hampden ; Ailwyn Edward Fellowes ; Sir George Ernest Paget ; Sir John Wolfe Wolfe-Barry ; Sir Guilford Lindsey Molesworth ; Sir Alfred Hickman ; Sir Charles Scotter ; Charles Scrope Hutchinson ; Henry Hardinge Samuel Cunynghame ; William Mitchell Acworth ; Archibald Campbell Elliott ; John Edward Ellis ; Charles Fenwick ; and Walter Hudson to be Our Commissioners for the purposes of the said inquiry.

And for the better effecting the purposes of this Our Commission, We do by these Presents give and grant unto you, or any five or more of you, full power to call before you such persons as you shall judge likely to afford you any information upon the subject of this Our Commission ; and also to call for, have access to, and examine all such books, documents, registers, and records as may afford you the fullest information on the subject ; and to inquire of and concerning the premises by all other lawful ways and means whatsoever.

And We do by these Presents authorize and empower you, or any five or more of you, to visit and personally inspect such places as you may deem it expedient so to inspect for the more effectual carrying out of the purposes aforesaid, and to employ such persons as you may think fit to assist you in conducting any inquiry which you may hold.

And We do by these Presents will and ordain that this Our Commission shall continue in full force and virtue, and that you Our said Commissioners, or any five or more of you, may from time to time proceed in the execution thereof, and of every matter and thing therein contained, although the same be not continued from time to time by adjournment.

And We do further ordain that you, or any five or more of you, have liberty to report your proceedings under this Our Commission from time to time if you shall judge it expedient so to do.

And Our further will and pleasure is that you do, with as little delay as possible, report to Us under your hands and seals, or under the hands and seals of any five or more of you, your opinion upon the matter herein submitted for your consideration.

And for the purpose of aiding you in your inquiries, We hereby appoint Our trusty and well-beloved Alfred Herbert Higgins, Esquire, Barrister-at-Law, to be Secretary to this Our Commission.

THE COLONIAL AUXILIARY FORCES OFFICERS' DECORATION WARRANT.

VICTORIA, R.I.

WHEREAS it is Our desire to recognize the long and meritorious services of Commissioned Officers of Our Colonial Auxiliary Forces, and of others who shall be eligible under the conditions herein laid down, We do hereby constitute and create, as a reward for these services, a new Decoration, which shall be designated "The Colonial Auxiliary Forces Officers' Decoration."

It is Our will and pleasure that this Decoration shall be conferred on the Commissioned Officers of all organized Military Forces, except the permanent Forces, serving in Our Colonies and Dependencies, or raised for Our Service in countries under Our protection, whether designated as Militia or Volunteers, or otherwise, subject to the following rules:—

The period of service requisite to qualify for this Decoration shall be twenty years' commissioned service. Half the time served in the ranks of any such forces shall be reckoned as qualifying service. Service on the West Coast of Africa shall reckon double as qualifying service.

Service rendered partly in the local forces of one Colony or Protectorate, and partly in the local forces of another Colony or Protectorate, or partly in the local forces of one or more Colonies or Protectorates, and partly in the Volunteer Force of Great Britain, shall be reckoned as qualifying service for the Decoration, provided that no Officer shall be eligible unless at least half of his qualifying service has been rendered in the Militia or Volunteer Forces of one or more Colonies or Protectorates, service on the West Coast of Africa counting double.

Service on the permanent staff shall not reckon as qualifying service for this decoration.

Service qualifying for this decoration shall also count towards the qualifying service necessary for "The Volunteer Officers' Decoration," provided that no officer shall be eligible for such decoration, unless 10 years' commissioned service, or the equivalent thereof, has been spent in the Volunteer Force of Great Britain.

It is Our further will and pleasure that this decoration shall be conferred under such regulations as to grant, forfeiture, and restoration, as may from time to time be submitted by the Governor-General of Our Dominion of Canada, or by the Governors of Our Colonies and Dependencies, or

by Our representatives in countries under Our protection, and as may be approved by Our Principal Secretary of State for War upon the recommendation of Our Principal Secretary of State for the Colonies. The regulations aforesaid shall as far as possible correspond with those laid down for "The Volunteer Officers' Decoration."

Our Warrant of the twenty-fourth May, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, save and except so much of it as relates to Our Indian Empire, is hereby cancelled.

THE COLONIAL AUXILIARY FORCES LONG SERVICE MEDAL WARRANT.

VICTORIA, R.I.

WHEREAS it is Our desire to recognize the long and meritorious services of members of Our Colonial Auxiliary Forces, and of others who shall be eligible under the conditions herein laid down, We do hereby constitute and create, as a reward for these services, a new Medal, which shall be designated "The Colonial Auxiliary Forces Long Service Medal."

It is Our will and pleasure that this Medal shall be awarded to the members of all organized Military Forces, except the permanent Forces serving in Our Colonies and Dependencies, or raised for Our Service in countries under Our protection, whether designated as Militia or Volunteers, or otherwise, subject to the following rules:—

The period of service requisite to qualify for this Medal shall be twenty years. Service on the West Coast of Africa shall reckon double as qualifying service.

Service rendered partly in the local forces of one Colony or Protectorate, and partly in the local forces of another Colony or Protectorate, or partly in the local forces of one or more Colonies or Protectorates, and partly in the Volunteer Force of Great Britain, shall be reckoned as qualifying service for the Medal, provided that no Officer or man shall be eligible, unless at least half his service has been rendered in the Militia or Volunteer Forces of one or more Colonies or Protectorates, service on the West Coast of Africa counting double.

Service on the permanent staff shall not reckon as qualifying service for this Medal.

Service qualifying for this Medal shall also count towards the necessary qualifying service for "The Volunteer Long Service Medal," provided that no Officer or man shall be eligible for such medal, unless ten years' service has been spent in the Volunteer Force of Great Britain.

An Officer who has served in the ranks of a Volunteer corps in Great Britain, or of the Militia or Volunteers of a Colony or Protectorate, but who is not qualified for the Colonial Auxiliary Forces Officers' Decoration, shall, on completing twenty years' service in all, be eligible to receive the Long Service Medal, but shall surrender it if subsequently the aforesaid Decoration shall be conferred upon him.

It is Our further will and pleasure that this Medal shall be awarded under such regulations as to issue, surrender, forfeiture, and restoration as may from time to time be submitted by the Governor-General of Our Dominion of Canada,

or by the Governors of Our Colonies and Dependencies, or by Our representatives in countries under Our protection, and as may be approved by Our Principal Secretary of State for War upon the recommendation of Our Principal Secretary of State for the Colonies. The regulations aforesaid shall as far as possible correspond with those laid down for "The Volunteer Long Service Medal."

Volunteer Long Service Medals already issued to Colonial Forces under the authority of Our Warrant of the thirteenth June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six, shall be considered equivalent to "The Colonial Auxiliary Forces Long Service Medal."

Our Warrant of the thirteenth June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six, save and except so much of it as relates to Our Indian Empire, is hereby cancelled.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for the Colonies, the following Notice respecting Quarantine issued by the Governor of Malta, viz.:—

Government Notice (No. 154).

His Excellency the Governor, having heard the opinion of the Board of Health, has been pleased to modify Government Notice No. 138 of the 16th May, 1899, and to direct that the following regulations be observed, viz.:—

1. Vessels which are not allowed to enter the Harbour, but are allowed to communicate in Quarantine with the Islands of Comino and Cominotto under such restrictions as the Collector of Customs may direct.

(a.) Vessels that have on board, or have had during the voyage cases of cholera, yellow fever, or plague, or cases of a disease with symptoms resembling those of cholera, yellow fever, or plague.

(b.) Vessels with pilgrims from the East.

(c.) Vessels arriving from Arabian ports in the Red Sea and the Persian Gulf which have not been admitted to free pratique at Suez and Port Said.

2. Vessels which are allowed to enter the Quarantine Harbour to coal and take in provisions under Quarantine restrictions.

(a.) Vessels arriving from Egyptian and Indian ports without a clean bill of health which have not been admitted to free pratique in a port in the Adriatic or Mediterranean Sea, or which have not, to the satisfaction of the Chief Government Medical Officer, been thoroughly disinfected before being admitted to free pratique at the said port.

(b.) Vessels arriving from any port without a clean bill of health, which do not fall under any of the preceding regulations.

Vessels without a clean bill of health that carry a doctor may complete a period of ten days' quarantine, reckoned from date of departure, either at sea or at the anchorage of Comino, before being admitted under the same conditions as arrivals from Bombay.

3. Medical Inspection.

All vessels arriving at Malta shall undergo strict medical inspection.

4. Passengers.

(a.) Passengers arriving from Bombay, Kurra-
chee, and passengers from Calcutta, on board vessels that do not carry a doctor, shall be landed in one of the quarantine establishments where they will be subjected to strict medical inspection until their clothing and all other articles of personal use, likely to retain infection, shall have been thoroughly disinfected.

(b.) Passengers arriving from Calcutta on board vessels that carry a doctor and that have been admitted to free pratique at Suez, shall be

permitted to land; but no luggage shall be landed before it is disinfected in one of the quarantine establishments.

5. Goods.

The importation of coffee, beans or ground, coloured with substances injurious to health is prohibited.

The importation of cotton seed from any port subject to quarantine is forbidden.

The importation of rags is prohibited.

The importation is forbidden, before disinfection, of the following articles, viz., wearing apparel, soiled linen and clothing, bedding materials, feathers, bones, and jute goods.

The importation of hides from any port subject to quarantine, or from any place where cattle disease exists, is prohibited before disinfection.

The importation of vines, vine shoots and fruit packed in vine leaves, is prohibited. The importation of plants or roots from any port of the Mediterranean is prohibited unless the same are accompanied by a satisfactory certificate that *Phylloxera* is not known to exist at the place of origin.
