Board of Trade (Fisheries and Harbour Department), London, June 6, 1899.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, information to the effect that an Order has been issued by the Italian Government admitting to free pratique at Italian ports all ships which although they have put into Egyptian ports have been kept in strict observation there. And that ships will be considered as such which have not taken on board passengers or goods of any kind at the aforesaid ports, or which having passengers from other places already on board have not allowed them or the crew to go on land or to have any contact with the country, and which have taken on board there only postal correspondence (excluding parcels and patterns) if enclosed in tarred bags and if it is shown that the bags have been

kept in a suitable closed place and have been placed in the Scherig apparatus at the rate of two at most to every cubic metre of space.

Le Ministère des Affaires Etrangères a l'honneur d'informer l'Agence Diplomatique de Sa Majesté Britannique que, sur l'avis du Conseil Médical Supérieur de la Principauté, le Département de l'Intérieur a édicté les mesures quaranténaires suivantes :—

1. L'importation en Bulgarie des sacs venant directement des Indes est interdite ;

2. Les sacs venant des Indes et qui auraient été transbordés sur un autre navire dans un port européen quelconque, ne peuvent être importés en Bulgarie qu'après avoir subi la désinfection ;

3. Les sacs venant des Indes et qui sont accompagnés de certificats prouvant qu'ils ont subi une désinfection par la vapeur dans un port européen quelconque, peuvent être importés sans désinfection ;

4. Est interdite l'importation en Bulgarie des vieux habits, chiffons, habits sales, couvertures, vieux sacs-ayant servi, vieux papiers sales et journaux ayant servi, et toute sorte de papier imprimé sale destiné à envelopper et autres objets ayant servi, venant de localités contaminées par la peste.

5. Les vieux objets énumérés dans le § précédent et venant de localités non contaminées, ne peuvent être importés dans la Principauté qu'après désinfection.

TREASURY WARRANT.

WHEREAS by the Post Office Act, 1891, the Postmaster-General is empowered, with the consent of the Treasury, either generally or in the case of any particular person to authorize—

(a.) Letters to be sent, conveyed, and delivered otherwise than by the post, and

(b.) The collection otherwise than by an officer of the Post Office of any letters whether to be so sent or to be sent by the post.

And it is provided that the authority shall be subject in every case to such regulations, conditions, prohibitions, and restrictions as are specified in a Warrant of the Treasury made on the representation of the Postmaster-General.

And whereas the Postmaster-General has granted to the respective Companies named in the Schedule hereto his licence under certain terms and conditions, and for a certain term of years, to establish offices, and work and use the telegraphs and apparatus therein described, for the purpose of summoning messengers to houses and places of business and resort, and for other purposes, such licence being hereinafter referred to as "the Electric Call Licence."

And whereas the Postmaster-General, with the consent of the Treasury, has further authorized the said Companies so long as they respectively

hold the Electric Call Licence to convey such letters and to perform such acts with respect to letters as are specified in the instrument conferring such authority.

Now, we, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers given to us by the Post Office Acts, or any of them, and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do by this Warrant, made on the representation of the Postmaster-General, testified by his signing the same, order and direct as follows:—

1. In this Warrant, except where the context otherwise requires—

The expression "Company" means either of the Companies named in the Schedule hereto, and includes the servants and agents of such Company.

The expression "letters" includes any communication in the nature of a letter.

The expression "sender" used in connection with a letter, means the person on whose behalf the letter is conveyed by the Company.

The expression "person" includes body corporate.

The expression "Company's district" means the Administrative County of London, the city of London, and any place not within the said county or city, but within five miles of the General Post Office, in the city of London.

2. The authority conferred by the Postmaster-General as in this Warrant recited, shall be exercised subject to the regulations, conditions, and restrictions in this Warrant specified.

3. The Company shall not by any one messenger convey letters for or on behalf of more than one person at the same time.

4. The Company shall not by any one messenger convey more than six letters for or on behalf of the same person at the same time.

5. The Company shall not convey any letter for or on behalf of any person unless—

(1.) Such letter is handed to the Company at a place situate within the Company's district, or

(2.) Such letter is a reply letter or return letter handed to a messenger of the Company by the addressee of a letter previously conveyed by the same messenger.

6. The Company shall pay to the Postmaster-General in respect of each and every letter received by them as aforesaid the sum of one penny.

Provided that the Company may carry a written message intended to be sent as a telegram over the postal telegraphs to a postal telegraph office without making any payment to the Postmaster-General in respect of such carriage thereof.

7. Except subject to the provisions of this Warrant and of the authority conferred by the Postmaster-General as in this Warrant recited, the Company shall not convey or deliver any letter or make any collection of letters for any purpose whatever, and no person whatever shall send any letter by the Company.

8. This Warrant shall come into operation on the twenty-fifth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

(DATED 5TH JUNE 1899.)

GRANTON DISTRICT (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1899.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Movement of Swine out of the Scheduled District.

1. Unless and until the Board of Agriculture otherwise order, it shall not be lawful to move any swine, fat or store, alive out of the District described in the Schedule to this Order and hereinafter referred to as the Scheduled District.

Provided that nothing in this Article shall be deemed to apply to the movement of swine where they are moved through the Scheduled District by railway from a place outside the Scheduled District to another place outside the Scheduled District without unnecessary delay and without the swine being untrucked or re-booked within the Scheduled District.

Movement of Swine into Scheduled District.

2.—(1.) Swine shall not be moved into the Scheduled District except with a Movement Licence of the Mid-Lothian County Council, which Licence shall be in force for not more than four days inclusive of the day of issue, and shall specify the name and address of the person to whom the Licence is granted, the number and description of the swine to be moved, and the name or description of the place or premises from which and the place and premises to which the swine are to be moved, and shall only be granted on a Declaration of the owner of the swine or of his agent authorized in

writing for this purpose which Declaration shall be countersigned by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District from which the swine are to be moved, who shall so far as practicable previously satisfy himself as to the correctness of the Declaration.

(2.) The Declaration shall be to the effect—

(a.) that the swine to be moved have been on the premises from which they are to be moved for a period of at least twenty-eight days immediately before the granting of the Licence, and that no other pig has been brought on to those premises within such period; and

(b.) that the swine are not affected with swine-fever, and have not during the period of twenty-eight days as aforesaid been in any way exposed to the infection of swine-fever; and

(c.) that the swine are not in a Swine-Fever-Infected Place and their movement is not prohibited by Notice of an Inspector of a Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board.

(3.) The swine moved into the Scheduled District under this Article shall be accompanied by the Licence and Declaration required by this Article, and shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay.

Movement of Swine between 7 P.M. and 5 A.M. Prohibited.

3. It shall not be lawful for any person to move any swine along a highway or thoroughfare within the Scheduled District between the hours of 7 P.M. and 5 A.M.

Saving for Regulations of Local Authority.

4. Movement of swine under this Order is subject to any Regulation made by a Local Authority under any Order of the Board for prohibiting or regulating the movement of swine into the District of the Local Authority, but nothing in any such Regulation shall permit the movement of swine in contravention of this Order.

Movement of Swine by Licence of Board.

5. Notwithstanding anything in this Order, a Licence for the movement of swine may be granted by an Inspector of the Board or a person authorized by the Board to grant the same, but such Licence will only be granted where the Board, after inquiry, are satisfied that exceptional circumstances render the granting thereof necessary or expedient.

Granting of Movement Licences.

6.—(1.) The Mid-Lothian County Council may appoint fit and proper persons for the purpose of granting, subject to the provisions of this Article, Movement Licences for the purposes of this Order.

(2.) Provided that a Movement Licence granted under this Order shall not be available if granted by the owner of the swine to be moved, or by his agent, or by the owner or consignee of the swine, or by the occupier of the farm or premises or slaughter-house from or to which the swine are to be moved, or by any individual member of an Executive Committee or Sub-Committee of the Council.

Delivery of Declarations.

7.—(1.) A Licence granted under this Order for the movement of swine into the Scheduled District is not available except when accompanied by the Declaration on which it is granted.

(2.) The person granting such Licence under this Order shall, for the identification of the Declaration produced to him, mark the same by

signing his name thereon, with the date of the production thereof to him.

(3.) The person granting such Licence shall deliver the Declaration produced to him, when so marked, with the Licence, to the person receiving the Licence from him.

Production of Licences: Names and Addresses.

8.—(1.) Any person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, necessary for the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector, or other officer.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

9. The provisions of this Order, except where it is otherwise provided, shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

10.—(1.) If a pig is moved in contravention of this Order, or of the conditions of a Movement Licence thereunder, the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the pig, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(2.) If a person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Interpretation.

11. In this Order—

“The Board” means the Board of Agriculture:
“Swine-Fever Infected Place” means a place for the time being declared to be infected with swine-fever under any Order of the Board:
Other terms have the same meaning as in the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Commencement.

12. This Order shall come into operation on the twelfth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine.

Short Title.

13. This Order may be cited as the GRANTON DISTRICT (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER of 1899.
