Gentlemen who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levées are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

PRESENTATIONS.

Gentlemen who propose to present others must send in writing the name of such Gentlemen to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than *two days* previous to the Levée, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the names to Her Majesty, when, if they are approved, Presentation Cards will be forwarded. Forms for the purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

Gentlemen who wish to be presented officially should communicate with the heads of their Department, who will provide them with the necessary cards and instructions.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Gentlemen to be presented be *very distinctly written* on the Presentation Cards delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Levée, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

The State Apartments will be open for the reception of Company coming to Court at half-past one o'clock.

THE following Scheme for the adjustment of the property, rights, liabilities &c. of the Urban District Council of Leigh, in the county of Lancaster, and for other purposes, as settled by a Committee of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, is published in pursuance of the provisions of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1882":—

WHEREAS by "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1882," it is enacted that where a petition for a Charter of Incorporation is referred to the Committee of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council and it is proposed by the Charter to extend the Municipal Corporations Acts to the Municipal Borough to be created by the Charter, the said Committee of Council may settle a scheme for the purposes in the said Acts named and containing such provisions as are in the said Acts particularized.

And whereas certain inhabitant householders of the Urban District of Leigh, in the county of Lancaster, in the month of March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight, petitioned Her Majesty the Queen praying for the grant of a Charter of Incorporation.

And whereas the said petition for a Charter was referred to the Committee of the Council, and it was proposed by the Charter to extend the Municipal Corporations Acts to the Municipal Borough to be created by the Charter.

And whereas on or about the twenty-fourth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, "The Local Government Act, 1858," came into force in the township of Pennington, in the said county, and such township became a district within the meaning of such Act under the jurisdiction of the Pennington Local Board.

And whereas on or about the sixteenth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, "The Local Government Act, 1858," came into force in the township of Westleigh, in the said county, and such township became a District within the meaning of such Act under the jurisdiction of the Westleigh Local Board.

And whereas on or about the fourth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, "The Local Government Act, 1858," came into force in the township of Bedford, in the county of Lancaster, and such township became a district within the meaning of such Act under the jurisdiction of the Bedford Local Board.

And whereas in or about the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty-five, the Vestries of the townships of Astley, Bedford, Pennington and Westleigh resolved, pursuant to section twenty-three of "The Burial Act, 1852," to concur in providing one burial ground for the common use of such townships, and accordingly a Joint Burial Board was formed for the said townships under the name of the Astley, Bedford, Pennington and Westleigh Joint Burial Board, and the said Joint Burial Board purchased certain land in the township of Bedford and established thereon a burial ground for the said townships.

And whereas on the tenth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, the Local Board for the District of Pennington made Bye-laws with respect to

- (a.) The level, width, &c., of new streets and sewerage thereof.
- (b.) The regulation of slaughter-houses.
- (c.) The prevention of nuisance arising from snow, filth, &c., and the keeping of animals.
- (d.) The cleansing of footways, &c., removal of refuse and cleansing of privies.
- (e.) The regulation of common lodging-houses.

And the same were confirmed by Her Majesty's Secretary of State for the Home Department on the fifth day of April one thousand eight hundred and sixty-four.

And whereas on the twentieth February, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, the Local Board for the District of Westleigh made Bye-laws with respect to

- (a.) The level, width, &c., of new streets and sewerage thereof.
- (b.) The regulation of slaughter-houses.
- (c.) The prevention of nuisances arising from snow, filth, &c., and the keeping of animals.
- (d.) The cleansing of footways, &c., removal of refuse and cleansing of privies.
- (e.) The regulation of common lodging-houses.

And the same were confirmed by Her Majesty's Secretary of State for the Home Department on the second day of April, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-four.

And whereas on the twenty-third day of March, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, the Local Board for the District of Bedford made Bye-laws with respect to

- (a.) The level, width, &c., of new streets and sewerage thereof.
- (b.) The regulation of slaughter-houses.
- (c.) The prevention of nuisances arising from snow, filth, &c., and the keeping of animals.
- (d.) The cleansing of footways, &c., removal of refuse and cleansing of privies.
- (e.) The regulation of common lodging-houses.

And the same were confirmed by Her Majesty's Secretary of State for the Home Department on the twenty-ninth of April, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-four.

And whereas the said bye-laws made by the several Local Boards for the districts of Bedford,

Pennington and Westleigh are now in force within the Urban District of Leigh.

And whereas by "The Westleigh, Pennington and Bedford Local Boards (Gas) Act, 1874," the said three Local Boards of Westleigh, Pennington and Bedford were empowered to purchase the undertaking of the Leigh District Gas Company, established under "The Leigh District Gas Act, 1861," who were authorized to supply gas within the districts of the said three Local Boards, and the said three Local Boards were empowered by the said "Westleigh, Pennington and Bedford Local Boards (Gas) Act, 1874," to appoint a Joint Committee of the said three Local Boards for the execution of that Act, to be called the Gas Joint Committee of the Westleigh, Pennington and Bedford Local Boards, with perpetual succession and a Common Seal, and with power to take, hold and dispose of lands and other property for the purposes of the Act, and each of the said three Local Boards was by the same Act empowered from time to time, for the purposes therein named, to borrow on the security of their District Fund and General District Rates such sums not exceeding in the whole for each of the said Local Boards the sum of twenty-five thousand pounds.

And whereas by a Provisional Order of the Local Government Board, dated the fourteenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five, and confirmed by "The Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation (Abingdon, Barnsley, &c.) Act, 1875," the said three Local Government Districts were dissolved and merged in the Rural Sanitary District of the Leigh Union, and by the same Order that part of the Rural Sanitary District of the Leigh Union which comprised the said townships of Bedford, Pennington and Westleigh were from and after the first October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five, constituted an Urban Sanitary District within the meaning of "The Public Health Act, 1872."

And whereas by "The Leigh and Hindley Local Boards (Water) Act, 1876," the Leigh and Hindley Local Boards were empowered to combine for the purpose of supplying water within their districts and within certain places beyond the same, and for that purpose to appoint a Joint Committee of the said two Boards to be called the Water Joint Committee of the Leigh and Hindley Local Boards and to purchase the undertaking of the South Lancashire Waterworks Company incorporated under "The South Lancashire Waterworks Act, 1871," and to construct the waterworks and works specified in the said "Leigh and Hindley Local Boards (Water) Act, 1876."

And whereas it is expedient that provision should be made for continuing the said Joint Committee with all its powers, duties, property debts and liabilities as by this scheme mentioned.

And whereas under the provisions in that behalf contained in "The Public Health Act, 1875," the Leigh Local Board in or about the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine adopted the Baths and Wash-houses Acts and erected Public Baths, and the same are now maintained by the Urban District Council of Leigh.

And whereas by a Provisional Order made by the Local Government Board, on the eleventh day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, and confirmed by "The Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation (Birmingham, Tame and Rea, &c.) Act, 1881," certain provisions of "The Westleigh, Pennington and Bedford Local Boards (Gas) Act, 1874," were repealed or amended, and the Leigh Local

Board was empowered to borrow the sum of twenty-four thousand pounds in addition to the sums amounting to fifty-one thousand pounds which had been borrowed by the said three Local Boards under the provisions of "The Westleigh, Pennington and Bedford Local Boards (Gas) Act, 1874," prior to the twenty-ninth September, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five, and the said Order in certain other respects amended the same Act.

And whereas under the provisions of "The Dairies, Cowsheds and Milkshops Order, 1885," the Leigh Local Board made regulations with respect to dairies, cowsheds and milkshops, and the same are now in force within the Urban District of Leigh.

And whereas the Leigh Local Board adopted the following Acts, viz. :—

1. "Infectious Disease (Notification) Act, 1889."
2. Parts two and three of "The Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1890."
3. "Public Libraries Act, 1892."
4. "Private Street Works Act, 1892."

And the same are now in force within the Urban District of Leigh.

And whereas by a Provisional Order, made by the Local Government Board on the twenty-ninth May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, and confirmed by "The Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation (No. 11) Act, 1888," the Leigh Local Board were empowered to borrow for the purposes of their Gas undertaking the sum of twenty-five thousand pounds in addition to the sums authorized by the said "Westleigh, Pennington and Bedford Local Boards (Gas) Act, 1874," as altered by the said Provisional Order made by the Local Government Board on the eleventh day of May one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one.

And whereas by an Indenture dated the thirtieth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, and under the provisions in that behalf contained in the "Public Health Act, 1875," and the Acts incorporated therewith in so far as the same relate to markets and fairs, the Leigh Local Board purchased the manorial rights of the Lord of the Manor of Pennington with respect to the holding of markets and fairs and of posting bills and of appointing a town crier in the market town of Leigh within the said manor, and established a market for the district of Leigh.

And whereas it is expedient that provision should be made for the continuance, transfer and vesting of the rights, powers, estate and property in the said markets, fairs, rights as to posting of bills and appointment of town crier conferred by or acquired under or by virtue of the said purchase as by this scheme mentioned.

And whereas by a Provisional Order, made by the Local Government Board, on the thirtieth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, and confirmed by the Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation (No. 9) Act, 1894, the Urban Sanitary District of Atherton, in the county of Lancaster, the Urban Sanitary District of Leigh, and the Urban Sanitary District of Tyldesley-with-Shakerley, and the Rural Sanitary District of the Leigh Union were formed into a United District, called the Leigh Joint Hospital District, for the purposes of the provision, maintenance and management of a hospital or hospitals for the reception of cases of infectious disease, and it was provided that a Joint Board, composed of four ex-officio and twelve elective members elected by the Atherton Local Board the Leigh Local Board, the Tyldesley-with-

Shakerley Local Board, and the Guardians of the Poor of the Leigh Union, acting as the Rural Sanitary Authority, to be called the Leigh Joint Hospital Board, should be the governing body of the said United District, and the said Leigh Joint Hospital Board have purchased land and erected a hospital thereon for the reception of cases of infectious disease from the said United District.

And whereas it is expedient that provision should be made for continuing the said Joint Hospital Board with all its powers, duties, property, debts and liabilities as by this scheme mentioned.

And whereas by a Provisional Order made by the Local Government Board, on the ninth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four and confirmed by "The Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation (No. 13) Act, 1894," under the provisions of "The Public Health Act, 1875," the Urban Sanitary District of Leigh and the Urban Sanitary District of Atherton were formed into a United District (called the Leigh and Atherton Joint Sewerage District) for the purposes of purchasing land and erecting, maintaining and working joint sewers, works, machinery and plant for conveying the sewage of the United District to a convenient place or places where it might be purified, and for purifying the same, and by the same Order it was provided that the governing body of the said United District should be called the Leigh and Atherton Joint Sewerage Board, and should consist of two ex-officio and ten elective members five of such elective members to be elected by each of the two constituent authorities from amongst its own members.

And whereas it is expedient that provision should be made for continuing the said Joint Sewerage Board with all its powers, duties, property, debts and liabilities as by this scheme mentioned.

And whereas on the twenty-ninth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, the Leigh Local Board made Bye-laws with respect to the regulation of recreation grounds within the Urban Sanitary District of Leigh, and the same were confirmed by the Local Government Board on the twenty-third day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, and are now in force within the Urban District of Leigh.

And whereas by an Order made by the County Council of Lancashire, on the twenty-eighth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, and duly confirmed by an Order made by the Local Government Board, on the twenty-eighth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, the area of the Urban Sanitary District of Leigh was extended by including therein a part of the district and township or parish of Atherton, and by the same Order the three townships of Bedford, Pennington, and Westleigh, being wholly comprised within the Urban Sanitary District of Leigh and also the said portion of the parish of Atherton, were amalgamated and formed into the parish or township of Leigh, and the same was made co-terminous with the Urban Sanitary District of Leigh.

And whereas under and by virtue of "The Local Government Act, 1894," the Leigh Local Board became the Urban District Council for the Urban District of Leigh.

And whereas under and by virtue of section fifty-three of "The Local Government Act, 1894," the powers and duties of the Astley, Bedford, Pennington and Westleigh Joint Burial Board were transferred to the Parish Council of

Astley and the Urban District Council of Leigh to be exercised by a Joint Committee appointed by those Councils.

And whereas it is expedient that provision should be made for continuing the said Joint Committee with all its powers, duties, property, debts and liabilities as by this scheme mentioned.

And whereas by a Provisional Order made by the Board of Trade, under "The Electric Lighting Acts, 1882 and 1888," and confirmed by "The Electric Lighting Orders Confirmation (No. 2) Act, 1895," the Urban District Council of Leigh were empowered to purchase lands and to erect works thereon for the supply of electrical energy within the Urban District of Leigh for all public and private purposes as defined by the said "Electric Lighting Act, 1882."

And whereas by a Provisional Order made by the Local Government Board, on the ninth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five, and confirmed by "The Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation (No. 7) Act, 1895," Session 2, the Urban District Council of Leigh were empowered to put into force with reference to the lands described in the schedule to the said Order and required for the purpose of widening certain streets and making a new street within their district the powers of the Lands Clauses Acts with respect to the purchase and taking of lands otherwise than by agreement or any of them, and the Urban District Council have purchased the lands and property comprised in the schedule to the said Order and have borrowed money for the purpose of taking the said property and widening the said streets as aforesaid.

And whereas by a Provisional Order made by the Local Government Board on the sixteenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five, under "The Housing of the Working Classes Act, 1890," and confirmed by "The Local Government Board's Provisional Order Confirmation (Housing of Working Classes) (No. 2) Act, 1895," the Urban District Council of Leigh were empowered to carry out an improvement scheme within the said district, and for that purpose to purchase property and borrow money.

And whereas by a Provisional Order made by the Local Government Board on the twenty-ninth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five, and confirmed by "The Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation (No. 15) Act, 1895," Session 2, the Urban District Council of Leigh were empowered to borrow a further sum of twenty-five thousand pounds, and to purchase further lands for the purposes of their Gas undertaking.

And whereas by an Order made by the Local Government Board on the twentieth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six, under the provisions of section thirty-three of "The Local Government Act, 1894," the powers and duties of appointing overseers for the parish of Leigh was conferred upon the Urban District Council of Leigh.

And whereas by an Order made by the Local Government Board on the sixteenth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six, under the provisions of section thirty-three of "The Local Government Act, 1894," the power of appointing and revoking the appointment of any assistant overseer for the parish of Leigh, was transferred to the Urban District Council of Leigh.

And whereas by an Order made by the Local Government Board on the thirtieth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six, under the provisions of section thirty-four of "The

Local Government Act, 1894," the powers of the vestry of the parish of Leigh, under sections three and four of "The Poor Rate Assessment and Collection Act, 1869," were transferred to the Urban District Council of Leigh.

And whereas by an Order made by the Local Government Board on the twenty-sixth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six, under the provisions of section thirty-three of "The Local Government Act, 1894," the powers, duties, and liabilities of the overseers of the parish of Leigh with respect to appeals or objections by the overseers in respect of the valuation list, and appeals in respect of the Poor Rate or County Rate, or the basis of the County Rate, were transferred to the Urban District Council of Leigh.

And whereas it is intended that arrangements shall be made for the consolidation of the Police Force of the borough of Leigh when constituted by Charter with the Police Force of the county of Lancaster.

And whereas this Scheme, before being settled by the Committee of Council, was referred for consideration to Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, and to the Local Government Board.

And whereas it is expedient that a Scheme should be made and settled containing the provisions hereinafter set forth.

Now, therefore, pursuant to "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1882," and every other power enabling them in that behalf, the Committee of Council have settled a Scheme containing the provisions herein, and do hereby direct, order, and declare as follows:—

Short Title.

This Scheme may be cited for all purposes as "The Borough of Leigh Scheme, 1899."

Commencement of the Scheme.

This Scheme when confirmed shall be deemed to have come into operation on the day of the first meeting of the Council of the Municipal Borough created by the said Charter and this Scheme shall be construed and applied as if it had been dated and confirmed by Parliament or Order in Council on the day before the day of the said first meeting and everything thereunder shall be done and had accordingly. This date is hereinafter referred to as "the commencement of this Scheme." So far as may be necessary this Scheme shall operate retrospectively.

The Municipal Borough created by the said Charter shall from and after the commencement of this Scheme be placed and thenceforward be under the jurisdiction of the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the borough of Leigh acting by the Council of the borough as the Sanitary Authority for the said borough.

Dissolution of Urban District Council.

The Urban District Council of Leigh and their powers, privileges, duties, rights, obligations, and liabilities shall continue and be deemed to have continued to exist until the commencement of this Scheme, unaffected in any manner whatsoever by the grant of the said Charter or the creation of the said borough, and immediately from and after the commencement of this Scheme the Urban District Council of Leigh shall be and the same are hereby abolished and shall thenceforth be dissolved and cease to exist.

Transfer of Jurisdiction, Powers, Rights, Property, &c.

All the jurisdiction, powers, duties, and property vested in or possessed by the Urban District Council of Leigh, or by any person or body in

trust for them, or any of their members as such (and not otherwise dealt with or transferred by or under any part of this Scheme), shall vest in the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the borough of Leigh, and shall be held and applied for the municipal and public purposes of the said borough.

All duties and liabilities which immediately before the commencement of this Scheme attached to and were enforceable against the Urban District Council of Leigh, or their property, shall attach to and be enforceable against the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the borough of Leigh and their property.

Any investigations, legal proceedings or remedy in respect of any debt, liability, penalty or forfeiture due to or incurred by or on behalf of the Urban District Council of Leigh, before the commencement of this Scheme may be continued, prosecuted, or enforced by or against the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the borough of Leigh.

The term "property" in this Scheme means and includes all property, real and personal, and all things in action, and all rights of common and commonable rights and rights to toll, and all franchises, privileges, and rights, and all charters, records, deeds, books and documents, and all rights and claims to relief, and all rights to avoid contracts or otherwise and includes any estate or interest, legal or equitable, in or in respect of any property so defined.

The district fund and the general district rate of the said borough shall take the place of and be substituted for the district fund and the general district rate of the Urban District Council of Leigh, and all sums of money respectively payable to, from or out of and all liabilities charged upon or attaching to the last-mentioned district fund or general district rate shall be charged upon the district fund and general district rate of the borough.

Acts, Orders, and Regulations.

Every reference in the hereinbefore-mentioned Acts, Orders and Regulations of 1874, 1875, 1876, 1881, 1888, 1894, 1895 and 1896, the hereinbefore recited Indenture of the thirtieth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, the Order of the County Council of Lancashire of one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, or in the said Acts, Orders, or Regulations, as altered by any General or Local Acts, Orders, Schemes, Agreements or authorities before the commencement of this Scheme, or in any other Act, Order, Bye-law, Regulation, Scheme, Indenture, power or authority whatsoever applicable to the Urban District of Leigh at the commencement of this Scheme, to the Local Government Board or Local Board of Westleigh, the Local Government Board or Local Board of Pennington, the Local Government Board or Local Board of Bedford, the Local Board of Leigh or the Urban District Council of Leigh shall be deemed and construed to be a reference to the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the borough of Leigh acting by the Council and every reference or incorporation by the said or any other Acts, Orders, Bye-laws, Regulations, Schemes, Agreements and Authority to or of any provision of "The Public Health Act, 1875," or the Acts amending or enlarging the same shall be deemed and construed to be a reference to or incorporation of the corresponding provisions of "The Public Health Act, 1875," and other Acts applicable in the case of a Municipal Borough.

Any regulations under the Dairies, Cowsheds, and Milkshops Order, and any bye-laws, in force in the Urban District of Leigh at the commence-

ment of this Scheme shall, for the period of one year from the commencement of this Scheme or for such further period as the Local Government Board may sanction, unless repealed or revoked by other regulations or bye-laws duly made before the expiration of any such period, continue in force and be enforced within the borough in like manner and with the like effect as if the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses, acting by the Council, and the borough were referred to therein, instead of the Local Board or Urban District Council, and the District.

Savings for Rates, &c.

Notwithstanding the incorporation of the borough and the provisions of this Scheme all rates, assessments, compositions, charges, mortgages, leases, conveyances, deeds, documents, acts, matters and things made, entered into or done before the commencement of this Scheme by, to or with reference to the Urban District Council of Leigh or their predecessors shall be as good, valid and effectual to all intents and purposes whatsoever for, against and with reference to the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the borough of Leigh as if the same had been made, entered into or done by, to or with reference to the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the borough of Leigh instead of the said Urban District Council or their predecessors, and may be proceeded on and enforced in the same manner in all respects as if the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the borough of Leigh instead of such Urban District Council or their predecessors had been party or privy to the same and been named or referred to therein.

The Water Joint Committee of Leigh and Hindley Local Boards, their powers, privileges, duties and obligations, and their property, debts and liabilities shall continue and be deemed to have continued until the commencement of this Scheme unaffected in any manner whatsoever by the creation of the said borough, and immediately from and after the commencement of this Scheme the powers, privileges, duties and obligations, and the property, debts and liabilities of the said Joint Committee, so far as they are held or exercisable by, enforceable against, or vested in the said Committee as representative of the Urban District Council of Leigh, shall pass to, be exercisable by, enforceable against and vest in the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the borough of Leigh acting by the Council as the Sanitary Authority of the said borough.

All the rights, powers, estates, and property of, and in, the said markets, fairs, rights as to posting of bills, and appointment of town crier, exercisable by, attaching to, or vested in the Urban District Council of Leigh by reason of the purchase from the Lord of the Manor of Pennington as aforesaid, shall pass to, be exercisable by, attach to, and vest in the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the borough of Leigh, acting by the Council as the Sanitary Authority of the said borough.

The Leigh Joint Hospital Board, their powers, privileges, duties and obligations, and their property, debts and liabilities shall continue and be deemed to have continued until the commencement of this Scheme unaffected in any manner whatsoever by the creation of the said borough, and immediately from and after the commencement of this Scheme the powers, privileges, duties and obligations, and the property, debts and liabilities of the said Board, so far as they are held or exercisable by, enforceable against or vested in the said Board as representative of the Urban District Council of Leigh, shall pass to,

be exercisable by, enforceable against and vest in the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the borough of Leigh acting by the Council as the Sanitary Authority of the said borough.

The existing Burial Authority, their powers, duties, privileges and obligations, and their property, debts and liabilities shall continue and be deemed to have continued until the commencement of this Scheme, unaffected in any manner whatsoever by the creation of the said borough, and immediately from and after the commencement of this Scheme, the powers, duties, privileges and obligations, and the property, debts and liabilities of the said Burial Authority so far as they are held or exercisable by, enforceable against, or vested in such authority as representative of the Urban District Council of Leigh shall pass to, be exercisable by, enforceable against and vest in the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the borough of Leigh, acting by the Council as the Sanitary Authority of the said borough.

The Leigh and Atherton Joint Sewerage Board, their powers, privileges, duties and obligations, and their property, debts and liabilities shall continue and be deemed to have continued till the commencement of this Scheme unaffected in any manner whatsoever by the creation of the said borough, and immediately from and after the commencement of this Scheme the powers, privileges, duties and obligations, and the property, debts and liabilities of the said Board, so far as they are held or exercisable by, enforceable against or vested in the said Board as representative of the Urban District Council of Leigh, shall pass to, be exercisable by, enforceable against and vest in the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the borough of Leigh acting by the Council as the Sanitary Authority of the said borough.

In case any officer of the Urban District Council of Leigh, who shall have been employed by the Local Board or Urban District Council of Leigh for a period of five years, shall not be employed by the Council of the said borough, nor offered by the said Council a position in their employ of a similar character, and of an equal value to that formerly held by him, he shall be entitled to be paid, by way of compensation for the loss of his position, out of the funds of or under the control of the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the borough of Leigh, acting by the Council as the Sanitary Authority for the said borough, such gratuity or annual allowance as on a full consideration of the circumstances of the case may seem to the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury or any two or more of them to be a reasonable and just compensation for the loss of his position, and the said Commissioners in awarding the said compensation shall be guided by the principles which would be applicable in the case of an award of compensation under the provisions of "The Superannuation Act, 1859," to a person retiring or removed from the public service in consequence of the abolition of his office. Provided that no special minute within the meaning of the said Act, stating any special grounds for granting such allowance shall be necessary or be made. Provided, nevertheless, that if any such officer be so employed by the said Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses and discharged by them (otherwise than for misconduct) within two years of the commencement of this Scheme, he shall be entitled to compensation in the same manner as if he had not been employed by the said Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses. Provided that the term "officer" shall include only persons employed by the said Local Board or Urban District Council whose salaries or emoluments are payable at

intervals of not less than one month, and no other persons. Provided also that the said Lords Commissioners or any two or more of them shall be the sole judges as to the right, title or claim of any officer to any compensation whatever, and as to the amount thereof, and the said Lords Commissioners or any two or more of them shall be the only judges upon any question which may arise under this clause, and further every determination of the said Lords Commissioners upon any such right, title, claim, amount, or question shall be absolutely final and conclusive, and every such officer shall have such rights only under this clause as the said Lords Commissioners or any two or more of them consider just and reasonable. Any determination of the said Lords Commissioners or any two or more of them may be evidenced by writing under the hands of any two of them.

The accounts of the Urban District Council of Leigh and their officers shall be (as soon as conveniently may be) audited by the District Auditor in like manner, and subject to the like powers, duties, provisions, and right of appeal, as if the Charter had not been granted; the provisions of sections two hundred and forty-seven and two hundred and fifty of "The Public Health Act, 1875," as amended by "The District Auditors Act, 1879," and any regulations duly issued by the Local Government Board with respect to the audit of accounts of Local Boards or Urban District Councils and of their officers shall apply to such audit; and the provisions of this Scheme with respect to the said Urban District Council shall be construed so as to admit of such exceptions as may be necessary to enable such audit to be duly made, but such exceptions shall be strictly limited in time, extent, character and operation to the purposes of such audit. Any sums certified by the District Auditor at such audit to be due from any person shall be paid by such person to the Borough Treasurer.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for the Colonies, the following Quarantine Notice issued by the Governor of Malta, viz. :—

Government Notice (No. 159).

His Excellency the Governor, having heard the opinion of the Board of Health, has been pleased to modify Government Notice, No. 154 of the 23rd May, 1899, and to direct that the following regulations be observed, viz. :—

1. Vessels which are not allowed to enter the Harbour, but are allowed to communicate in quarantine with the Islands of Comino and Cominotto under such restrictions as the Collector of Customs may direct.

(a.) Vessels that have on board, or have had during the voyage cases of cholera, yellow fever or plague, or cases of a disease with symptoms resembling those of cholera, yellow fever or plague.

(b.) Vessels with pilgrims from the East.

(c.) Vessels arriving from Arabian ports in the Red Sea and the Persian Gulf which have not been admitted to free pratique at Suez and Port Said.

2. Vessels which are allowed to enter the Quarantine Harbour to coal and take in provisions under quarantine restrictions.

(a.) Vessels arriving from Indian ports without a clean bill of health which have not been admitted to free pratique in a port in the Adriatic or Mediterranean Sea, or which have not, to the satisfaction of the Chief Government Medical Officer, been thoroughly disinfected before being admitted to free pratique at the said port.

(b.) Vessels arriving from any port without a clean bill of health, which do not fall under any of the preceding regulations.

(c.) Vessels arriving from Egyptian ports.

3. Medical Inspection.

All vessels arriving at Malta shall undergo strict medical inspection.

4. Passengers.

(a.) Passengers arriving from Bombay, Kurrachee, and passengers from Calcutta, on board vessels that do not carry a Doctor, shall be landed in one of the quarantine establishments, where they will be subjected to strict medical inspection until their clothing and all other articles of personal use, likely to retain infection, shall have been thoroughly disinfected.

(b.) Passengers arriving from Calcutta on board vessels that carry a Doctor and that have been admitted to free pratique at Suez, shall be permitted to land; but no luggage shall be landed

before it is disinfected in one of the quarantine establishments.

(c.) Every passenger or other person arriving at Malta shall, before being allowed to land, declare on oath before an Inspector of Marine Police or other Superior Officer that he has not been in Egypt within 21 days; whenever such person does not make this declaration on oath, he shall undergo 21 days' quarantine on the ship.

5. Goods.

The importation of coffee, beans or ground, coloured with substance injurious to health is prohibited.

The importation of cotton seed from any port subject to quarantine is forbidden.

The importation of rags is prohibited.

The importation is forbidden, before disinfection, of the following articles, viz., wearing apparel, soiled linen and clothing, bedding materials, feathers, bones and jute goods.

The importation of hides from any port subject to quarantine or from any place where cattle disease exists, is prohibited before disinfection.

The importation of vines, vine shoots, and fruit packed in vine leaves is prohibited. The importation of plants or roots from any port of the Mediterranean is prohibited unless the same are accompanied by a satisfactory certificate that Phylloxera is not known to exist at the place of origin.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

(DATED 7TH JUNE 1899.)

(SWINE-FEVER INFECTED AREA.)

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an area infected with swine-fever for the purposes of the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1896.

2. The said Area, so long as it continues to be a Swine-Fever Infected Area, shall not be subject to the Swine-Fever (Movement) Order of 1898.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the thirteenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine.

In witness whereof the Board of Agriculture have hereunto set their Official Seal this seventh day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine.
