There lately arrived in the Port of Tunis a French Ship laden with divers Merchandizes from Leghorne, commanded by Captain Siccarde, and fome days after came in likewise an English Ship called the Robert, laden with Oyl from Gairpoli. And being in a Neutral Port, there passed several Acts of Civility between them, and on the 25th of September last past the French Captain invited the English Captain to Dinner, who went accordingly, and the next day invited the French Captain on board his Ship, where they parted with mutual fatisfaction. But on the 27th, very early in the morning, the faid Captain Siccarde came with 30 Armed men in his Boat, and furprized the English Snip, killing all the Seamen they found above Decky The English Captain, who was affep in his Carin, awaking at the noise, came out to see what might be the occafion of it, and was shot by Captain Siccarde, of which he immediately died; And the French killed and feized upon the rest of the English Mariners; After which Captain Siccarde returned on board his own Ship, and fet fail, carrying the faid English Vessel away with him. 'Fis faid, that another French Ship was likewise concerned in this Fact, at least that they affifted Captain Siccarde with some men, seeing he had hardly so many on board his Ship as he carried with him in his Boat to fall upon the English.
