By Sanitary Maritime Ordinance of to-day's date it is ordered that the sanitary precautions prescribed by the Maritime Sanitary Ordinances at present in force for arrivals declared to be infected with bubonic plague shall be carried out only at the following ports:—Genoa, Leghorn, Naples, Nisida, Palermo, Messina, Brindisi, and Venice. Vessels subject to quarantine will therefore have to proceed to one or other of the above ports."

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Representative at Trieste, enclosing the following copy of Notices issued by the Imperial and Royal Marine Board at Trieste, viz.:—

Translation of Circular No. 6462 of the Imperial and Royal Marine Board (at Trieste), to all the Imperial and Royal Offices and Officers and Subordinate Port and Sanitary Offices and

Officers.

By order of the Imperial and Royal Ministry of Commerce, given by Telegram of June 6th, 1899, No. 30561, the regulations regarding arrivals by sea from Alexandria (Egypt), published by Government Circular of May 31st, No. 6205, are repealed and substituted by the following:—

Vessels arriving from the said port, are to be treated according to the Venice Sanitary Convention of 1897, as suspicious, and therefore they have to undergo medical visits, disinfection, emptying of the water-tanks, and substitution of drinking water existing on board by fresh potable

water.

The observation of passengers foreseen by the above Convention for the duration of ten days, calculated from the day of departure, will, if the passage has lasted less than ten days, and should the hygienic conditions of the vessel have an unfavourable result according to the report of the first medical visit, have to be repeated on board or at a sea lazaretto.

The limit that the vessel as well as the passengers will have to be detained will be fixed each time separately, according to the result of the medical inspection, and calculated in such a way that the limit, together with the duration of the voyage, may not exceed usually seven days.

Should the passage have lasted more than ten days the admission to free pratique will follow without any further restrictions, provided that unfavourable hygienic conditions on board should not necessitate special measures.

The other regulations of the Venice Convention contained in Government Circular of 17th June, 1897, No. 5684, remain unchanged, and

will have to be strictly carried out.

It is an understood thing that the arrival of a vessel from the Port of Alexandria, and also the medical report on its hygienic conditions, must be immediately communicated to the undersigned, so that he may order any further sanitary treatment.

The regulations respecting the prohibition of importation and transit of certain goods and effects from Egypt are specified in to-day's Circular No. 6513.

Translation of Circular No. 6513 of the Imperial and Royal Marine Board (at Trieste) to all the Imperial and Royal Offices and Officers and Subordinate Port and Sanitary Offices and Officers.

By decree of June 6th, 1899, issued by the Imperial and Royal Ministries of the Interior, of Commerce and Finance (B. L. T. No. 99) in con-

junction with the Royal Hungarian Government, on account of cases of plague verified at Alexandria, the importation and transit of the following articles is prohibited from Egypt, in order to prevent the introduction of plague from Egypt:—

1. Of used body linen-clothes, of old clothing (personal effects), old bed clothing. When such articles are forwarded as personal baggage or as household effects in consequence of change of residence, they are subject upon passing the frontier to special regulations and treatment by the sanitary police.

2. Of rags and tatters, not excluding rags com-

pressed by hydraulic power, which are packed in closed bales as articles of commerce.

3. Of used sackings, carpets, and used embroideries.

4. Of raw uncalcined hides, unprepared and

5. Of animal substances raw unprepared as bones, hoofs, bladders, and intestines, if sent separate from the carcasse, also hides and horse-hair.

6. Of hair.

Permission will be granted for transit of the goods enumerated, when proof is forthcoming that if such goods have passed through infected territory, they have done so packed in such a manner as has rendered infection impossible.

This Order comes into force on the day that it is received respectively by the Custom House Offices and by the Marine Sanitary Officers.

For preventing the commission of any nuisance in or upon any carriage, or in or against any

premises belonging to them.

For regulating the travelling in or upon any carriage belonging to them.

Extent of Bye-Laws.

1. The Bye-laws and Regulations hereinafter set forth shall extend and apply to all carriages of the Corporation, and to all places with respect to which the Corporation have power to make Bye-laws or Regulations.

Passengers getting on and off.

2. Every passenger shall enter or depart from a closed carriage by the hindermost or conductor's platform, and not otherwise, and every passenger shall enter or depart from an open carriage by the footboard of such carriage, and not otherwise.

Smoking.

3. No passenger shall smoke inside any closed carriage or on either platform thereof.

Musical Instruments.

4. No passenger or other person shall, while travelling in or upon any carriage, play or perform upon any musical instrument.

Intoxicated or Infected Persons.

5. A person in a state of intoxication, or affected with any infectious or contagious disease, shall not be allowed to enter or mount upon any carriage, and if found in or upon any carriage shall be immediately removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

Committing Nuisance.

6. No person shall swear or use any obscene, indecent, or offensive language whilst entering or mounting, or whilst in or upon any carriage, or expectorate or commit any nuisance in or against any carriage, or wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger.

Wilful Damage.

7. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil, or damage the seats, cushions, or linings of any carriage, or remove or deface any number, plate, printed, painted, or other notice or writing, or ductor.

any advertisement in or on any carriage, or mark, break, or scratch any window of or otherwise wilfully damage any carriage, or (unless a servant of the Corporation), touch, handle, or interfere with any machine, apparatus, or appliance in, under, upon, or about any carriage. Any person acting in contravention of this Regulation shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws and Regulations, in addition to the liability to pay the amount of any damage done.

Offensive Clothing, &c.

8. A person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the conductor of a carriage, soil or injure the seats, linings, or cushions of the carriage, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, or a person who, in the opinion of the conductor, might for any other reason be offensive to passengers, shall not be entitled to enter, mount, or remain in or upon any carriage, and may be prevented from entering, mounting, or remaining in or upon any carriage, and shall not enter, mount, or be or remain in or upon any carriage or any part thereof, after having been requested not to do so by the conductor, and, if found in or upon any carriage, shall, on the request of the conductor, leave the carriage, upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned.

9. Each passenger shall, upon demand, pay to the conductor, or other duly authorized officer of the Corporation, the fare legally demandable for the journey, or under such regulations as to tickets, or checks, or payment into a money box, or other system as the Corporation, with the approval of the Board of Trade, may from time to time determine.

Production of Tickets.

10. Each passenger shall show his ticket (if any) when required so to do to the conductor or any duly authorized servant of the Corporation, and shall also, when required so to do, by any servant of the Corporation, either deliver up his ticket, or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

Artisans' Special Carriage.

11. A passenger not being an artisan, mechanic, or daily labourer, within the true intent and meaning of the Acts of Parliament or Provisional Orders relating to the tramways and portions of tramways for the time being belonging to and worked by the Corporation, shall not use or attempt to use any ticket or any special carriage intended only for such artisans, mechanics, or daily labourers.

Luggage.

Personal or other luggage (including the tools of artisans, mechanics, and daily labourers) shall, unless otherwise permitted by the conductor, be placed on the front or driver's platform, or on the rear or conductor's platform, or in a compartment specially set apart for the conveyance of parcels, and not elsewhere on any carriage. The conductor may decline to take into or upon any carriage any luggage which from its size or otherwise is not suitable for conveyance in or upon such carriage.

Standing on Steps or Platforms.

13. No passenger or other person not being a servant of the Corporation, shall be permitted to travel on the steps, footboards, or platforms of any carriage, or to stand either on the roof or in the interior, or to sit on any rail or any part of any carriage not intended for passengers, and shall cease to do so immediately on request by the con-

Travelling not on Seat.

14. No person, except a passenger or intending passenger, or an authorized servant of the Corporation, shall enter or mount any carriage, and no person shall hold or hang on by or to any part of any carriage, or travel therein or thereon otherwise than on a seat provided for passengers.

Full number of Passengers.

15. When any carriage contains the full number of passengers which may lawfully be conveyed thereby, no additional person shall enter, mount, or remain in or on any such carriage when warned by the conductor not to do so.

Notice thereof.

16. When a carriage contains the full number of passengers which may lawfully be conveyed thereby, a notice to that effect shall be placed in conspicuous letters and in a conspicuous position on the carriage.

Prevention of Overcrowding.

17. The conductor shall not permit any passenger beyond the authorized number to enter or mount or remain in or upon any part of any carriage.

Entering and Leaving Carriages in Motion.

18. No person shall enter, mount, hang on, or leave, or attempt to enter, mount, hang on, or leave, any carriage whilst in motion.

Dogs or other Animals.

19. No dog or other animal shall be allowed in the interior of any carriage, nor, except by permission of the conductor, on any carriage, nor on any carriage in any case in which the conveyance of such dog or other animal is offensive or an annoyance to any passenger. No person shall take a dog or other animal into or upon any carriage after having been requested not to do so by the conductor. Any dog or other animal taken into or on any carriage in breach of this regulation shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the carriage immediately upon request by the conductor, and in default of compliance with such request may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

Firearms or offensive Articles.

20. No person shall enter, mount, or hang on any carriage, or travel in or on any carriage with loaded firearms, or with any article or thing which may in the opinion of the conductor be dangerous or offensive to any passenger.

Obstructing Servants or Passengers.

21.
