THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Representative at Algiers, enclosing the following communication respecting quarantine received by him from the Governor-General of Algiers, viz. :—

Gouvernement Général de l'Algérie,
Alger, le 4 Juillet, 1899.

Monsieur le Consul-Général,

En réponse à votre lettre du 24 Juin courant, j'ai l'honneur de vous faire connaître que les mesures prises à Alger pour les navires de provenance d'Égypte et des pays contaminés, sont les suivantes :

1°. Isolement au musoir Sud ou dans l'arrière port des navires suspects et charbonnage en quarantaine, désinfection du matériel et des charbonniers.

2°. Isolement aux mêmes pointes des navires suspects opérant un chargement, désinfection du matériel.

3°. Envoi au Lazaret de Matifou des navires laissant des marchandises à Alger, afin de faire désinfecter celles-ci.

Aux termes des décrets des 15 Avril, 1897, Article 4, et 15 Juin, 1899, Article 1er, aucun navire provenant d'une localité reconnue contaminée de peste ne peut pénétrer en Algérie que par le fort d'Alger.

ADDITIONAL Order made in pursuance of "The Metropolitan Public Carriage Act, 1869" (32 and 33 Vict., cap. 115), by the Right Honourable Sir Matthew White Ridley, Bart., one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the ninth section of "The Metropolitan Public Carriage Act, 1869," I order as follows :—

1. During the period between one hour after sunset and one hour before sunrise no driver of a hackney carriage shall ply for hire, unless the hackney carriage under his charge be provided with a lamp properly trimmed and lighted. Such lamp shall be fixed outside the carriage in such a manner as to exhibit a white light to the front.

If one lamp only be carried outside, it shall be fixed on the right or off side of the carriage.

2. In pursuance of section 10 of the above-mentioned Act I hereby annex a penalty not exceeding forty shillings for any breach of this Order.

3. This Order shall come into force on the 10th day of July, 1899.

FOR the purposes of the Electric Lighting Acts, 1832 to 1890, and all Provisional Orders and Licences made and issued thereunder, the Board of Trade approve of the pattern and construction of the meter (hereinafter described) for the measurement of electrical energy when supplied on the constant potential two-phase or three-phase alternating current system, namely:—

The meter deposited at the Board of Trade on the 11th day of November, 1898, by or on behalf of the Aron Electricity Meter Limited, of 46, Upper Thames-street, London, E.C., and sealed by the Board of Trade and known as the Aron (alternating current) Meter.

The Board of Trade further approve of the following manner of fixing meters of the above pattern and construction, and of connecting them with the service lines, referred to herein as the first outer, second outer, and middle service lines respectively:—

The meter is to be fixed securely on a vertical wall or support, great care being taken that it is accurately perpendicular as indicated by the plumb-line fixed on the left hand side of the case.

In connecting the meter with the service lines the first outer service line is to be cut, the ends prepared as described below, and the conductors inserted and tightly clamped in the left hand pair of terminals, so that the service line from the supply is placed in the terminal on the left, and the consumer's wire in the terminal on the right. Similarly the second outer service line is to be cut, its ends prepared as described below and tightly clamped in the right hand pair of terminals, which for this purpose are separately insulated. A pressure connection is also made between the middle service line and a pressure terminal placed between the two pairs of current terminals.

In preparing the ends of the service lines, the conductor is to be bared of insulating material for a length not less than three-quarters of an inch and not exceeding one inch, the insulation being cut straight across. The outside of the insulating material is to be made to fit closely the hole through which the line is passed to the terminal, indiarubber tape or other insulating material being wound on to the requisite thickness if necessary.

THE Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice, that at a Trial of the Pyx, held at Goldsmiths' Hall, in the City of London, on the 5th July, 1899, in accordance with the provisions of the Order in Council of the 29th June, 1871, the following Verdict of the Pyx Jury was delivered to the Queen's Remembrancer, viz.:—

WE, whose names are hereunder written, having been sworn this fifth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine, before the Queen's Remembrancer, at Goldsmiths' Hall, in the city of London, have made the Assays and Trials of Her Majesty's Gold and Silver Coins in the Pyx of the Mint, which, according to accounts produced by the Officers of the Mint, were coined in the said Mint from the first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight, to the thirtieth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine both days inclusive. We ascertained that the number of coins, both of gold and silver, in each packet produced to us, corresponded with the number which the Officers of the Mint represented it to contain; and we took six coins from each of such packets of Gold coins, making altogether thirty Sovereigns or Twenty-shilling pieces, and ninety-six Half-Sovereigns or Ten-shilling pieces, and we weighed each of the said coins separately, so as to ascertain whether they were within the remedy prescribed in the First Schedule to the Coinage Act, 1870, as amended by the Coinage Act, 1891. We found that the amount of variation from the Standard of Weight specified in the said First Schedule to the said Act was minus twenty-one ten-thousandth parts of an ounce (—0021 oz.) on the whole of such coins, and that, therefore, they were within the prescribed remedy as to weight. We then melted the said Gold coins so taken out and weighed, into an ingot, and assayed such ingot, comparing it with the standard Gold Trial Plate produced by the Board of Trade, so as to ascertain whether the metal was within the remedy as to fineness prescribed in the said First Schedule to the said Act, and we found that the amount of variation thereof from the Standard of Fineness specified in the said First Schedule to the said Act was minus three ten-thousandth parts (or —0003), and that, therefore, the said metal was within the prescribed remedy as to fineness. We weighed the residue of the said Gold coins in bulk, and we ascertained that they were within the remedy as to Weight. We then took from such residue three Sovereigns and five Half-Sovereigns, and weighed and assayed them separately, and we found that such Sovereigns weighed respectively,—the first, 123·164 grains, the second, 123·113 grains, and the third, 123·174 grains, and that such Half-Sovereigns weighed respectively,—the first, 61·527 grains, the second, 61·627 grains, the third, 61·577 grains, the fourth, 61·647 grains, and the fifth, 61·667 grains. We then assayed the said three Sovereigns and five Half-Sovereigns separately, and we found the millesimal fineness of such Sovereigns to be,—the first, 916·56, the second, 916·36, and the third, 916·46 respectively, and the millesimal fineness of such Half-Sovereigns to be,—the first, 916·46, the second, 916·50, the third, 916·46, the fourth, 916·76, and the fifth, 916·70 respectively. We also took a coin from each of such packets of Silver coins, making altogether ten Crowns, thirteen Half-Crowns, twenty Florins, thirty-five Shillings, nineteen Sixpences, one Fourpence, fourteen Threepences, one Twopence, and one Penny, and weighed each of the said

Silver coins separately, so as to ascertain whether they were within the remedy prescribed in the said First Schedule to the said Coinage Act, 1870, as amended by the said Coinage Act, 1891. We found that the amount of variation from the Standard of Weight specified in the said First Schedule to the said Act was plus three thousandth parts of an ounce (+003 oz.) on the whole of such coins, and that, therefore, they were within the prescribed remedy as to Weight. We then melted the said Silver coins, so taken out and weighed, into an ingot, and assayed such ingot, comparing it with the standard Silver Trial Plate produced by the Board of Trade, so as to ascertain whether the metal was within the remedy as to fineness prescribed in the said First Schedule to the said Act, and we found that the amount of variation from the Standard of Fineness specified in the said First Schedule to the said Act was minus two ten-thousandth parts (or -0002), and that, therefore, the said metal was within the prescribed remedy as to fineness. We weighed the residue of the said Silver coins in bulk, and we ascertained that they were within the remedy as to Weight. We then took from such residue one Crown, one Half-Crown, one Florin, one Shilling, one Sixpence, and one Threepence, and weighed and assayed them separately, and we found that such Crown weighed 436.424 grains, that such Half-Crown weighed 218.142 grains, that such Florin weighed 174.805 grains, that such Shilling weighed 87.453 grains, that such Sixpence weighed 43.616 grains, and that such Threepence weighed 21.798 grains. We then assayed the said Crown, the said Half-Crown, the said Florin, the said Shilling, the said Sixpence, and the said Threepence separately, and we found the millesimal fineness of such Crown to be 925.2, of such Half-Crown to be 925.9, of such Florin to be 925.3, of such Shilling to be 924.6, of such Sixpence to be 926.0, and of such Threepence to be 925.0.

ORDER of the Local Government Board: Dispensing with requirement of the Nursing in Workhouses Order, 1897:—

Halifax Union.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Halifax Union;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by the Nursing in Workhouses Order, 1897, We, the Local Government Board, directed that, from and after the 29th day of September, 1897, certain Regulations should, except in so far as We might assent to a departure therefrom, be in force in the several Poor Law Unions for the time being in England and Wales with respect to the nursing of the sick poor in Workhouses, and the appointment, qualification, and duties of Nurses, including Superintendent Nurses, therein; and by Article III (3) of that Order it is provided as follows:—

(3.) Any Superintendent Nurse appointed after the commencement of this Order shall, unless

We dispense with the requirement, be a person qualified for the appointment by having undergone, for three years at least, a course of instruction in the Medical and Surgical Wards of any Hospital or Infirmary being a Training School for Nurses, and maintaining a Resident Physician or House Surgeon.

And whereas the Infirmary of the Workhouse of the Halifax Union is a Training School for Nurses but does not maintain a Resident Physician or House Surgeon, but it is nevertheless expedient that the said Infirmary should be deemed to be within the above-cited provision for the purposes of the qualification therein mentioned:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, we hereby Order and Direct as follows:—

For the purposes of Article III (3) of the above-cited Order of 1897 the Infirmary of the Workhouse of the Halifax Union shall be deemed to be an Infirmary maintaining a Resident Physician or House Surgeon during such period as the Assistant Medical Officer of the Workhouse shall devote his whole time to the duties of his office.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

(DATED 12TH JULY 1899.)

(SWINE-FEVER INFECTED AREA.)

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The Order described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby from and after the commencement of this Order revoked: Provided that such revocation shall not invalidate or make unlawful anything done under the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1896 and the Order described in the Schedule to this Order before the commencement of this Order, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, those Orders before the commencement of this Order.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the fifteenth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine.

BYE-LAWS AND REGULATIONS made by the Blackpool and Fleetwood Tramroad Company, under the powers conferred on the Company by the Tramways Act, 1870.

Extent of Bye-Laws.

1. The Bye-laws and Regulations hereinafter set forth shall extend and apply to all carriages of the Company, and to all places with respect to which the Company have power to make Bye-laws or Regulations.

Passengers getting on and off.

2. Every passenger shall enter or depart from a closed carriage by the hindmost or conductor's platform, and not otherwise, and every passenger shall enter or depart from an open carriage by the footboard of such carriage, and not otherwise.

Smoking.

3. No passenger shall smoke inside any closed carriage or on either platform thereof.

Musical Instruments.

4. No passenger or other person shall, while travelling in or upon any carriage, play or perform upon any musical instrument.

Intoxicated or Infected Persons.

5. A person in a state of intoxication, or affected with any infectious or contagious disease, shall not be allowed to enter or mount upon any carriage, and if found in or upon any carriage shall be immediately removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

Committing Nuisance.

6. No person shall swear or use any obscene, indecent, or offensive language whilst entering or mounting, or whilst in or upon any carriage, or expectorate or commit any nuisance in or against any carriage, or wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger.

Wilful Damage.

7. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil, or damage the seats, cushions, or linings of any carriage, or remove or deface any number, plate, printed, painted, or other notice or writing, or any advertisement in or on any carriage, or mark, break, or scratch any window of or otherwise wilfully damage any carriage, or (unless a servant of the Company), touch, handle, or interfere with any machine, apparatus, or appliance in, under, upon, or about any carriage. Any person acting in contravention of this Regulation shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws and Regulations, in addition to the liability to pay the amount of any damage done.

Offensive Clothing, &c.

8. A person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the conductor of a carriage, soil or injure the seats, linings, or cushions of the carriage, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, or a person who, in the opinion of the conductor, might for any other reason be offensive to passengers, shall not be entitled to enter, mount, or remain in or upon any carriage, and may be prevented from entering, mounting, or remaining in or upon any carriage, and shall not enter, mount, or be or remain in or upon any carriage or any part thereof, after having been requested not to do so by the conductor, and, if found in or upon any carriage, shall, on the request of the conductor, leave the carriage, upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned.

Fares.

9. Each passenger shall, upon demand, pay to the conductor, or other duly authorized officer of the Company, the fare legally demandable for the journey, under such regulations as to tickets, or checks, or payment into a money box, or under such other system as the Company, with the approval of the Board of Trade, may from time to time determine.

Production of Tickets.

10. Each passenger shall show his ticket (if any) when required so to do to the conductor or any duly authorized servant of the Company, and shall also when required so to do by any servant of the Company either deliver up his ticket or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

Artisans' Special Carriage.

11. A passenger not being an artisan, mechanic, or daily labourer, within the true intent and meaning of the Acts of Parliament or Provisional Order or Orders relating to the tramways belonging or demised to the Company, shall not use or attempt to use any ticket or any special carriage intended only for such artisans, mechanics, or daily labourers.

Luggage.

12. Personal or other luggage (including the tools of artisans, mechanics, and daily labourers) shall, unless otherwise permitted by the conductor, be placed on the front or driver's platform, or on the rear or conductor's platform, or in a compartment specially set apart for the conveyance of parcels, and not elsewhere on any carriage. The conductor may decline to take into or upon any carriage any luggage which from its size or otherwise is not suitable for conveyance in or upon such carriage.

Standing on Steps or Platforms.

13. No passenger or other person not being a servant of the Company, shall be permitted to travel on the steps, footboards, or platforms of any carriage, or to stand either on the roof or in

the interior, or to sit on any rail or any part of any carriage not intended for passengers, and shall cease to do so immediately on request by the conductor.

Travelling not on Seat.

14. No person, except a passenger or intending passenger, or an authorized servant of the Company, shall enter or mount any carriage, and no person shall hold or hang on by or to any part of any carriage, or travel therein or thereon otherwise than on a seat provided for passengers.

Full number of Passengers.

15. When any carriage contains the full number of passengers which may lawfully be conveyed thereby, no additional person shall enter, mount, or remain in or on any such carriage when warned by the conductor not to do so.

Notice thereof.

16. When a carriage contains the full number of passengers which may lawfully be conveyed thereby, a notice to that effect shall be placed in conspicuous letters and in a conspicuous position on the carriage.

Prevention of Overcrowding.

17. The conductor shall not permit any passenger beyond the authorized number to enter or mount or remain in or upon any part of any carriage.

Entering and Leaving Carriages in Motion.

18. No person shall enter, mount, hang on, or leave, or attempt to enter, mount, hang on, or leave, any carriage whilst in motion.

Dogs or other Animals.

19. No dog or other animal shall be allowed in the interior of any carriage nor (except by permission of the conductor) on any carriage, nor on any carriage in any case in which the conveyance of such dog or other animal is offensive or an annoyance to any passenger. No person shall take a dog or other animal into or upon any carriage after having been requested not to do so by the conductor. Any dog or other animal taken into or on any carriage in breach of this regulation shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the carriage immediately upon request by the conductor, and in default of compliance with such request may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

Firearms or offensive Articles.

20. No person shall enter, mount, or hang on any carriage, or travel in or on any carriage with loaded firearms, or with any article or thing which may in the opinion of the conductor be dangerous or offensive to any passenger.

Obstructing Servants or Passengers.

21. No person shall wilfully obstruct or impede any officer or servant of the Company in the execution of his duty upon or in connection with any tramway or carriage of the Company, or upon or in any of the shelters, works, or premises, belonging to, or connected with the Company, and no person shall wilfully obstruct or interfere with the traffic on the tramways, or endanger the safety of any person entering, mounting, leaving, or travelling on any carriage of the Company.
