

and eight hundred and fifty-four, to direct the discontinuance of burials in the burial ground of the Cathedral of Winchester.

And whereas Her Majesty was pleased by and with the advice of Her Privy Council by Orders dated the thirteenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, and the thirtieth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, to vary the said Order of the thirteenth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-four.

And whereas the Right Honourable Sir Matthew White Ridley, Baronet, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, has made a representation stating that he is of opinion that the Order of Her Majesty in Council of the thirteenth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-four, in so far as it affects burials in the burial-ground of the Cathedral of Winchester, should be further varied by the addition of certain words.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the said first recited Order as varied by the said Orders of the thirteenth May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, and the thirtieth April, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, be further varied by the addition of the following words, viz., "and except for the burial (in that part of the Cathedral Burial Ground, called the 'Great Water Close' situated on the south side of the Lady Chapel), in such cases as the Secretary of State may by licence under his hand allow, of Bishops of the diocese and Deans of the Cathedral at their decease."

WHEREAS by "The Burial Act, 1855," it is, amongst other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, from time to time to postpone the time appointed by any Order in Council for the discontinuance of burials, or otherwise to vary any Order in Council made under any of the Acts recited in the said Act, or under the said Act (whether the time thereby appointed for the discontinuance of burials thereunder, or other operation of such Order, shall or shall not have arrived), as to Her Majesty, with such advice as aforesaid, may seem fit:

And whereas an Order in Council was made on the nineteenth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one, directing the discontinuance of burials in the church, and, with certain exceptions, in the churchyard of Saint Mary, Kidderminster; and whereas it seems fit to Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, that the said Order, in so far as it affects burials in the said churchyard, should be varied:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice aforesaid, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the said Order be varied by the addition of the following words to the Article in the said Order relating to burials in the church and churchyard of Saint Mary, Kidderminster, viz. :—

"And except in a vault, to be constructed in a reserved grave space which has never before been buried in, for the interment of Mr. John Brinton and his family, at their decease; each body deposited therein to be separately entombed in an airtight manner."
