The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by "The Burials Act 1853" it is enacted that, in case it appears to Her Majesty in Council, upon the representation of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, that, for the protection of the public health, the opening of any new burial-ground in any city or town, or within any other limits, save with the previous approval of one of such Secretaries of State, should be prohibited, or that burials in any city or town, or within any other limits, or in any burial-grounds or places of burial, should be wholly discontinued, or should be discontinued subject to any exception or qualification, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order that no new burial-ground shall be opened in any city or town, or within such limits, without such previous approval, or (as the case may require) that, after a time mentioned in the Order, burials in such city or town, or within such limits, or in such burial-grounds or places of burial, shall be discontinued wholly, or subject to any exceptions or qualifications mentioned in such Order, and so from time to time as circumstances may require; provided always, that notice of such representation, and of the time when it shall please Her Majesty to order that the same be taken into consideration by the Privy Council, shall be published in the London Gazette, and shall be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some other conspicuous places within, the parishes affected by such representation, one month before such representation is so considered; provided also, that no such representation shall be made in relation to the burial-ground of any parish until ten days' previous notice of the intention to make such representation shall have been given to the incumbent and vestry clerk or churchwardens of such parish:

And whereas by "The Burials Act 1855" it is, amongst other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, from time to time to postpone the time appointed by any Order in Council for the discontinuance of burials, or otherwise to vary any Order in Council made under any of the Acts recited in the said Act, or under the said Act (whether the time thereby appointed for the discontinuance of burials thereunder, or other

operation of such Order, shall or shall not have arrived), as to Her Majesty, with such advice as aforesaid, may seem fit:

And whereas the Right Honourable Sir Matthew White Ridley, Baronet, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, after giving to the Incumbents and the churchwardens of the parishes hereinafter mentioned ten days' previous notice of his intention to make such representation, has made a representation stating that he is of opinion that so much of the Order of Her Majesty in Council of twenty-fourth June, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-six, as relates to burials in the parish of Datchet, in the county of Bucks, and that so much of the Order of Her Majesty in Council of first May one thousand eight hundred and fifty-five as relates to St. John's churchyard, Coventry, the Friends' burial-ground, Coventry, and Hill-street chapel-yard, Coventry, in the county of Warwick, should be varied by substituting for the directions contained therein the following Orders, viz.:—

DATCHET.—That burials be discontinued forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of Datchet in the county of Buckingham, and also in the churchyard except as follows:—

(a.) In vaults and wholly walled graves now existing burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

(b.) In partly walled and earthen graves now existing burials may be allowed of the relations of those already interred therein provided that the bodies can be deposited at or below the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains.

(c.) In the two reserved spaces which have never before been buried in and which when opened are free from water, burial may be allowed of Mary Anne Lane and William Good respectively, and of so many members of the family of the latter at their decease as can be buried at or below the depth of five feet.

COVENTRY.—1. Saint John's Churchyard.—That burials be discontinued forthwith and entirely in Saint John's Church, Coventry, in the county of Warwick; and also in the churchyard, except as follows:—

In existing vaults, not exceeding three in number, burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

2. Friends' Burial Ground.—That burials be discontinued forthwith and entirely in the Friends' Burial Ground, in the city of Coventry, except as follows :—

In existing vaults, not exceeding three in number, burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

3. Hill-street Chapelyard, formerly known as the Burial Ground of the Protestant Dissenters' Chapel.—That burials be discontinued forthwith and entirely in the Hill-street Chapelyard, in the city of Coventry, except as follows :—

In existing vaults, not exceeding five in number, burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give notice of such representation, and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council on the twenty-sixth day of August next :

And Her Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the London Gazette, and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the parishes affected by such representation, one month before the said twenty-sixth day of August.

WHEREAS the Right Honourable Sir Matthew White Ridley, Baronet, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, after giving to the Incumbents and the Churchwardens of the parishes hereinafter mentioned ten days' previous notice of his intention to make such representation, has, under the provisions of "The Burial Act 1853" made a representation stating that, for the protection of the public health, no new burial ground should be opened in the under-mentioned parishes without the previous approval of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and that burials should be discontinued therein with the following modifications, viz. :—

OVERTON, FLINTSHIRE.—Forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of Overton in the county of Flint, and also in the churchyard except as follows :—

In vaults and wholly walled graves now existing burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

MARSHFIELD, GLOUCESTER.—Forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of Marshfield in the county of Gloucester ; and also in the old portion of the churchyard, except as follows :—

In vaults and wholly walled graves now existing burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

DESBOROUGH, NORTHANTS.—Forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of Desborough, in the county of Northampton ; and also in the churchyard after the thirty-first December

one thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine except as follows :—

(a.) In vaults and wholly walled graves now existing burials may be allowed, on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

(b.) In such reserved grave spaces as have never before been buried in and which when opened are free from water, burials may be allowed of so many members of the families to whom they have been allotted as can be buried at or below the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains.

WOOTTON FITZPAINE, DORSET.—Forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of Wootton Fitzpaine in the county of Dorset ; and in the churchyard except as follows :—

(a.) In earthen graves now existing burials may be allowed of the widows and widowers of those already interred therein provided the bodies can be deposited at or below the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains.

(b.) In reserved grave spaces which have never before been buried in and which when opened are free from water burials may be allowed of the widows and widowers of those already interred in the churchyard.

OWLERTON, YORKS.—Forthwith and entirely in the Methodist New Connexion Chapel at Owlerton in the city of Sheffield in the county of York ; and also in the chapelyard except for the burial of Ann Brinnell, at her decease, in a grave not less than five feet deep.

WALTHAM, LINGS.—Forthwith and entirely in the Church of Waltham, Lincolnshire ; and in the old portion of Waltham churchyard except as follows :—

That in such part of the old churchyard as is situated to the north of the path traversing it from east to west, burials be permitted.

(a.) In existing family vaults in which each coffin shall be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

(b.) In existing walled graves, in which a covering of earth four and a half feet measuring from the upper surface of the coffin to the ground level can be left, of as many relatives of those already interred as can be buried at or below that depth.

(c.) Of Samuel Walton Kirke and John White in the spaces reserved for that purpose.

SOUTH DAMERHAM, WILTS.—Forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of South Damerham, in the county of Wilts ; and also in the old part of the churchyard except as follows :—

(a.) In existing vaults burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

(b.) In earthen graves now existing burials may be allowed of the relatives of those already interred therein provided the bodies can be deposited at or below the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains.

WORTH MATRAVERS, DORSET.—Forthwith in the Parish Church of Worth Matravers in the county of Dorset ; and also in the old part of the churchyard, except as follows :—

(a.) In now existing vaults burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin be

separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

(b.) In earthen graves now existing burials may be allowed of the widows and widowers of those already interred therein provided the bodies can be deposited at or below the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains.

BEACONSFIELD, BUCKS.—1. Forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of Beaconsfield in the county of Buckingham; and also in the old part of the churchyard except as follows:—

(a.) In existing vaults burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

(b.) In partly walled and earthen graves now existing burials may be allowed of the relations of those already interred therein provided the bodies can be deposited at or below the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains.

2. Forthwith and entirely in the Congregational Chapel at Beaconsfield in the county of Buckingham; and also in the chapelyard except as follows:—

(a.) In earthen graves now existing burials may be allowed of the relations of those already interred therein provided the bodies can be deposited at or below the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains.

(b.) In reserved grave spaces, not exceeding ten in number, which have never before been buried in and which when opened are free from water, burials may be allowed of so many members of the families to whom they may be allotted as can be buried at or below the depth of five feet.

SUTTON-ON-DERWENT, YORKS.—Forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of Sutton-on-Derwent, in the county of York, and also in the old portion of the churchyard.

LLANGATHEN, CARMARTHEN.—Forthwith and entirely in the Chapelyard of Cross Inn Chapel, in the parish of Llangathen in the county of Carmarthen.

DUNTON BASSETT, LEICESTER.—Forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of Dunton Bassett in the county of Leicester; and also in the churchyard after the thirty-first December one thousand nine hundred except as follows:—

In vaults and wholly walled graves now existing burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give notice of such representation, and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council on the twenty-sixth day of August next:

And Her Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the London Gazette; and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the parishes affected by such representation one month before the said twenty-sixth day of August.

And whereas Her Majesty was pleased, by Her Order in Council of the nineteenth day of May last, to give notice of such representation, and to order that the same should be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council on the third day of July, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine, and such Order has been published in the London Gazette and copies thereof have been affixed, as required by the said Act:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that no new burial-ground shall be opened in the undermentioned parishes without the previous approval of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and that burials in the said parishes shall be discontinued as follows, viz:—

SELLY OAK, WORCESTER.—Forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of Selly Oak, in

the county of Worcester; and also in the churchyard, except as follows:—

(a.) In vaults and wholly walled graves now existing burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented:

(b.) In partly walled and earthen graves now existing burials may be allowed of the relations of those already interred therein provided the bodies can be deposited at or below the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains.

LLANFIIANGEL GENEURGLYN, CARDIGAN.—

Forthwith and entirely in the Bethel Chapel at Talybont, in the parish of Llanfihangel Geneurglyn, in the county of Cardigan, and in the chapelyard adjoining the chapel, and also in the detached portion of the chapel-yard (opened in one thousand eight hundred and fifty-four) within fifteen feet of the Board School; and in the rest of this portion, except:—

In reserved grave spaces which have never before been buried in, and which, when opened, are free from water, burials may be allowed of such of the widows, widowers, parents, and unmarried children of those already interred in the yard as can be buried at or below the depth of five feet.

HELPRINGHAM, LINCOLN.—Forthwith and entirely in Helpringham Church, in the county of Lincoln, and in the old churchyard.

WALTHAM, LINCOLN.—Forthwith and entirely in the Church of Waltham, Lincolnshire; and in the old portion of Waltham churchyard, except as follows:—

That in such part of the old churchyard as is situated to the north of the path traversing it from east to west, burials be permitted:

(a.) In existing family vaults in which each coffin shall be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented:

(b.) In existing walled graves, in which a covering of earth four-and-a-half feet measuring from the upper surface of the coffin to the ground level can be left, of as many relatives of those already interred as can be buried at or below that depth:

(c.) Of Samuel Walton Kirke in the space reserved for that purpose.

SWAFFHAM PRIOR, CAMBRIDGE.—Forthwith and entirely in the Churches of Saint Cyriac and Saint Mary the Virgin, in the parish of Swaffham Prior, in the county of Cambridge; and also in the churchyard, except as follows:—

(a.) In vaults now existing burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented:

(b.) In earthen graves, not exceeding seven in number, now existing, burials may be allowed of the relations of those already interred therein provided the bodies can be deposited at or below the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains:

(c.) In reserved grave spaces, not exceeding five in number, which have never before been buried in, and which, when opened, are free from water, burials may be allowed of members of the families to whom they have been allotted, provided the bodies can be deposited at or below the depth of five feet.

WICKHAM BROOK, SUFFOLK.—Forthwith and entirely in the Wickham Brook Congrega-

tional Chapelyard, in the county of Suffolk, except as follows:—

(a.) In such vaults and wholly walled graves as are at present existing burials may be allowed, on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented:

(b.) In such earthen graves at present existing as can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains burials may be allowed of so many of the relations of those already interred as can be buried at or below that depth.

MORTON, NEAR BOURNE, LINCOLN.—Forthwith and entirely in the Church; and in such portions of the old churchyard of Morton, in the county of Lincoln, as are situated to the east, south, and west of the church, except as follows:—

(a.) In such vaults and wholly walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented:

(b.) In such earthen graves now existing in the churchyard as can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains burials may be allowed of so many of the relations of those already interred as can be buried at or below that depth:

(c.) In such reserved spaces in the churchyard as have never before been buried in, and which, when opened, are free from water, burials may be allowed of so many members of the families to whom they have been allotted as can be buried at or below the depth of five feet.

HOLLINWOOD, LANCASTER.—Forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of Hollinwood, in the borough of Oldham and county of Lancaster; and also in the churchyard, except as follows:—

(a.) In vaults and wholly walled graves now existing in the old and new parts of the churchyard burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented:

(b.) In partly walled and earthen graves now existing in the new part of the churchyard, burials may be allowed of the relations of those already interred therein provided the bodies can be deposited at or below the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains.

LAXFIELD, SUFFOLK.—Forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of Laxfield, in the county of Suffolk; and in the churchyard, except as follows:—

(a.) In vaults and wholly walled graves now existing burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented:

(b.) In partly walled and earthen graves now existing burials may be allowed of the relations of those already interred therein provided the bodies can be deposited at or below the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains:

(c.) In reserved grave spaces which have never before been buried in, and which, when opened, are free from water, burials may be allowed of so many members of the families to whom they may be allotted as can be buried at or below the depth of five feet.

STANTON SAINT QUINTIN, WILTS.—Forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of Stanton Saint Quintin, in the county of Wilts; and also in the old churchyard, except as follows:—

(a.) In vaults and wholly walled graves now existing burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

(b.) In partly walled and earthen graves now existing burials may be allowed of the relations of those already interred therein provided the bodies can be deposited at or below the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains.

CORBY, NORTHAMPTON.—Forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of Corby, in the county of Northampton, and also in the churchyard attached thereto.

DOWLAIS, GLAMORGAN.—Forthwith and entirely in the Calvinistic Methodist Church of Hermon, Dowlais, and in the graveyard attached thereto.

HARPOLE, NORTHAMPTON.—Forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of Harpole, in the county of Northampton; and also in the churchyard after April thirtieth, one thousand nine hundred, except as follows:—

In earthen graves now existing burials may be allowed of the relations of those already interred therein provided the bodies can be deposited at or below the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains.

WITTERSHAM, KENT.—Forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of Wittersham, in the county of Kent; and also in the churchyard, except as follows:—

(a.) In vaults now existing burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented:

(b.) In reserved grave spaces which have never before been buried in, and which, when opened, are free from water, burials may be allowed of so many members of the families to whom they may be allotted as can be buried at or below the depth of five feet.

GREAT HOUGHTON, NORTHAMPTON.—Forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of Great Houghton, in the county of Northampton; and also in the churchyard after the thirty-first March, one thousand nine hundred, except as follows:—

In the vault now existing of the Reverend W. H. Spencer burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

LAPLEY, STAFFORD.—Forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of Lapley, in the county of Stafford; and also in the portion of the churchyard situated to the south of the path at present traversing it from the east to the west entrance, except as follows:—

In vaults and wholly walled graves now existing burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

FARNHAM, YORK.—Forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of Farnham, in the county of York; and also in the churchyard, except as follows:—

(a.) In vaults and wholly walled graves now existing burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin be separately

enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented:

(b.) In reserved grave spaces, limited to five in number, which have never before been buried in, and which, when opened, are free from water, burials may be allowed of so many members of the families to whom they may be allotted as can be buried at or below the depth of five feet.

HINSTOCK, SALOP.—Forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of Hinstock, in the county of Salop; and also in the churchyard, except as follows:—

(a.) In the two vaults now existing of William Weate and William Meakin burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented:

(b.) In the partly walled grave of Phillip Williams and in such earthen graves now existing as are situated within twelve feet of the western boundary wall of the churchyard burials may be allowed of the relations of those already interred therein provided the bodies can be deposited at or below the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains.

SUNBURY, MIDDLESEX.—Entirely after the thirty-first August, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine, in the additional churchyard of Sunbury, in the county of Middlesex, except as follows:—

(a.) In vaults and walled graves now existing burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented:

(b.) In partly walled and earthen graves now existing burials may be allowed of the relations of those already interred therein provided the bodies can be deposited at or below the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice aforesaid, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the time for the discontinuance of burials in such churchyards be postponed as follows, viz:—

In the Churchyard of Saint Nicholas at Wade,

in the county of Kent, until the thirty-first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine.

In the Churchyard of Wellow, in the county of Somerset, until the thirtieth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine.

In the Churchyard of Saint Sampson's, Cricklade, in the county of Wilts, until the thirty-first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine.

In the Parish Churchyard of Cookham, in the county of Berks, until the thirty-first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine.

In the Parish Churchyard of Hemyock, in the county of Devon, until the thirty-first day of January, one thousand nine hundred.

In Staverton Churchyard, in the county of Northampton, until the thirty-first day of January, one thousand nine hundred.

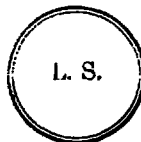

The statement of realizations should contain a record of all receipts derived from assets existing at the date of the winding-up order or resolution and subsequently realized, including balance in bank, book debts and calls collected, property sold, &c.; and the account of disbursements should contain all payments for costs and charges, or to creditors, or contributories. Where property has been realized, the gross proceeds of sale must be entered under realizations, and the necessary payments incidental to sales must be entered as disbursements. These accounts should not contain payments into the Companies Liquidation Account or payments into or out of bank, or temporary investments by the liquidator, or the proceeds of such investments when realized, which should be shown separately:—

- (a.) by means of the bank pass book;
(b.) by a separate detailed statement of moneys invested, and investments realized.

Interest allowed or charged by the bank, bank commission, &c., and profit or loss upon the realization of temporary investments, should, however, be inserted in the accounts of realizations or disbursements, as the case may be. Each receipt and payment must be entered in the account in such a manner as sufficiently to explain its nature. The receipts and payments must severally be added up at the foot of each sheet, and the totals carried forward from one account to another without any intermediate balance, so that the gross totals shall represent the total amounts received and paid by the liquidator respectively.

Trading Account.

(3.) When the liquidator carries on a business, a trading account must be forwarded as a distinct account, and the totals of receipts and payments on the trading account must alone be set out in the statement.

Dividends, &c.

(4.) When dividends or instalments of compositions are paid to creditors, or a return of surplus assets is made to contributories, the total amount of each dividend, or instalment of composition, or return to contributories, actually paid, must be entered in the statement of disbursements as one sum; and the liquidator must forward separate accounts showing in lists the amount of the claim of each creditor, and the amount of dividend or composition payable to each creditor, and of surplus assets payable to each contributory, distinguishing in each list the dividends or instalments of composition and shares of surplus assets actually paid and those remaining unclaimed. Each list must be on sheets 13 inches by 8 inches.

(5.) Credit should not be taken in the statement of disbursements for any amount in respect of liquidator's remuneration unless it has been duly allowed by resolution of the Company in General Meeting, or by order of Court.

Cowes Electric Lighting Order, 1896.

1. **N**OTICE is hereby given, in pursuance of the provisions of section 59 of the Cowes Electric Lighting Order, 1896, that the Urban District Council of Cowes (hereinafter called "the Council") intend to submit to the Board of Trade for their approval a deed of transfer, whereby it is proposed to transfer to the Ventnor Electric Light and Power Co. Limited (hereinafter called "the Company"), and in the manner therein named, the powers, duties, and liabilities of the Council under the said Order with respect to electric lighting.

2. The transfer will be of the powers, duties, and liabilities of the Council under the said Order, with such exceptions and modifications as are expressed in the deed.

3. Notice is further given that—

(a.) The area in respect of which the transfer is proposed to be made will extend to and include the Urban District of Cowes, in the Isle of Wight and county of Hants.

(b.) The pecuniary consideration in respect of the transfer will be the payment by the Company to the Council of the sum of £500, and of the costs of the transfer of the said Order.

(c.) A general description of the powers, duties, and liabilities of the Council under the said Order proposed to be excepted or modified is as follows:—

The transfer will include all the powers, duties, and liabilities of the Council in respect of lands, works, and supply, subject to exceptions or modifications as follows:—

(1.) The following sections of the said Order will not apply to the Company.

Section 7, as to purchase and use of lands. And all those sections of the said Order which are exclusively applicable to the Council if they carry the said Order into execution.

(2.) Section 9 of the Electric Lighting Act, 1882, will be extended and applied to the Company.

(3.) The Council will be empowered before complying with a requisition under section 12 of the said Order to require the Company to deposit with or secure to the Council the sum in the Deed of Transfer mentioned as a security for the repayment to them of the expenses to be incurred by them in complying with any requisition under the said section 12, and the Council will be

empowered while any repayment of money expended by them under such requisition is in arrear to recoup themselves out of the deposit or by realizing the security.

(4.) The Company will be enabled to acquire and use for the purposes of the Undertaking such lands as they may think necessary not exceeding in the whole 5 acres.

(5.) The prices to be charged by the Company for private lighting will not exceed the following rates per quarter:—Up to 20 units 11s. 8d., and for each unit over 20 7d., subject, however, to a reduction under certain circumstances as in the Deed of Transfer set forth.

(6.) The Council will be entitled at stated times to represent to the Board of Trade that the prices or methods of charge stated in the 4th schedule to the Order ought to be altered, and the Board of Trade may by Order vary the prices or the methods of charge, and so from time to time.

(7.) Section 51 of the Order will apply to the Company, and they will be required from time to time to cause the copy of the map in that section mentioned to be duly corrected.

(8.) A copy of all regulations and conditions affecting the Undertaking made by the Board of Trade under the said Order, or the Electric Lighting Acts, will be served by the Company on the Council.

(9.) The placing of any electric line above ground, except as provided by section 6 of the Order, will be subject to the consent of the Council.

(10.) The Company will not, save as provided by the Deed of Transfer, be entitled to sell the Undertaking, or to transfer any of the powers, duties, or liabilities thereby transferred to them to any other Company or person.

(11.)
